Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of Feld Entertainment, Inc. 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

The supplemental schedule of assets is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

Organization

Feld Entertainment, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Feld Entertainment, Inc. (the “Company”, the “Employer”, or the “Plan Sponsor”). The Plan was established by the Company on August 1, 1997 for the purpose of supplementing participant income upon retirement. In addition to retirement benefits, the Plan may provide benefits in the event of participant death, disability, or in the event of participant termination of employment prior to normal retirement.

The Plan’s assets are held in trust under an agreement between the Company and Empower Retirement (“Trustee and record-keeper”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (“ERISA”).

The Plan was restated with an effective date of August 1, 2022. The Plan has been amended as of April 1, 2024 (Amendment #1).

The following brief description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Summary Plan Description or Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan covers all eligible employees of the Company as defined by the Plan Document. There are no eligibility requirements to participate in the Plan other than employment commencement.

Contributions

Participants in the Plan may contribute up to 60% of their annual pretax compensation, subject to the Internal Revenue Code (the “Code”) limitations. Participants may change their contribution percentage monthly.

In addition, the Plan and the Code permit participants age 50 or over during the Plan year to make additional “catch-up contributions” up to Code limitations. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans. The Plan also allow participants to make after-tax contributions to their accounts.

The Company may make discretionary matching employer contributions to the Plan. The matching contributions are based on participants’ compensation and elective deferrals. Matching contributions are made after each pay period and are made to all participants who were active at any time during the payroll period. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the employer matching contribution, which matches 75% of employees’ deferrals up to 4% of their eligible compensation, totaled approximately \$1,573,000.

Effective April 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to include an automatic deferral for new hires. The automatic deferral percentage is a fixed percentage of 4% from the participant’s compensation each payroll period unless the participant makes a contrary election.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment, a participant may direct employee and employer contributions to any of the Plan's fund options in at least 1% intervals. Participants may also redirect their contributions or exchange their existing fund account balances daily via an automated system.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocation of employer contributions and Plan investment results. Allocations of employer contributions are based on participant earnings and allocations of Plan investment results are based on account balances, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's account.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their account balances a minimum of \$1,000 to a maximum of the lesser of one-half of the vested account value or \$50,000. The loan must be repaid in equal monthly installments, and amortized over a term of no more than five years. In instances where the loan is for the purchase of the participant's primary residence, the repayment period can be no more than 10 years. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at Prime plus 1%. At the time a participant terminates employment with the Company, outstanding loans are offset against the participant's account balance. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. The Plan provides for an early prepayment option.

Vesting

Participants' contributions, including rollover contributions, and actual earnings thereon, are 100% vested. Employer contributions and actual earnings thereon are incrementally vested over five years of service, with the participant becoming 100% vested at the conclusion of the fifth year of service.

In the event of death, total or permanent disability, or retirement, participants become fully vested in the Employer contributions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service, a participant with an account balance of less than \$1,000 can either rollover his or her funds into another plan or receive a lump sum amount, equal to the vested value of his or her account. A participant with an account balance greater than \$1,000 can rollover his or her funds into another plan, receive a lump sum amount, or leave the funds in the Plan, equal to the vested value of his or her account. Participants with account balances greater than \$5,000 also have the option to receive installment payments. Other provisions apply for payments due to disability, death, and other circumstances. The Plan also allows for hardship distributions.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right to amend or discontinue the Plan at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. Upon termination of the Plan, the account of each participant will be 100% vested.

NOTE 2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the plan.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value except for the fully benefit responsive group annuity contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Investment management expenses charged to the Plan for investments are deducted from income earned and are not separately reflected. Consequently, investment management expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP") requires management to make estimates that affect the amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Forfeitures

Forfeited balances of terminated participants' non-vested accounts are used to pay administrative expenses or to reduce future employer contributions.

During 2024, approximately \$55,000 of terminated participants' non-vested account balances were forfeited and approximately \$139,000 of forfeited balances from prior and current years were used to reduce 2024 employer contributions. In addition, approximately \$37,000 in expenses were paid by use of forfeitures in 2024. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan's forfeiture account balances were approximately \$180,000 and \$297,000, respectively.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No

allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems that participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2024 and 2023 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2025 and 2024, respectively.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in the net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

In accordance with Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification "FASB ASC" Topic 855, Subsequent Events, the Plan evaluated subsequent events through July 30, 2025, the date the financial statements were available for issue.

NOTE 3 FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

In accordance with FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, the Plan assessed the guidelines for measuring fair value. These guidelines provide a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. FASB ASC 820 establishes three levels of fair value hierarchy that are described below:

The following methods and assumptions were used to estimate the fair value of each class of assets that are recognized at fair value:

Cash and cash equivalents

These investments, comprised of money market accounts, are carried at cost, which approximates fair value, due to their short term nature. As such, these investments are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Mutual funds

The investments are public investment vehicles valued using the NAV provided by the administrator of the fund. The NAV is based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus the liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. The NAV is a quoted price in an active market and classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

NOTE 4 GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT

The Plan has a fully benefit responsive group annuity contract with an insurance company, which is called the Key Guarantee Portfolio Fund. The insurance company maintains the contributions in a general account, which is credited with earnings and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

Since the group annuity contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the group annuity contract. The group annuity contract is presented on the face of the statement of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with the insurance company. Such events include the following: (1) premature termination of the contracts by

the Plan, (2) layoffs, (3) Plan termination, (4) and bankruptcy. Plan management believes that the occurrence of events that would cause the Plan to transact at less than contract value is not probable. The insurance company may not terminate the contract at any amount less than the contract value.

The insurance company is contractually obligated to pay the principal and specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the insurance company. The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate is based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium-long term new portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate, as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions. Interest crediting rate is reset quarterly. The effective annual interest rate will never be less than 0.10%.

The average yield earned by the plan for the benefit responsive fund can be derived by averaging the quarterly gross interest rates for the fund over the year. The average for 2023 is 1.23% and for 2024 is 1.41%. The actual average yield earned by the plan for the benefit responsive fund can be derived by averaging the plan's quarterly interest rates. The average for 2023 is 1.48% and for 2024 is 1.66%.

NOTE 5 INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan has received a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated June 30, 2020, with respect to the prototype as designed at the date of the letter. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 6 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 7 INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S TRUSTEES

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by Section 29 CFR 2520.109(c) of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America

and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the Trustees of certain Plan assets, have certified as to the completeness and accuracy of the funds held as reflected in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023 and net appreciation/(depreciation) in fair value of investments, interest, and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 8 PARTIES IN INTEREST AND RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The group annuity contract is managed by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America. Empower Trust Company, LLC is the third-party administrator for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan pays investment advisory fees, contract administrator fees, and professional fees directly. The Plan Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations.
