Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain other internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

***Report on Compiled 2023 Financial Statement***

Plan management is responsible for the accompanying financial statement of Copeland Buhl, PLLP Profit Sharing Plan, which comprises the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. We have performed a compilation engagement in accordance with Statements on Standards for Accounting and Review Services promulgated by the Accounting and Review Services Committee of the AICPA. We did not audit or review the financial statement, nor were we required to perform any procedures to verify the accuracy or completeness of the information provided by plan management. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion, a conclusion, nor provide any form of assurance on the 2023 financial statement.

***Other Matter – Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA***

The supplemental schedule of assets held at end of year is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the 2024 financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

#### **(1) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

##### **Nature of Business of Plan Sponsor**

Copeland Buhl & Company, PLLP (the Plan Sponsor, Plan administrator, Employer or the Company), is a regional full-service public accounting firm providing services across the United States. The Company's office is located in Minnesota.

##### **Method of Accounting**

The financial statements of Copeland Buhl & Company, PLLP Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

##### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of changes in net assets during the reporting period. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

##### **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value on a recurring basis or at contract value as determined by Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Life and Annuity Insurance Company of New York (collectively, the Custodian or Empower). Valuation is determined by the Custodian (Note 3). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded when received. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Fully benefit-responsive investment contracts are reported as Guaranteed Investment Contracts (GIC) within the notes to the financial statements

##### **Net Change in Fair Market Value**

The net change in fair market value is composed of the realized gains and losses in securities that were sold or otherwise disposed of during the year and the unrealized gains and losses in securities held at the end of the year.

##### **Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan provides for various investment options. Investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

##### **Contributions**

Contributions from Plan participants and the Plan Sponsor are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

#### **(1) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

##### **Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

##### **Participant Notes Receivable**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2024 (Audited), and 2023 (Compiled), no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

##### **Subsequent Events**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through July 24, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

#### **(2) Description of the Plan**

The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

##### **General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Copeland Buhl & Company, PLLP (the Company or Plan Sponsor). The Plan was adopted with an effective date of January 1, 1987. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan is intended to satisfy all requirements of a qualified retirement plan under the appropriate provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

##### **Eligibility**

Employees who have attained the age of twenty-one and have completed two months of service during the Plan year are eligible to participate in the plan. Upon meeting the Plan's eligibility requirements, employees may enter the Plan on the first of the following month. Upon completing one year of service employees are eligible to receive non-elective safe harbor, discretionary matching and discretionary non-elective employer contributions.

##### **Contributions**

Each year, participants may contribute up to the lesser of certain Plan or lawful limits of pretax annual compensation. The Plan allows for non-elective safe harbor, discretionary matching and discretionary non-elective contributions by the Plan Sponsor. The Plan Sponsor's non-elective safe harbor contribution is equal to three percent of eligible compensation. Participants must be employed on the last day of the plan year to be eligible for the discretionary matching and discretionary non-elective contributions. The Plan Sponsor did not make any discretionary matching contributions during the year ended December 31, 2024 (Audited). Discretionary non-elective contributions totaled \$206,026 during the year ended December 31, 2024 (Audited). Active participants may roll over amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans.

#### **(2) Description of the Plan**

##### **Contributions**

The Plan allows Roth elective deferrals. Contributions to Roth accounts are made on an after-tax basis and contributions to a Roth account are included in the participant's gross contributions. Future distributions of Roth elected contributions and earnings thereon will not be taxed, if certain criteria are met. Roth elective deferrals to the Plan are permanently designated as Roth elective deferrals in participant accounts. The participant's Roth deferrals and gains and losses attributable to such deferrals are accounted for separately.

##### **Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and an allocation of (a) the Plan Sponsor's non-elective safe harbor contribution, (b) the Company's discretionary match and non-elective contributions, and (c) Plan earnings or losses less expenses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses, net of investment fee rebates earned, paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined by the Plan Document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

##### **Participant Notes Receivable**

Participant notes receivable are valued at the principal balance of the notes. Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. Loan terms range from 1 to 5 years for general purpose loans and up to 30 years for the purchase of a personal residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at market rates at the time of application. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

##### **Participant Investment Options**

Upon enrollment to the Plan, a participant may direct employee and employer contributions to any of the investments offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options daily.

##### **Payment of Benefits**

Benefit payments are made as soon as administratively feasible following the date on which a distribution request is made or is otherwise payable. Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant or his or her beneficiary may receive a lump-sum distribution of the participant's account balance. Benefits less than \$1,000 are made as soon as administratively feasible after the participant's termination of employment. A participant with an account balance of greater than \$1,000, but less than \$5,000, may receive a rollover distribution into an individual retirement account set up by the Plan Administrator. The Plan also allows in-service withdrawals, subject to Plan provisions.

