Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of St. Lawrence Health System 403(b) Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 9 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Notes to the Financial Statements

Note 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution retirement plan that operates under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code) and was established for employees of St. Lawrence Health System (SLHS). In connection with the formation of SLHS as sole corporate member of Canton-Potsdam Hospital (CPH) and Gouverneur Hospital (GH), the former Canton-Potsdam Hospital 403(b) Retirement Plan was amended and renamed the St. Lawrence Health System 403(b) Retirement Plan. In connection with this, in 2014 GH was added as a participating employer of the Plan and GH's employees were granted admission into the Plan. Effective January 1, 2020, Massena Memorial Hospital now known as Massena Hospital (MH) was acquired by SLHS and their employees were eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of ERISA.

Administration

The Plan is administered by SLHS. The Audit Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Audit Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors performance, and reports to the Board of Directors. State Street Bank and Trust Company (SSBT) is the custodian of the Plan's assets. All current participant contributions are allocated to investments maintained by SSBT.

Eligibility and Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of their wages, not to exceed the maximum annual contribution allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants also may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various funding vehicles offered by the Plan. Employees of SLHS are eligible to participate in and make elective deferrals under the Plan immediately after beginning employment. Employees are credited with a year of eligibility service upon completion of at least 1,000 hours of service during the first year of employment to be eligible for nonelective contributions. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 2% of eligible compensation, with an automatic deferral increase of 1% per year up to a maximum of 6% of compensation. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

Participants who are not per diem or temporary employees are eligible for discretionary employer match contributions upon attaining 18 years of age.

New York State Nurses Association (NYSNA) employees will receive matching contributions to the Plan equal to the following:

- GH or MH NYSNA employees will receive matching contributions to the Plan equal to 50% of the participant's contributions subject to a maximum of 4% of the participant's compensation.
- CPH NYSNA employees with less than 8 years of service will receive 25% of the participant's contributions subject to a maximum of 8% of the participant's compensation.
- CPH NYSNA employees with 8 or more years of service will receive 50% of the participant's contributions subject to a maximum of 6% of the participant's compensation.

Note 1. Description of the Plan (Continued)

Service Employees International Union (SEIU) employees will receive matching contributions to the Plan equal to the following:

- CPH SEIU employees with less than 8 years of service will receive matching contributions to the Plan equal to 25% of the participant's contributions subject to a maximum of 4% of the participant's compensation.
- CPH SEIU employees with 8 or more years of service will receive 50% of the participant's contributions subject to a maximum of 6% of the participant's compensation.
- GH SEIU employees will receive matching contributions to the Plan equal to 50% of the participant's contributions subject to a maximum of 4% of the participant's compensation.

Effective January 1, 2023, SEIU employees who made a one-time election to remain in the Canton-Potsdam Hospital Defined Benefit Plan and whose accrual under the Plan ceased in 2023, will receive 50% of the participants' contributions subject to a maximum of 12% of the participants' compensation.

Noncontractual employees will receive a matching contribution to the Plan equal to 50% of the participant's contributions subject to a maximum of 4% of the participant's compensation.

Employer matching contributions amounted to \$2,659,466 and \$2,544,648 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023, respectively.

Participants who are not per diem, temporary employees, or grandfathered employees who participate in the Retirement Plan for Employees of Canton Potsdam Hospital are also eligible for discretionary nonelective contributions upon attaining 18 years of age. To receive the nonelective contributions, employees must also have completed at least 1,000 hours of service during the plan year and be employed on the last day of the plan year.

All eligible noncontractual and GH NYSNA employees will receive nonelective contributions to the Plan equal to the following:

- Employees hired on or after January 1, 2009 will receive 3% of employee's prior year eligible compensation.
- Employees hired prior to January 1, 2009 will receive 3.50% of employee's prior year eligible compensation if under age 45, 4% of employee's prior year eligible compensation if between ages 45 through 49, and 5% of employee's prior year eligible compensation if age 50 or older.

Effective January 1, 2024, GH SEIU employees may receive nonelective contributions to the Plan equal to 3.50% of employee's prior year eligible compensation.

Eligible CPH SEIU employees will receive nonelective contributions to the Plan equal to the following:

- Employees hired on or after January 1, 2009 will receive 2% of employee's prior year eligible compensation pay. Effective January 1, 2024, employees will receive 3.50% of employee's prior year eligible compensation.
- Employees hired prior to January 1, 2009 with 10 or more years of continuous credited service as of January 1 of each year commencing on or after January 1, 2023 will receive 3.50% if under age 35, 4% if between ages 35 through 44, 4.50% if between ages 45 through 49, 4.75% if between ages 50 through 54, and 5% if age 55 and older of employee's prior year eligible compensation.

