Plan Status

The plan is closed to new participants.

Covered Employees

The plan covers all salaried employees of the Company, except that leased employees and employees hired after December 31, 1998 are excluded from coverage.

Eligibility for Participation

A covered employee becomes a participant on the earlier of June 30th or December 31st following the completion of one year of service.

Normal Retirement Date

The first day of the month coincident with or next following the date a plan participant attains age 65 or completes five years of plan participation, if later.

Credited Service

All years and completed months of service with the employer from date of employment to the earlier of retirement, termination of employment, or death.

Vesting

All participants became 100% vested on December 31, 1998.

Earnings

Basic compensation, including cost of living adjustments, but excluding overtime, commissions and bonuses. However, earnings in any year are not permitted to exceed the maximum amount specified in Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 401.

Final Average Monthly Earnings

Total of the highest earnings received during any three (3) calendar years of the last five (5) calendar years preceding the earlier of retirement, termination of employment, or December 31, 1998, divided by 36.

Benefits

Normal Retirement

Eligibility Age 65 with 5 years of participation

Benefit The monthly benefit payable at the normal retirement date is equal to $\frac{3}{4}$ of 1% of Final Average Monthly Earnings multiplied by years of Credited Service, provided that such benefit shall not exceed \$1,010.

However, no benefits shall accrue beyond December 31, 1998 under the foregoing formula, except that active participants who are not highly compensated employees (as defined under Section 414(q) of the Internal Revenue Code) and have attained age 60 or older as of that date shall continue to accrue Credited Service for purposes of determining the benefit described above until the earlier of retirement and December 31, 2003.

In addition, a Supplemental Pension is payable as follows:

If an employee retires on or after June 1, 1995, he will be paid a Supplemental Pension of \$8.00 per month multiplied by Credited Service not in excess of 30.

If an employee retired prior to June 1, 1995 and is listed in Supplement C of the plan document, his monthly pension benefit shall be increased by \$200.00.

Early Retirement

Eligibility Age 55 and 10 years of vesting service

Benefit The benefit payable to a plan participant who retires early is the participant's normal retirement benefit as determined by the benefit formula, but using service to his early retirement date only. The benefit is reduced by $\frac{1}{4}\%$ for each month benefits commence early.

Late Retirement

Eligibility Participation continues after normal retirement date

Benefit A participant who retires on a postponed retirement date will be paid a benefit calculated on the same basis as it would be if the participant had retired on his Normal Retirement Date, but on the basis of the benefit level and service in effect on the Postponed Retirement Date.

Death before Retirement

Eligibility 5 years of vesting service

Benefit Upon the death of a participant who has completed five (5) or more years of service, a monthly benefit shall be payable to the participant's surviving spouse, if any, provided the participant had been married at least one year at death. The amount of the benefit to the surviving spouse is actuarially equivalent to 50% of the participant's accrued benefit reduced for early receipt, if applicable, and further reduced for payment as a 50% joint and survivor annuity. The benefit begins no earlier than the first day of the month the participant could have retired.

Employee Contributions

Participants shall not be required or permitted to make contributions under the Plan

Payment Forms

Normal Form

The normal form of payment is a benefit payable for the lifetime of the retiring participant, with 120 monthly payments guaranteed. A participant who is married at the time of retirement will automatically receive a reduced joint and 50% survivor annuity unless another form of payment is elected with the consent of the participant's spouse.

Optional Forms

Life annuity; life annuity with 60, 120, 180, or 240 monthly payments guaranteed; joint and survivor options with 50%, 66-2/3%, 75%, or 100% to beneficiary.

Actuarial Equivalence

For non-decreasing annuities: Actuarial equivalence is based on 6% interest and the 71 GAM Male Mortality rates, set back 1 year for participants and 5 years for beneficiaries.

For accelerated forms of payment: Actuarial Equivalence will be computed using the greater of the actuarial equivalence for non-decreasing annuities or the equivalent annual benefit computed using the "PPA applicable mortality table" and the interest rate determined under Code Section 417(e)(3) for the month of December preceeding the Plan Year that contains the annuity start date.