##### **Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and non-elective safe harbor contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. The portion of the participant's account attributable to the discretionary match and non-elective contributions becomes 100 percent vested over six years of credited service at a rate of 20 percent per year beginning in year two, or if less than six years, upon reaching normal retirement age, disability, death, or upon termination of the Plan.

**(2) Description of the Plan**

**Forfeitures**

Forfeited, nonvested account balances totaled \$2,793 and \$2,870 at December 31, 2024 (Audited), and 2023 (Compiled), respectively. The Plan allocates forfeitures to reduce future employer contributions. Forfeitures used to reduce 2024 employer contributions received by the Plan were \$2,878 during the year ended December 31, 2024 (Audited).

**Administrative Expenses**

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers and employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. The Company has, at its discretion, absorbed certain other administrative expenses pertaining to the Plan. If not paid by the Company, these administrative expenses become the responsibility of the Plan. The Plan utilizes fee rebates earned through the investments offered to participants to offset administrative expenses. Investment fee rebates in excess of administrative expenses are recorded as net appreciation in fair value of investments on the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits. Certain benefit payment and loan fees are charged directly to the participant's account.

**(3) Investments -- Information Certified by Custodians**

The Plan's investments are held and certified by the Custodian, who perform all accounting functions associated with the Plan's investments. The fair value of investments at December 31, 2024 (Audited) and 2023 (Compiled), is determined by the Custodian (Note 5). The Plan is administered by the Plan Sponsor. The Plan's investments are in funds held and managed by the Custodian.

In accordance with Section 2520.103-8 of the United States Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the Plan Administrator has received certification from the Custodian as to the accuracy and completeness of certain financial information of the Plan as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 (Audited) and 2023 (Compiled). The Custodian have certified information contained in the following:

- Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits (except for employee and employer receivables);
- Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits (except for contributions, administrative expenses and benefits paid to participants);
- Supplemental Schedule of Assets Held at End of Year

The Plan primarily invests in mutual funds, pooled separate accounts and a GIC with underlying assets consisting of any combination of stocks, bonds, fixed income securities and other investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the fair values of investments securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Market volatility of equity-based investments may substantially impact the value of such investments at any given time. It is possible that the value of the Plan's investments, both in total and in individual participant accounts, has changed significantly since December 31, 2024 (Audited).

**(4) Recurring Fair Value Measurements**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level One: inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access
- Level Two: inputs include
  - quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
  - quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
  - inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
  - inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability
- Level Three: inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 (Audited) and 2023 (Compiled).

*Pooled Separate Accounts:* Fair value represents the value of the fund shares, which is calculated daily based on the valuation of the funds' underlying investments at fair value. The pooled separate accounts invest mainly in mutual funds, domestic stocks, international stocks, and fixed securities.

*Mutual Funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The following tables present the assets carried at fair value as of December 31, 2024 (Audited) and 2023 (Compiled) in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits by fair value hierarchy, as described on the previous page. All assets are measured on a recurring basis. No liabilities are measured at fair value on a recurring or nonrecurring basis.

#### **(5) Guaranteed Investment Contract**

The Plan holds a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Mass Mutual totaling \$2,520,729 and \$3,049,821 at December 31, 2024 (Audited) and 2023 (Compiled), respectively. The Custodian maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1 percent or greater than 3 percent. The crediting rate is reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by the Custodian, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, and (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

#### **(6) Income Tax Status**

The Plan has adopted a non-standardized form of prototype plan sponsored by the Custodian and Empower. The prototype plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service as to the prototype plan's qualified status. The prototype plan opinion letter has been relied upon by this Plan. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter; however, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Department of Labor or Internal Revenue Service. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31 2024 (Audited), and 2023 (Compiled), there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**(7) Participant Withdrawals**

As of December 31, 2024 (Audited), and 2023 (Compiled), Plan assets include terminated participants with vested account balances totaling approximately \$2,267,000 and \$2,886,000 respectively. There were no amounts owed to participants who had elected to withdraw from the Plan but had not been paid as of December 31, 2024 (Audited) and 2023 (Compiled).

**(8) Party-In-Interest Transactions**

Fees for legal and professional services rendered to the Plan may be paid by the Company at its discretion. The Plan allows participants to take out loans against their account balances. Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by the Custodian of the Plan.

All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

**(9) Termination of Plan**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.
