NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Signal Theory, Inc. Employer Contribution and 401(k) Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement or Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan Administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan's Administrative Committee.

Eligibility - The Plan is a defined contribution plan, subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA), covering all employees of Signal Theory, Inc. (Company). Employees become participants in the Plan on the first day of the month following their hire date, as long as they meet the age requirement of age 18. In order to be eligible for the employer discretionary or profit sharing contribution, the participant must be employed by the employer or an affiliate on the last day of the Plan year and have been credited with 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year.

Contributions - The Plan provides that active participants may make voluntary contributions on a pre-tax, after-tax, or combination thereof to the Plan between 1% and 100% of annual compensation (\$23,000 for 2024) as adjusted for applicable percentages of compensation. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions (\$7,500 for 2024). The Company may provide for a discretionary matching contribution. For 2024, this match was equal to 50% of the first 6% of each participant's contribution. The Company also made a discretionary profit-sharing contribution equal to 3% of each eligible participant's compensation for 2024.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options held by the AAAA Retirement Fund for Member Agencies, a 103-12 investment entity. The Plan currently offers 16 mutual funds and a common collective trust as investment options for participants. Company contributions are directed in accordance with the Plan Agreement.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and an allocation of the Company's contributions to the Signal Theory Stock Liquidity Fund for purchasing Company stock, Plan earnings and administrative expenses, if any. Participant requested services may also be charged an administrative fee. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants shall be fully vested with respect to Company contributions upon normal retirement age, disability, or death. A participant is 100% vested in all Company contributions after six years of credited service.

Put Option - Under federal income tax regulations, the Company stock (Signal Theory, Inc. Company stock) that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which

there is no market. The put price is representative of the fair market value of the stock. The Company can pay for the purchase with interest over a period of five years or by lump sum. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

Voting Rights - Each participant is entitled to direct the Trustee to exercise voting rights attributable to the shares allocated to his or her account by informing the Trustee of the manner in which they wish the Trustee to vote the shares of Company stock allocated to his or her account. Unallocated Company stock and Company stock allocated to, but not voted by participants will be voted in the same proportion as the Company stock for which the Trustee receives proper voting directions.

Normal Retirement - Normal retirement age is 62 years of age.

Payment of Benefits - On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or for other reasons, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or a part lump sum and part installment option over a specified period of time.

Diversification - Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company stock into investments that are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least ten years of participation in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a six-year period. In each of the first five years, a participant may diversify up to 25% of the number of shares allocated to his or her account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth year, the percentage changes to 50%. Participants who elect to diversify receive a cash distribution, unless eligible for floor price protection, in which case, shares are distributed. The election to diversify is made subsequent to year-end based upon the shares of employer stock in the participant's account at year-end.

Forfeitures - Forfeitures of non-vested amounts can be used to reduce the employer's contribution to the Plan, allocated as additional employer contributions in the year of forfeiture or used to reinstate previously forfeited account balances of former participants who have been reinstated to the Plan. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$0, respectively. During 2024, \$68,264 was reallocated to participants as an additional employer contribution in the current year or used to offset plan administrative expenses.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Participants may borrow from their fund accounts up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rates are set at a fixed rate deemed commercially reasonable at the time of the note. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Company Stock Valuation - The Plan allows for participants to buy shares in the Company with the employers' discretionary profit sharing contributions as defined by the Plan, if stock is available to be purchased. The Plan document and ERISA require the Plan to receive an independent stock valuation annually. The Plan received an independent valuation as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

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NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting and Use of Estimates - The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect: (1) the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, (2) disclosures such as contingencies, and (3) the reported amounts of revenues and expenses included in such financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition - Investments are valued at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Administrative Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Plan's investment advisors. The purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net change includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 for these notes receivable. Delinquent loans are treated as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. Notes receivable may not exceed five years unless the note is for the purpose of purchasing a personal residence.

Benefit Payments - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses - Certain expenses of the Plan may be paid directly by the Company and are therefore excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Some investment related expenses may be included in net change in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events - These financial statements considered subsequent events through July 23, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

4. INVESTMENTS AND FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Fair value is defined as the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction value hierarchy which requires an entity to maximize the use of observable inputs when measuring fair value.

The following describes three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices available in active markets for identical investments as of the reporting date;

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are other than quoted prices in active markets, which are either directly or indirectly observable as of the reporting date, and fair value can be determined through the use of models or other valuation methodologies; and

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable inputs in situations where there is little or no market activity for the asset or liability and the reporting entity makes estimates and assumptions related to the pricing of the asset or liability including assumptions regarding risk.

A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for instruments measured at fair value, including the general classification of such instruments pursuant to the valuation hierarchy.

103-12 Investment Entity - Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options held by the 103-12 investment entity. The Plan currently offers sixteen mutual funds that are valued using a quoted price in an active market and a common collective trust that is valued using Net Asset Value (NAV) provided by the administrator of the fund, as investment options for participants with specific valuation methodologies.

The fair value of the Company common stock held by the Plan is valued based upon an independent appraisal. This appraisal considered the asset based, market and income approaches and concluded using primarily the asset approach (net asset value method) for 2024 and 2023. The appraiser took into account historical and projected cash flow and net income, return on assets, return on equity and market comparables in earnings and revenue.

The valuation process involves the Plan fiduciary's selection of an independent appraiser under a written contract with the right to cancel such contract at any time. Company management accumulates the data for the appraiser from the audited financial statements of the Company and prepares a preliminary report which Company management, along with the Plan Administrator, reviews in detail, discusses, modifies if appropriate, and ultimately approves.

5. INTEREST IN THE AAAA RETIREMENT FUND FOR MEMBER AGENCIES

Certain Plan investments are included in the investments of the AAAA Retirement Fund for Member Agencies (Fund). The Fund is organized as a 103-12 investment entity as defined by 29 CFR 2520.103-12 of the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosures under ERISA. Use of the 103-12 investment entity permits the commingling of the Plan's assets with the assets of 57 other member agencies. Each participant in the Plan may direct their investments into the funds within the Fund. The Plan's interest in the Fund as a percentage of net assets of the Fund was 4.08% and 3.86% as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Although the funds are commingled in the Fund, the Fund maintains supporting records for the purpose of allocating the net gains and losses of each of the investments of the Fund to each participant's account based on participant direction.

Refer to Note 4 for description of the valuation methodologies used.

7. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by AAAA (party-in-interest) and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The various funds' operating expense ratios ranged from 0.035 to 1.30%, as of December 31, 2024. The Plan paid \$30,514 for administrative expenses for the year ended December 31, 2024.

8. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed an intention to do so, the Company reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination of the Plan, the interests of the participants in the Plan shall be fully vested at the time of termination, and AAAA shall liquidate all assets of the Plan and continue to administer the Plan in accordance with its provisions until all obligations have been satisfied.

9. TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated August 23, 2023, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. Management evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded that it had taken no uncertain tax positions that require recognition

or disclosure in the financial statements. No provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the financial statements.

10. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
