Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets held for investment purposes at end of year as of December 31, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- the form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1. Plan Description

The following description of GoPro 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General:

Effective January 1, 2013, GoPro, Inc. (the “Company”) established a defined contribution plan for eligible employees. Eligible employees are able to participate in the Plan upon commencement of employment. The Plan was most recently restated for the Cycle 3 Restatement on January 1, 2022. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Contributions and Vesting:

Eligible employees of the Company may elect to contribute to the Plan pre-tax contributions or after-tax Roth contributions up to the applicable limits allowed under the Internal Revenue Code. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The Plan also provides for employer profit sharing and matching contributions on a discretionary basis as determined by the Company. All participants are eligible to receive matching allocations. To receive the employer profit sharing contributions, participants are required to have completed 1,000 hours of credited service with the Company during the plan year and be employed on the last day of the plan year. The Company elected not to make any discretionary profit sharing or matching contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024. Participants direct the investment of the contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions and earnings thereon are fully vested and non-forfeitable at all times.

Participant Accounts:

The recordkeeper maintains an account for each participant. Each participant account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocation of (a) the Company’s contributions, if any, and (b) Plan earnings. The earnings are based on the earnings of the investments selected by the participant. The participant directs the investment of their account into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants:

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loans are secured by the balance in the participant’s account. Loans bear interest at a rate equal to the prime rate plus 2%. Interest received is credited directly to the borrower’s account. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1. Plan Description (Cont.)

Payment of Benefits:

Upon separation of service or other conditions as defined in the Plan, the participants or their beneficiaries are entitled to a lump sum distribution equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or various options as defined in the Plan.

Administrative Expenses:

Plan investment and trust management fees paid are charged against the Plan's assets, unless otherwise paid by the Company. These fees are allocated to the participants' accounts in the same manner as the allocation of income and loss. Expenses related to specific participant transactions are charged to the respective participant's account. The annual audit and tax fees are paid directly by the Company and are not included in the accompanying financial statements.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting:

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition:

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participants account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note is recorded as a benefit payment based upon the terms of the plan document.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Cont.)

Benefits Paid to Participants:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Use of Estimates:

The preparation of financial statements is in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Date of Management's Review of Subsequent Events:

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through July 31, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued. There were no material modifications to the Plan or plan provisions.

Note 3. Fair Value Measurements

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 measurements consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets (Level 1), and Level 3 measurements are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. There are no plan assets requiring the use of Level 2 or 3 inputs for the periods presented.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

Investments in registered investment companies (mutual funds) are stated at the respective fund's net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan, which is determined based on market values at the closing price on the last business day of the year. The NAV is a quoted price in an active market and classified within the Level 1 hierarchy.

The NAV of a collective investment trust is calculated based on a compilation of primarily observable market inputs. Participants in a plan or trust invested in the Mellon Stable Value Fund are prohibited from directing investments into a competing fund without first investing in a non-competing fund for at least ninety days. The T. Rowe Price Retirement Trusts do not have any redemption restrictions. The issuers may in their sole discretion elect to defer plan sponsor-directed withdrawals, generally for a period not to exceed twelve months, as set forth in the declaration of trusts.

Note 5. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right to terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA and the Internal Revenue Code. Upon termination of the Plan, the total net assets of the Plan are to be distributed to the participants in proportion to their account balances.

Note 6. Related Party and Party-In-Interest Transactions

During the plan years December 31, 2024 and 2023, the trustee of the Plan provided participant-level services as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. These transactions are covered by an exemption from the “prohibited transaction” provisions of ERISA and the Internal Revenue Code.

Participants may borrow from their vested account balance. Such loan transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA and the Internal Revenue Code.

Note 7. Income Tax Status and Plan Amendments

The Plan obtained its latest opinion letter on July 13, 2021, in which the Internal Revenue Service determined and informed the sponsor of the non-standardized pre-approved plan that the Plan and related trust, as then designed, were in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Plan management and the Plan’s tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. Generally, the Plan’s tax returns remain open for three to four years for income tax examination.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
