Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of Mainline Information Systems 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Mainline Information Systems 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Mainline Information Systems 401(k) Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Mainline Information Systems 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan and adoption agreements for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Mainline Information Systems (the “Company”), and its affiliated entities. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan allows employees to make elective deferral contributions and provides for employer matching of a percentage of such elective contributions.

Administration

Mainline Information Systems controls and manages the operation and administration of the Plan. Principal Trust Company serves as the trustee and Principal Life Insurance Company is record keeper for the Plan.

Plan Eligibility

All employees are eligible to participate in the Plan and make elective deferral contributions upon hire. Eligibility for employer non-elective contributions is also extended to all employees, with no minimum age or service requirements. The only requirement for participation in the Plan is employee status. Eligibility provisions are established in accordance with the terms of the Plan document.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 85% of compensation, as defined in the Plan, in the form of elective deferrals subject to limitations defined in the Internal Revenue Code. Participants are automatically enrolled with a 4% deferral rate.

The Company may make matching contributions equal to a discretionary percentage or amount, to be determined by the Company, of the participant’s 401(k) elective deferrals. The Company may also limit the amount of compensation used to calculate matching contributions.

The Company may also make discretionary nonelective profit sharing contributions. Such contributions shall be allocated in the same ratio as each participant’s compensation bears to the total compensation of all participants for that Plan year.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, Company's contribution and Plan earnings and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on the account balances or participant earnings, as defined. Forfeited balances of terminated participant's nonvested accounts are used first to pay Plan expenses. Remaining forfeitures are added to Company contributions. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their elective deferral contributions and rollover contributions. Vesting of Company matching contributions and nonelective profit sharing contributions is based on the following events:

- On or after the date the participant reaches normal retirement age (65 years).
- On or after the date the participant reaches early retirement age, as defined by the Plan.
- On the date the participant becomes totally disabled, as defined by the Plan.
- On the date of the participant's death.

Before the dates described above, the following schedule determines participant vesting percentage:

Investment Options

All Plan investments are participant-directed. Participants can choose among multiple investment funds and a self-directed brokerage account and can direct investments among the funds in multiples of 1%. The investment alternatives differ in the level of potential investment earnings and risk. Participants may change their investment direction and existing investment mix at any time.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants represent participant loans that are recorded at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable

from participants is recorded when it is earned. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be a distribution, the participant loan is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Participants may borrow from their 401(k) deferral and rollover account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is less. The notes are collateralized by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest rates determined by the loan administrator to be commensurate with local prevailing rates. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Distribution of Benefits to Participants

Benefits may be paid upon death, disability, termination or retirement to the participant or their beneficiaries, in lump-sum amounts or annuity payments. Upon certain circumstances, hardship withdrawals are allowed from the Plan. Upon termination of employment with the Sponsor, participants are entitled to a distribution of the vested portion of their account. Participants, age fifty-nine and one half (59 ½) or older, may withdraw all or any part of the vested balance at any time without penalty.

Rollover Contributions

The Plan permits participants to make rollover contributions into the Plan from other eligible retirement plans, including qualified plans under Section 401(a), 403(a) and 403(b) plans, governmental 457(b) plans, and traditional IRAs, provided such rollovers meet the requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Rollover contributions are not subject to the Plan's eligibility requirements.

Unallocated Assets

As of December 31, 2024, there were no unallocated assets held in separate accounts.

Forfeited Accounts

The nonvested balance in a participant's account is forfeited when the participant ceases to be an employee and receives a distribution of the entire vested portion of their account. The nonvested portion is first used to reduce administrative expenses of the Plan, to offset Company contributions, and any excess is allocated to the remaining participants. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$17,347 and \$38,402, respectively. Forfeitures applied for the plan year ended December 31, 2024, amounted to \$81,705, net of fees.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, all amounts credited to the affected participants' accounts shall become 100% vested and shall not be subject to forfeiture.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies of the Plan are as follows:

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than U.S. generally accepted accounting principles. Under this method, contributions are recognized when received with adjustments for contributions for the reporting year received by the Plan after the year end. Benefit and expense payments are recognized when paid rather than when they are incurred. Investment income is recognized when received rather than when earned.

Investments

Investments of the Plan are reported at fair value, except fully benefit-responsive investment contracts (See Note 3), which is reported at contract value and approximates fair value. Fair value is the amount that the Plan could reasonably expect to receive for the investments in a current sale between a willing buyer and a willing seller. Fair value is measured by the market price if there is an active market for the investment (See Note 3).

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes both realized gains and losses on dispositions of investments and unrealized gains and losses reflecting adjustments to fair value.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

The Plan invests in various mutual funds comprised of investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is

reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Operating Expenses

For the year ended December 31, 2024, audit fees, legal fees, and personnel administrative costs in maintaining the Plan were paid by the Plan Sponsor at the discretion of the Administrator. Investment management and advisor fees are paid by the Plan.

NOTE 3 - INVESTMENTS AND FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are held by Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company as trustee. All information on Plan investment assets and related investment income transactions has been prepared and certified as both complete and accurate by Principal Trust Company as trustee during plan year 2024. Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investments contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the evaluation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.
- If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective Investment Trusts: Valued at the NAV of units held by the Plan at the measurement date as reported by the fund managers. The units are a function of the underlying investments which are traded on an active market. The NAV for each collective investment trust ("CIT") is based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the funds, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Valued at the NAV of shares held by the Plan at year end, which is based upon the quoted market prices of the underlying investments.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 4 - PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

Parties-in-interest are defined under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) to include fiduciaries, any person rendering services to the Plan, the Plan Sponsor, and certain others, they are as follows:

- The Plan Sponsor, Mainline Information Systems, Inc., performs certain administrative functions for the Plan at no cost to the Plan. Therefore, no compensation is paid to the Plan Sponsor or its employees for services rendered.
- Principal Life Insurance Company and its affiliates - The Plan invests in pooled separate accounts and collective investment trusts managed by Principal Life Insurance Company and its affiliates. Principal Life Insurance Company is also the record keeper for the Plan.
- Principal Trust Company acts as trustee for the Plan's investments as defined by the Plan.

In addition to those listed above, other service providers that perform professional services for the Plan, including the Plan's independent auditor and investment advisor, may also be considered parties-in-interest under ERISA.

All transactions with parties-in-interest were conducted in the ordinary course of Plan operations and at fair market value, and are exempt from the prohibited transaction provisions of ERISA under Section 408(b)(8).

NOTE 5 - EVALUATION OF SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through July 7, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 6 - TAX STATUS

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter on June 30, 2020, in which Internal Revenue Service (IRS) made a favorable determination of the Plan and stated that the Plan, as then designed, is in compliance with the applicable requirements of the *Internal Revenue Code*. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements. Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Company has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax period in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examination for years prior to 2021.
