Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Penn State Health 401(k) Savings Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Penn State Health 401(k) Savings Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Penn State Health 401(k) Savings Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Penn State Health 401(k) Savings Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that these financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Note 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Penn State Health 401(k) Savings Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions, which are available from the Plan Administrator.

General

The Plan is a defined-contribution plan sponsored by Penn State Health (Sponsor). The Plan was established on October 1, 2017, for the benefit of the employees of the Sponsor who are age 18 or older. Related employers who also participate in the Plan include Penn State Health Community Medical Group, LLC; Penn State Health Milton S. Hershey Medical Center; St. Joseph Regional Health Network; St. Joseph Medical Group; Penn State Health LifeLion, LLC; Penn State Health Holy Spirit Medical Center; Penn State Health Hampden Medical Center; and Penn State Health Lancaster Medical Center. Effective December 17, 2023, Pennsylvania Psychiatric Institute became a participating employer.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA). Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC and TIAA and CREF serve as trustees of the Plan. Empower and TIAA are both recordkeepers of the Plan.

Contributions

The Sponsor automatically withholds 5 percent of each eligible participant's compensation as a tax-deferred nonelective employee contribution. The Plan permits eligible non-highly compensated employees, through a salary deferral election, to have the Sponsor make additional elective contributions of up to 100 percent of eligible compensation. Effective July 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to limit the deferral percentage to 75 percent of eligible compensation. Highly compensated employees are not eligible to make elective contributions to the Plan. Employee rollover and Roth contributions are also permitted. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Sponsor makes a basic employer contribution of 5 percent of compensation up to the Social Security wage base and 10 percent of any compensation above the Social Security wage base. Employees are eligible after six months of service. Any participant who transferred to the Geisinger Plan in 1997, who was a participant in the State Employees Retirement System immediately before transferring back to the Sponsor, will receive an additional contribution of 2.5 percent of compensation, referred to as the SERS supplemental contribution. Effective January 1, 2024, the Sponsor no longer makes SERS supplemental contributions. Participants who are physicians and considered to be highly compensated will receive a supplemental basic contribution for any year that they earn less than \$150,000. This supplemental contribution will be equal to the difference between the basic contribution that would have been received if the participant had earned \$150,000 and the basic contribution that was actually received. Effective January 1, 2024, the Sponsor no longer makes supplemental basic contributions. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Effective July 1, 2023, employees that are not covered by a collective bargaining agreement with a hire date of January 1, 2024 or after must complete one year of service prior to receiving the basic employer contribution. Effective October 1, 2024, employees who are nurses represented by Service Employees International Union (SEIU) with a date of hire of October 6, 2024 or after must complete one year of service prior to receiving the basic employer contribution.

Participant Investment Account Options

Each participant has the option of directing his contributions into any of the investment options offered by the Plan and may change the allocation daily.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Sponsor's contributions and Plan earnings and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their nonvoluntary and voluntary employee contributions plus earnings thereon. Vesting in the Sponsor's employer contribution portion of their accounts plus earnings thereon is based on years of service. A participant is fully vested after three years of service with at least 1,000 hours of service each year, normal retirement (65), death or permanent disability.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of his or her account, a partial payment, or an annuity contract. Withdrawals other than for termination are permitted under circumstances provided by the Plan.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Interest on the loans varies and is based on local prevailing rates as determined by Plan Administrator.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$693,279 and \$348,179, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or to pay administrative expenses. Also, in 2024 and 2023, Sponsor contributions were reduced by \$3,171,175 and \$2,682,110, respectively, from forfeited nonvested accounts.

Other Unallocated Assets

In accordance with the service agreement with the Sponsor, a portion of the Great West Guaranteed Interest Fund account represents a plan level expense account that is primarily funded by expense reimbursements provided by Great West. The balance of this account was \$314,554 and \$370,359 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Sponsor has the ability to use these funds to pay for future Plan expenses. This account is regarded as an asset of the Plan for financial statements and Form 5500 reporting. Reimbursements exceeding expenditures totaled \$298,714 and \$355,200 during 2024 and 2023, respectively. During 2024 and 2023, respectively, \$360,647 and \$312,200 was allocated to participant accounts as contributions from the expense reimbursement account.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed an intention to do so, the Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments held by a defined-contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets and changes in net assets and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Quoted market prices, if available, are used to value investments. Mutual funds are valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year end. The Plan's interests in variable annuity accounts, pooled separate accounts, and the collective trust funds are valued at the NAV of units of the investment as provided by the issuer. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value of the variable annuity accounts, pooled separate accounts, and collective trust investment.

