We have performed audits of the financial statements of Kikiktagruk Inupiat Corporation 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Kikiktagruk Inupiat Corporation 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was formed on November 1, 1994 and was most recently restated effective March 1, 2021. The Plan is a defined contribution plan that covers substantially all employees of Kikiktagruk Inupiat Corporation and its subsidiaries (the Company or Employer), as defined below. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended, (ERISA) and the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

Custodian and Administration of the Plan

The custodian of the Plan is John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A) (John Hancock). The administrator of the Plan is the Company. The custodian holds all assets of the Plan in accordance with the service provider contract with the Company. The administrator determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Eligibility

Employees who are age 21 or older, and who are not members of an excluded employee group, as defined below, are eligible to make deferrals to the Plan. Excluded employees are union employees whose employment is governed by a collective bargaining agreement under which retirement benefits were the subject of good faith bargaining, unless the collective bargaining agreement requires the employee to be included within the Plan, and certain nonresident aliens who have no earned income from sources within United States.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined, into the Plan. Participants can contribute on a before-tax basis, an after-tax basis (Roth), or a combination thereof, subject to annual Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contributions plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled into the Plan, unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 3% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a default investment that the Plan administrator has selected. The automatic contribution arrangement does not apply to the union employees. There is no auto-escalation clause based the Plan document.

The Employer makes matching contribution of 50% of a participant's effective deferrals, up to 8% of eligible compensation. During the year ended December 31, 2024, there were \$355,588 of employer matching contributions made to the Plan. In addition, the Employer may make a

discretionary profit-sharing contribution. In order to share in the profit-sharing contribution for a Plan year, employees must be employed on the last day of the Plan year and complete at least 1,000 hours of service during the plan year. There were no discretionary profit-sharing contributions made to the Plan during the year ended December 31, 2024. The Employer may make contributions to the Plan to help satisfy the fringe benefit requirements of the law to the employees who perform work for the Employer subject to prevailing wage laws. There were no discretionary prevailing wage contributions made to the Plan during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant account is credited with the participant's contributions, contributions from the Company, as well as allocations of the Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their account balances a minimum of \$1,000, up to a maximum equal to the lesser of (i) \$50,000 or (ii) 50% of the present value of the participant's account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years or longer if funds are used for the purchase of a principal residence. The loans are collateralized by the participant's account balance. Principal and interest are paid to the Plan through payroll deductions. The Plan administrator determines a reasonable rate of interest by reviewing the interest rates charged for similar types of loans by other lenders. The interest rate is fixed for the duration of the loan. The maximum number of Plan loans that participants may have outstanding at any time is one. These loans are subject to certain restrictions as defined by the Plan Document and applicable restrictions under the IRC.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their elective deferrals and earnings thereon. Vesting in the Employer's matching and profit-sharing contribution portion of their account was previously based on years of continuous service. A participant was 25% vested after one year of service, 50% vested after two years of service and 100% vested after three years of credited service. Participants were immediately vested in the Company's contributions made to satisfy the fringe benefit requirements of the prevailing wage laws and contributions required by certain collective bargaining agreements. In the event of death, permanent disability or retirement, a participant's employer contribution account was fully vested. Effective March 1, 2022, all employer contributions are immediately 100% vested.

Benefit Payments

Vested benefits will normally be distributed to the participant or the participant's beneficiary upon termination of employment, death, disability, or retirement. In-service distributions are allowed for participants 59½ and older. Distributions are allowed in a single lump sum payment or in the form of partial withdrawals of at least \$1,000. If a vested benefit does not exceed \$5,000, a single lump sum payment will be distributed or rolled over to an IRA for the benefit of a participant, without participant's consent. Financial hardship withdrawals are permitted, as defined in the Plan Agreement.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures may be used to pay administrative expenses and reduce future employer contributions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no unallocated forfeiture amounts were available. During the year ended December 31, 2024, no forfeitures were used by the Plan.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan determines the valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, and insurance company. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on the investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Participant contributions and any related employer matching contributions are recognized in the period during which the Company makes the respective payroll deduction from the participant's compensation. Profit-sharing contributions are recorded in the relevant period in accordance with the terms in the Plan document.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Delinquent loans are treated as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan Agreement. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the

2024 and 2023 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2025 and 2024, respectively.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company, except for certain expenses that are charged to participant accounts, including loan, withdrawal fees, plan administrative fees, and investment management fees. Certain investment expenses which are charged within investments are presented net of the appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments. All other expenses of the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024 were paid by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements.

3. Fair Value Measurements

Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, provides for a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 or 2023. The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value:

Pooled Separate Accounts (PSAs): PSAs are valued at the net asset value (NAV) of the units held. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the PSA less its liabilities. The fair value of the underlying investments, which can consist of a single mutual fund or multiple securities, is determined using market quotations or prices obtained from independent pricing sources. The NAV, as provided by John Hancock, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. NAV would not be used if it was probable that the investment would not be traded at NAV. The PSAs provide for daily redemptions by the Plan at reported NAV with no advance notice. There are no unfunded commitments related to these investments.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation which may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

In accordance with Subtopic 820-10, the pooled separate accounts have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy since they are measured at NAV per share (or its equivalent).

(a) *Target Risk* - The objective of these investments is to provide a diversified mix of stock, bonds, and other investments to create a desired risk profile.

(b) *Conservative* - The objective of these investments is to provide a balance between a high level of current income and growth of capital.

(c) *Aggressive Growth* - The objective of these investments is to provide aggressive growth of capital.

(d) *Income* - The objective of these investments is total return with a focus on current income.

(e) *Growth* - The objective of these investments is to provide long-term growth of capital.

4. Information Certified by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A)

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and Schedule H, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year), including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed

to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) (John Hancock), a qualified institution.

At the request of the Plan administrator, the Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

5. Tax Status

The Plan uses a pre-approved plan document sponsored by Pension Plan Specialists, PC. Pension Plan Specialists, PC received an opinion letter from the IRS, dated June 30, 2020, which states that the pre-approved plan document, as then designed, satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since the date of the opinion letter, Plan management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no IRS examinations for any tax periods in progress.

6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will remain 100% vested in their accounts.

7. Related-Party Transactions and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Plan investments are managed by John Hancock. Distribution and loan processing fees are paid to John Hancock by participants. The Plan paid for investment advisory fees and recordkeeping services fees which qualify as party-in-interest transactions as defined by ERISA. Certain management fees in the form of an expense ratio charged to each investment option are paid by the Plan and deducted from earnings on investments. The Plan also issues loans to participants which are secured by the vested balance of the participant's accounts. These transactions are permitted under provisions of the Plan and are exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan holds various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate risk, credit risk and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and participant account balances.

9. Delinquent Participant Contributions

During the Plan year ended December 31, 2023, \$68,174 of participant contributions and loan repayments were not remitted to the Plan within the timeframe prescribed by DOL regulations. The related lost earnings are expected to be remitted to the Plan during 2025. These transactions constitute prohibited transactions as defined by ERISA.

10. Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through July 31, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.
