Management has obtained certification from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Basis for Opinion

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(c) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, I compared such information to the related certified investment information.

(1) Plan Description

The following description of the ADSC Holdings Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

(a) Background

The Plan is a participant-directed, defined contribution plan established by Senior Care Centers of America (the Company or Plan Sponsor) effective May 1, 1993. Effective October 11, 2013, the assets and participants of Active Day Retirement Savings Plan were merged into the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The general administration of the Plan and the responsibility for carrying out the provisions of the Plan are maintained by a committee (the Committee) appointed by the Company. In accordance with the provisions of the Plan, the Empower Trust Company, LLC is acting as the Trustee and Plan Administrator. The Administrator maintains participant account records and executes transactions such as benefit payments to participants. The Trustee holds the assets of the Plan and executes transactions at the direction of the Plan Committee. The Trustee also reports to the Plan's management regarding investments and changes in these investments.

(b) Eligibility

An employee will become eligible to become a contributing participant in the Plan after attaining age 21, at which time the employee may enter the Plan on the first of the month following eligibility. You must have completed six months with the company in which you worked at least 500 hours.

(c) *Employee Contributions*

Each year participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation as defined in the plan, not to exceed \$23,000 in 2024. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The Plan also allows for Roth Contributions from participants. The Roth option is made with after tax dollars and allows tax free distributions on the investment earnings on the portion of Roth contributions upon distribution. Ordinary taxes will be paid on the distributions from the portion of the account that is from employer matching contributions and the related investment income. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the plan.

(d) *Employer Contributions*

The Company may make discretionary matching contributions to the Plan of 10% based on a participants level of participation applied to a participants' annual salary, provided that the participants' salary deferral is at least 1% to a maximum of 6%.

(e) *Participants' Accounts*

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of the Company's contribution, allocations of investment income or loss and forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or accounts balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants may direct the investment of their account balances into various investment options offered by the Plan. Currently, the Plan offers 26 mutual funds as investment options for participants.

(f) *Vesting*

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contribution plus actual earnings or losses thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching contribution and profit sharing portion of their accounts plus actual earnings or losses thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 20% vested after two years and vests 20% per year thereafter, and thus, is 100% vested after six years of service, as defined. Forfeitures are allocated to participant accounts in the same manner as employer contributions.

(g) Payment of Benefits

Upon reaching normal retirement (age 65) or upon permanent disability, all vested amounts credited to a participant's account become distributable. Distributions will be made as soon as administratively feasible, following a participant's request. Participant's whose vested interest is less than \$5,000 will be paid in a single lump sum payment, while a participant whose vested interest exceed \$5,000 will be paid in the form of an annuity unless the annuity option is waived.

Upon a participant's death, the participant's beneficiary is entitled to 100% of the participant's vested account balance.

Upon termination of service, other than for normal retirement or death, the Administrator will direct the current Trustee to pay to the participant his or her benefit in an immediate lump sum or a deferred lump sum, if certain criteria are met.

(h) Forfeitures

Upon a participant's termination date, and prior to the time the participant becomes vested in his or her account, the non-vested portion, if any, shall be forfeited. These forfeitures may be used to reduce company contributions or pay plan expenses. Forfeitures during the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$ 2,206 and \$1,856 respectively.

(i) Administrative Expenses

All administrative expenses are paid directly through the Plan and are allocated to the participants. Professional fees were paid by the Company. It is the Company's intention to pay these fees in the future.

(j) Loans to Participants

Under the terms of the Plan, participants may obtain loans from the Plan, utilizing funds accumulated in their accounts. The minimum amount which may be borrowed is \$1,000. Participants can borrow up to a maximum of 50% of their vested account balance but not more than \$50,000, less their highest outstanding loan balance during the previous 12 months. Loans outstanding to participants were \$57,825 at December 31, 2024 and \$66,635 at December 31, 2023.

The loans are repaid to the Plan through after-tax payroll deductions. The loan repayments and interest earned are allocated to each of the investment funds based upon the participant's contribution election percentages. The term of the loan is arrived at by mutual agreement between the Plan Committee and the participant but may not exceed five years unless the loan is to be used to acquire a dwelling unit which, within a reasonable time (determined at the time the loan is made), will be used as the principal residence of the participant.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and present the net assets available for plan benefits of the Plan and the changes in those net assets in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

(b) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for plan benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(c) *Risk and Uncertainties*

The assets for the Plan are primarily financial instruments which are monetary in nature. As a result, interest rates have a more significant impact on the Plan's performance than do the effects of general levels of inflation. Interest rates do not necessarily move in the same direction or in the same magnitude as the prices of goods and services as measured by the consumer price index. Investments in funds are subject to risk conditions of the individual fund objectives, stock and bond market fluctuations, interest rate changes, economic conditions and world affairs.

(d) *Investments*

Purchase and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-data basis. Investment income is recorded as earned on an accrual basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Each investment fund, aside from unallocated cash, which is held in an interest-bearing money market account, is stated at the fair market value on the last business date of the plan year as reported by the current Trustee, which is based on the market value of the underlying securities based on quotations from national securities exchange.

(3) Investments (Information Certified by the Plan Trustee)

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan's assets were allocated among the investment options as disclosed in the plan document. The investment funds are administered by independent managers. The trustee has certified that the following information is complete and accurate as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. This information has not been audited by independent accountants in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. (4) Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board(FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification(ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). Inputs are broadly defined as assumptions market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the assets or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Guaranteed investment contract: Guaranteed investment contracts are valued at fair value by the insurance company by discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar instruments with comparable durations considering the creditworthiness of the issuer. Because the participants transact at contract value, fair value is determined annually for financial reporting purposes only.

Guaranteed Investment Contract With Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund

The Plan entered into a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund (Key). Key maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributed to the guaranteed investment contract. The guaranteed investment contract is presented on the face of the statement of net assets available for benefits at fair value with an adjustment to contract value in arriving at net assets available for benefits. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Key, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The fair value of the investment contract on December 31, 2024, was \$158,793. The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate is based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium-long term new portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate, as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions. Interest credit rate is reset quarterly.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletions on equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator believes that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participant are probable of not occurring.

The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

(5) Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Company were to terminate the Plan, all participants in the Plan would become fully vested.

(6) Tax Status

The Company adopted a non-standardized prototype plan provided by the Trustee, who received an IRS opinion letter which stated that the Plan, as designed, is in compliance with the applicable section of the Code. The Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Service Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

(7) Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The credit and liquidity crisis in the United States and throughout the global financial system has continued to result in substantial volatility in financial markets and the banking system. These and other economic events may have had a significant impact on some investment portfolios.

(8) Subsequent events

The Plan Administrator has evaluated subsequent events through July 22, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