The fair value of guaranteed investment contracts (excluding fully benefit-responsive investment contracts) are calculated by discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar instruments with comparable durations considering the creditworthiness of the issuer.

Fully benefit-responsive investment contracts are valued at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus interest at the contract rate, less participant withdrawals and administration expenses.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in the fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan Document.

Plan Loans

On October 1, 2018, all outstanding Penn State Health Milton S. Hershey Medical Center Section 401(k) Savings Plan loans were transferred to the Plan as a result of the merger. While the Plan does allow for participant loans through Great West, TIAA issues loans to Plan participants outside the scope of the Plan. Participants pledge as security a portion of their balance in the TIAA Traditional Annuity, which represents 110 percent of the outstanding loan balance. The amount pledged as collateral at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was approximately \$1,539,297 and \$1,490,372, respectively. Plan loan interest rates ranged from 4.0 percent to 7.6 percent as of December 31, 2024.

The Employee Benefit Security Administration (EBSA) has expressed concern that the pledging of collateral of a participant's balance could be considered a prohibited transaction; however, formal guidance has yet to be issued by the EBSA.

Plan Tax Status

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter on April 30, 2019, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and therefore not subject to tax. The Plan has been amended and restated since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses may be paid by the Sponsor or the Plan, at the Sponsor's discretion.

Note 3. Certifications of Plan Trustees

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, and Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America "TIAA" and College Retirement Equities Fund "CREF", qualified institutions, have certified the following information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits and related disclosures as of December 31, 2024 and 2023
- Investment income and interest income from notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023
- Investment information included in the accompanying schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

Note 4. Disclosures About Fair Value of Plan Assets

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements must maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy comprises three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

- Level 1** Quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets as of the measurement date. Such instruments valued at Level 1 primarily consist of securities that are directly held and actively traded in public markets
- Level 2** Inputs other than unadjusted quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, directly or indirectly, including quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, and inputs that are derived from observable market data by correlation or other means
- Level 3** Unobservable inputs that cannot be corroborated by observable market data. Following is a description of the valuation methodologies and inputs used for assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis and recognized in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits, as well as the general classification of such assets pursuant to the valuation hierarchy. There have been no significant changes in the valuation techniques during the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan had no liabilities measured at fair value on a recurring basis. In addition, the Plan had no assets or liabilities measured at fair value on a nonrecurring basis. For assets classified within Level 3 of the fair value hierarchy, the process used to develop the reported fair value is described below.

Investments

Where quoted market prices are available in an active market, securities are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. Level 1 securities include mutual funds. If quoted market prices are not available, then fair values are estimated by using quoted prices of securities with similar characteristics or independent asset pricing services and pricing models, the inputs of which are market-based or independently sourced market parameters, including but not limited to, yield curves, interest rates, volatilities, prepayments, defaults, cumulative loss projections and cash flows. Such securities are classified in Level 2 of the valuation hierarchy. The Plan does not hold any Level 2 securities. In certain cases where Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available, securities are classified within Level 3 of the hierarchy. See the table below for inputs and valuation techniques used for Level 3 securities.

Mutual Funds & Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts - The Plan measures its mutual funds that are exchange-traded using the fund's quoted price, which is in an active market. Therefore, these investments are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. Equity mutual funds are invested separately in domestic large-cap and small-cap companies, as well as developing international equities. Debt mutual funds invest in U.S. government and agency bonds and investment grade corporate debt and structured credit.

Traditional Annuity Accounts - See Note 5 for further information regarding the investment contracts with insurance companies.

