Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Teal's Management Group, Inc. 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Teal's Management Group, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution profit sharing plan originally effective on September 1, 2000. The Plan was last restated and amended effective October 2, 2023. The Plan covers all employees of Teal's Management Group, Inc. (Employer) who have attained age 21 and have completed 1,000 hours of service within one year. The Plan also covers Teal's Inc., RPF Inc., TTN Food, LLC, GT Properties, Depot No. V, LLC, Depot No. VI, LLC, Depot No. VII, LLC, Depot No. VIII, LLC, Depot No. IX, LLC, RC Liquor I, LLC, Depot No. X – Spicer, LLC, Depot No. XI – Albany, LLC, 4TG Liquor I, LLC, L & P Nyberg LLC (dba: Durand Fresh Market), and Depot No. XIII – Wabasha, LLC as participating employers. An eligible employee will begin participation on the next day following the completion of eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

The Plan includes a 401(k) cash or deferred arrangement. Under this arrangement and subject to Plan provisions, participants may elect to defer a percentage of their eligible compensation as pre-tax or Roth deferrals up to the maximum allowed for the Plan. The Plan allows participants age 50 and older to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans.

The Employer matched 25% of deferrals up to 6% of compensation deferred for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Employer may, at its discretion, elect to make a discretionary profit sharing contribution to the Plan. In order to share in Employer profit sharing contributions, a participant must complete a year of service and be employed on the last day of the Plan year. The Employer did not authorize a profit sharing contribution for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations. Participants direct the investment of contributions into the various investment options offered under the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Employer's contributions, and an allocation of Plan earnings or losses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants become vested in the portion of the Employer's contributions at a rate of 20% per year of service, becoming 100% vested after the completion of five years of credited service. Notwithstanding the above, a participant is fully vested upon reaching normal retirement age (65), death, or permanent disability.

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited nonvested accounts are used to pay Plan administrative expenses or used to reduce future Employer contributions. Forfeited nonvested accounts as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$8 and \$9, respectively. There were \$4,516 and \$1,308 of forfeitures used to pay administrative expenses for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. There were no forfeitures used to reduce Employer contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Benefit Payments

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or normal retirement, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in their account in the form of a lump-sum payment. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance is less than \$5,000, the Plan administrator will authorize the benefit payment without the participant's consent. All mandatory distributions of participant accounts between \$1,000 and \$5,000 are required to be rolled over into an IRA account. The Plan permits in-service distributions at age 59½ and for financial hardship, subject to Plan provisions.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's administrators determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Benefit Payments

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

The Employer pays certain administrative expenses on behalf of the Plan. Fees related to the administration of the Plan and benefit payments and certain asset-based fees are allocated to participant accounts and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through July 28, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 CERTIFICATION OF INVESTMENT INFORMATION

Principal Life Insurance Company, the insurance company, has supplied the Plan administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of all investment information reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units as determined by the insurance company. NAV is readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions.

Guaranteed Interest Account: The guaranteed interest investment is not fully benefit-responsive and is valued at fair value. The fair value of the guaranteed interest investment is calculated by discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar instruments with comparable durations. In determining the reasonableness of the methodology, the Plan administrator evaluates a variety of factors including review of existing contracts, economic conditions, industry and market developments, and overall credit ratings.

NOTE 5 INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan entered into a group annuity contract with Principal Life Insurance Company (Principal). As part of the contract, Principal maintains a portion of the contributions in the insurance company investment contract (GIC). The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for Plan withdrawals and administrative expenses charged by Principal. The GIC is included in the financial statements at fair value because it is not fully benefit responsive. The average yield and crediting yield was approximately 5.00% and 3.70% percent for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

NOTE 6 INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan is placing reliance on an opinion letter received from the IRS on the pre-approved plan indicating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and is therefore not subject to tax under current income tax law. The plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7 RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Principal Life Insurance Company, insurance company and recordkeeper of the Plan. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest.

NOTE 8 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9 PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their Employer contributions.
