Appendix A – Summary of Actuarial Methods

The ultimate cost of a pension plan is the excess of actual benefits and administrative expenses paid over actual net investment return on plan assets during the plan's existence until the last payment has been made to the last participant. A plan's "actuarial cost method" determines the expected incidence of actuarial costs by allocating portions of the ultimate cost to each plan year. The cost method is thus a budgeting tool to help ensure that a plan will be adequately and systematically funded. Annual contributions are also affected by a plan's "asset valuation method" (as well as plan provisions, actuarial assumptions, and actual plan demographic and investment experience each year).

Actuarial Cost Method

The actuarial cost method used for determining the Plan's ERISA funding requirements and the FASB ASC Topic 960 values is the Unit Credit method. Under this method, an accrued benefit is determined at each active participant's assumed retirement age based on compensation and service at both the beginning and the end of the current year. The Plan's Normal Cost is the sum of the present value of the excess of each active participant's accrued benefit at the end of the current year over that at the beginning of the current year. The Plan's accrued liability is the sum of (a) the present value of each active participant's accrued benefit at the beginning of the current year plus (b) the present value of each inactive participant's benefits. This method is prescribed for ERISA funding requirements by the Pension Protection Act of 2006.

Asset Valuation Method

The asset valuation method determines the asset value used to calculate the funding requirements of the Plan. The resulting asset value is referred to as plan assets.

Plan assets are equal to the market value of assets as of the valuation date, plus the discounted value of employer contributions made after the valuation date. These contributions are discounted to the valuation date using the effective interest rate for the prior plan year.

PBGC Variable-Rate Premium Method

The Standard Method is used for the PBGC variable-rate premium calculation (adopted January 1, 2016).

Amortization Method

For the Plan's ERISA funding requirements, incremental Funding Shortfall amounts are amortized over a fifteen-year period, and the related shortfall amortization payment is determined on the first valuation date following the plan year in which it arises based on the segment rates used for ERISA minimum funding purposes on that date, as prescribed under IRC Section 430.

Interest rate for FASB ASC Topic 960 and asset return for minimum funding: Effective January 1, 2024, the FASB 960 interest rate and the asset return for minimum funding purposes were changed from 7.00% to 6.50% per year. The interest rate and asset return assumption were changed to reflect capital market expectations.

Mortality for minimum funding and PBGC premium: Effective January 1, 2024, the mortality table was updated as prescribed by IRC Section 430(h)(3)(A) for small plans. The mortality assumption was updated to comply with IRS and PBGC requirements.

Appendix C – Summary of Principal Plan Provisions

This summary of plan provisions is intended to only describe the essential features of the Plan. All eligibility requirements and benefit amounts shall be determined in strict accordance with the plan document itself.

Definitions

Accrued Benefit: 1.85% of Average Monthly Compensation multiplied by years of Credited Service up to 35 years as of the date of determination. Payable in monthly installments. Benefit accruals were frozen as of December 31, 2013.

Actuarially Equivalent: Equality in value such that the present value of the amount under any form of payment is essentially the same as the present value of the amount under the normal form of annuity payment for single participants. In general, for purposes other than determining lump sum amounts, actuarially equivalent factors are based on the applicable mortality table specified under GATT and an interest rate of 8.0%. For purposes of determining lump sum distribution amounts, actuarially equivalent factors are based on the applicable mortality table specified in IRS Notice 2016-50 for the plan year of distribution and the statutory three-tier segment interest rates in effect for the November prior to the plan year of distribution.

Average Monthly Compensation: A Participant's Average Monthly Compensation, as of a given date, is determined by dividing the total Compensation he received during the 5 consecutive Compensation periods for which his Compensation was highest by the number of months during such period for which he received Compensation.

Compensation: Compensation means the aggregate basic rate of compensation exclusive of bonuses, overtime, and the cost of any fringe benefits. If Hours are less than 2,080, Compensation is annualized based on hours divided by 2,080.

Credited Service: Benefit Service is determined in 1/10ths for each 208 hours up to 2,080 if the Employee is credited with at least 1,000 Hours of Service in a Plan Year. In the year of hire or termination, the 1,000 hours requirement is waved.

Plan Effective Date: January 1, 1966; the Plan was last amended effective December 31, 2013.

A Year of Service is credited for each Computation Period during which an Employee is credited with at least 1,000 Hours of Service. The initial Computation Period is the 12-consecutive month period beginning with the Employees Employment Commencement Date. Thereafter, the Computation Period is the Plan Year beginning with the Plan Year in which the initial Computation Period ends.

Normal Retirement

Normal Retirement Date: The first day of the month coincident with or next following the attainment of age 65.

Normal Retirement Benefit: The Accrued Benefit.

Early Retirement

Early Retirement Date: The first day of the month coincident with or next following the attainment of age 60 and completion of 10 years of Service.

Early Retirement Benefit: The Accrued Benefit, reduced by ½% for each month the Early Retirement Date precedes the Normal Retirement Date.

Disability Retirement

Disability Retirement Date: A Participant's Disability Retirement Date is the first day of the month coincident with or next following the date of termination of his employment due to disability.

An Active Participant will be eligible for a Disability Retirement Benefit under the Plan upon the occurrence of permanent disability.