Note 1. Description of the Plan (Continued)

An eligible grandfathered SEIU employee, an employee who previously made a one-time election under the Canton-Potsdam Hospital Defined Contribution Plan, and whose accrual under the Plan ceased in 2023 will receive 5% of employee's prior year eligible compensation.

Eligible CPH NYSNA employees will receive nonelective contributions to the Plan equal to the following:

- Employees hired on or after January 1, 2010 will receive 2% of employee's prior year eligible compensation.
- Employees hired prior to January 1, 2010 will receive nonelective contributions beginning at 2.25% of employee's prior year eligible compensation if they have five or more years of continuous credited service but less than ten years of continuous credited service as of January 1 of each year commencing on or after January 1, 2010. Contributions increase by .25% by every 5 years of service increments, maxing out at 3.5% for employees over twenty-five years.

Effective January 1, 2020, eligible MH NYNSA and MH Civil Service Employees Association (CSEA) employees will receive 3% of employee's prior year eligible compensation. Certain former employees of MH who transferred employment to MH in connection with the 2020 acquisition of MH by SLHS ("Former MH Employees") will receive the special nonelective contribution described in the Addendum to the Plan provided they satisfy all applicable eligibility requirements.

Total employer nonelective contributions amounted to \$5,007,146 and \$4,783,261 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023, respectively.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Employer's matching and nonelective contributions, if applicable, as well as allocations of Plan earnings (losses). Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in all their contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate is set at 1% above the prime rate. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payments of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a benefit payment equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum payment, installment payment, or partial withdrawal. Participants may also request an in-service distribution upon attainment of age 59 ½ or for financial hardship.

Note 2. Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Audit Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment adviser and custodian. See Note 3 for a discussion of fair value measurements and Note 4 for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on the trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Reclassifications

Certain amounts in the 2023 financial statements have been reclassified to conform with the 2024 presentation.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through July 30, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level I) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level III). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification 820 are described as follows:

Level I: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level II: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level II input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level III: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds are held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Money market funds: Valued at cost plus interest, which approximates fair value.

Note 4. MetLife Stable Value Fund

The MetLife Stable Value Fund is a guaranteed investment contract for which the contract assets are invested in a MetLife separate account (which are part of the general assets of MetLife). This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. The investment contract includes a wrapper contract, which is an agreement for the wrap issuer, such as a bank or insurance company, to make payments to the Plan in certain circumstances.

MetLife will guarantee principal and accrued interest, based on credited interest rates, for participant-initiated withdrawals as long as the contract remains active. Interest is credited to the contract at interest rates that reflect the performance of the underlying portfolio. The rate resets quarterly with a 1.0% minimum credited rate. During 2024, the average yield credited to participants was 2.24% (1.94% - 2023).

MetLife will reset the rate by amortizing the difference between the market value of the portfolio and the guaranteed value over the weighted average duration of the Fund's investments. Participants will receive the principal and accrued earnings credited to their accounts on withdrawal for allowed events. These events include transfers to other plan investment options, and payments because of retirement, termination of employment, disability, death, and in-service withdrawals as permitted by the Plan.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with these investment contracts is dependent on MetLife's ability to meet its financial obligations. MetLife's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with MetLife, for example the Plan's failure to qualify under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 403(b); premature termination of the contracts; plan termination or merger; changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options, or bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other matters that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations. In addition, certain events allow MetLife to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, a breach of material obligation under the contract, material misrepresentation, or a material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer. The Plan management does not believe such events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan or participants to transact at contract value with MetLife as of December 31, 2024.

Note 5. Party-in-interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by SSBT and Transamerica. SSBT is the custodian of the Plan's assets and Transamerica is the Plan's recordkeeper, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Note 6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, all participants will be fully vested in their employer contributions.

Note 7. Tax Status

The Plan adopted a volume submitter Plan sponsored by SSBT and Transamerica. The volume submitter plan has received an opinion letter from the IRS dated March 31, 2017 as to the volume submitter Plan's qualified status. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in their values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Note 9. Financial Certification

The following unaudited financial information as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, as well as transactions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, have been furnished by the Plan Administrator and certified by the custodian, SSBT. The incorporation of this financial information in the accompanying financial statements is based solely on their certifications, and the information relating to assets as well as transactions has not been audited by independent accountants. In addition, the Plan's custodian has certified the unaudited financial data contained in the supplemental schedule as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024.