Common Collective Trust Funds, Pooled Separate Accounts & Variable Annuity Accounts - Strategies that include investments that aggregate assets from multiple investors and are managed collectively following a prescribed strategy. There are no redemption notice periods; therefore, redemptions are daily. There are no unfunded commitments. The non-U.S. equity strategy is invested in developed countries outside of the United States and spans the entire equity capitalization spectrum. The fixed income strategy is focused on U.S. government and agency bonds and investment grade corporate debt and structured credit. The Plan measures commingled funds at NAV per share.

The TIAA Real Estate Pooled Separate Account (Account) seeks favorable long-term returns primarily through rental income and appreciation of real estate investments owned by the Account. The Account will also invest in publicly traded securities and short-term higher quality liquid investments that are easily converted to cash to enable the Account to meet participant redemption requests, purchase or improve properties or cover other expense needs.

Level 3 Valuation Process

Fair value determinations for Level 3 measurements of securities are the responsibility of Plan management. Plan management challenges the reasonableness of the assumptions used and reviews the methodology to ensure the estimated fair value complies with accounting standards generally accepted in the United States.

Sensitivity of Significant Unobservable Inputs

TIAA Traditional Annuity Contract

The significant unobservable input used in the fair value measurement of the Plan's TIAA traditional annuity contract is the interest rate of the investment contract. Changes in the contractual interest rate would have resulted in a significant change in fair value to the extent the change deviates from changes in market interest rates. Generally, an increase or decrease in the difference between the contractual interest rate and the market interest rate would have been accompanied by a directionally opposed change in the fair value.

Note 5. Investment Contract With Insurance Company

The Plan invests in traditional annuity contracts with TIAA (nonbenefit-responsive) and traditional investment contracts with Great West (fully benefit-responsive). The insurance companies maintain the contributions in their general accounts. The accounts are credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract issuers are contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate guaranteed to the Plan.

The Great West guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit responsive; therefore, contract value is the relevant measurement. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Great West, represents contributions made under the contracts, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The traditional annuity contracts that are not fully benefit-responsive are reported at their estimated fair value as provided by TIAA. There are no reserves against the contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan Documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan Administrator does not believe the occurrence of any such value event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants, is probable.

The guaranteed investment/annuity contracts do not permit the insurance companies to terminate the agreements prior to the scheduled maturity date.

Note 6. Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50 percent or more of such an employer or employee association, or relatives of such persons.

Certain Plan investments are units of variable annuity accounts, a pooled separate account, or mutual funds that are managed by an entity related to TIAA. The Plan's traditional annuity contract is maintained in TIAA-CREF's general account. The Plan's investment in shares of fixed annuity accounts is maintained in Great West's general account. These entities are custodians as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. The Sponsor pays directly certain other fees related to the Plan's operations.

The Plan paid \$2,238,862 and \$2,245,346 of recordkeeping fees to Great West and TIAA during 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Plan paid \$334,377 and \$272,661 of fees to investment advisors during 2024 and 2023, respectively. Individually immaterial expenses paid to other parties in interest aggregated \$55,818 for 2024 and \$28,010 for 2023. The Sponsor provides certain administrative services at no cost to the Plan.

During 2024 and 2023, the Plan received Plan Servicing Credits in the Revenue Credit Account. This account is credited with excess revenue generated by the Plan. Funds are typically credited quarterly, but may be allocated at any time and are considered Plan assets. The credits may be used to pay Plan expenses or any excess funds available may be allocated to Plan participants. Credits contributed to the Plan of \$1,877,963 and \$1,858,687 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, is netted with administrative expenses.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9. Nonexempt Transactions

Defined contribution plans are required to remit employee contributions and loan repayments to the Plan as soon as they can be reasonably segregated from the employer's general assets, but no later than the 15th business day of the month following the month in which the participant contributions and loan repayments are withheld by the employer. While the Sponsor remitted all employee contributions and loan repayments to the Plan, contributions and loan repayments of \$4,483 were not remitted within the required time period for the year ended December 31, 2024. While the Sponsor remitted all employee contributions and loan repayments to the Plan, contributions and loan repayments of \$1,665 were not remitted within the required time period for the year ended December 31, 2023.

Note 10. Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through June 12, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