Disability Benefit: An eligible Participant's Disability Retirement Benefit is equal to the monthly retirement benefit commencing on his Disability Retirement Date in an amount equal to the Actuarial Equivalent of the Participant's Accrued Benefit determined as of his Disability Retirement Date.

Deferred Retirement

Deferred Retirement Date: The first day of the month coincident with or next following the date of termination of service if it occurs after the Normal Retirement Date.

Deferred Retirement Benefit: The greater of (i) the Accrued Benefit determined as of the Deferred Retirement Date or (ii) the Accrued Benefit determined as of the Normal Retirement Date (or the first day of any plan year following the Normal Retirement Date) and actuarially increased to the Deferred Retirement Date.

Termination

Termination Date: The date of termination of service other than for reasons of retirement, disability, or death.

Termination Benefit: The Accrued Benefit, multiplied by the vested percentage in the following table, payable at the Normal Retirement Date.

Appendix A – Summary of Actuarial Methods

The ultimate cost of a pension plan is the excess of actual benefits and administrative expenses paid over actual net investment return on plan assets during the plan's existence until the last payment has been made to the last participant. A plan's "actuarial cost method" determines the expected incidence of actuarial costs by allocating portions of the ultimate cost to each plan year. The cost method is thus a budgeting tool to help ensure that a plan will be adequately and systematically funded. Annual contributions are also affected by a plan's "asset valuation method" (as well as plan provisions, actuarial assumptions, and actual plan demographic and investment experience each year).

Actuarial Cost Method

The actuarial cost method used for determining the Plan's ERISA funding requirements and the FASB ASC Topic 960 values is the Unit Credit method. Under this method, an accrued benefit is determined at each active participant's assumed retirement age based on compensation and service at both the beginning and the end of the current year. The Plan's Normal Cost is the sum of the present value of the excess of each active participant's accrued benefit at the end of the current year over that at the beginning of the current year. The Plan's accrued liability is the sum of (a) the present value of each active participant's accrued benefit at the beginning of the current year plus (b) the present value of each inactive participant's benefits. This method is prescribed for ERISA funding requirements by the Pension Protection Act of 2006.

Asset Valuation Method

The asset valuation method determines the asset value used to calculate the funding requirements of the Plan. The resulting asset value is referred to as plan assets.

Plan assets are equal to the market value of assets as of the valuation date, plus the discounted value of employer contributions made after the valuation date. These contributions are discounted to the valuation date using the effective interest rate for the prior plan year.

PBGC Variable-Rate Premium Method

The Standard Method is used for the PBGC variable-rate premium calculation (adopted January 1, 2016).

Amortization Method

For the Plan's ERISA funding requirements, incremental Funding Shortfall amounts are amortized over a fifteen-year period, and the related shortfall amortization payment is determined on the first valuation date following the plan year in which it arises based on the segment rates used for ERISA minimum funding purposes on that date, as prescribed under IRC Section 430.

Appendix C – Summary of Principal Plan Provisions

This summary of plan provisions is intended to only describe the essential features of the Plan. All eligibility requirements and benefit amounts shall be determined in strict accordance with the plan document itself.

Definitions

Accrued Benefit: 1.85% of Average Monthly Compensation multiplied by years of Credited Service up to 35 years as of the date of determination. Payable in monthly installments. Benefit accruals were frozen as of December 31, 2013.

Actuarially Equivalent: Equality in value such that the present value of the amount under any form of payment is essentially the same as the present value of the amount under the normal form of annuity payment for single participants. In general, for purposes other than determining lump sum amounts, actuarially equivalent factors are based on the applicable mortality table specified under GATT and an interest rate of 8.0%. For purposes of determining lump sum distribution amounts, actuarially equivalent factors are based on the applicable mortality table specified in IRS Notice 2016-50 for the plan year of distribution and the statutory three-tier segment interest rates in effect for the November prior to the plan year of distribution.

Average Monthly Compensation: A Participant's Average Monthly Compensation, as of a given date, is determined by dividing the total Compensation he received during the 5 consecutive Compensation periods for which his Compensation was highest by the number of months during such period for which he received Compensation.

Compensation: Compensation means the aggregate basic rate of compensation exclusive of bonuses, overtime, and the cost of any fringe benefits. If Hours are less than 2,080, Compensation is annualized based on hours divided by 2,080.

Credited Service: Benefit Service is determined in 1/10ths for each 208 hours up to 2,080 if the Employee is credited with at least 1,000 Hours of Service in a Plan Year. In the year of hire or termination, the 1,000 hours requirement is waved.

Plan Effective Date: January 1, 1966; the Plan was last amended effective December 31, 2013.

Plan Year: The 12-month period beginning January 1 and ending December 31.

Vesting Service: A full year is credited for each Plan Year in which 1,000 or more hours of service are credited. No partial years of Vesting Service are credited.

Eligibility for Participation

An Employee who is a member of an Eligible Employee Classification will become a participant in the Plan on the January 1st or July 1st which coincides with or next follows the attainment of age 21 and the completion of one Year of Service. Disability Retirement Date: A Participant's Disability Retirement Date is the first day of the month coincident with or next following the date of termination of his employment due to disability.
