NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Capitol-Husting Company, Inc. Savings and Retirement Plan and Trust (Plan) is based on the Plan agreement, and provides general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement and related amendments for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is intended to meet the requirements of Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and to qualify as a salary reduction plan. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). It was established to provide retirement benefits to eligible employees of Capitol-Husting Company, Inc. (Company or employer). The assets of the Plan are held for the exclusive benefit of the participating employees. An employee of the Company becomes eligible to participate in the Plan if he or she is 21 years of age with one year of service (at least 1,000 hours of service time before the one-year anniversary of his/her hire date), as of the next entry date: January 1, April 1, July 1 or October 1.

Contributions

Participants

The Plan allows eligible employees to contribute up to 25% of their compensation as salary deferral, subject to maximum limitations under the IRC. The 25% maximum will be enforced with every payroll period. Plan participants are auto-enrolled at 4% unless elected otherwise. Effective April 1, 2023, all participants auto-enrolled in the Plan will have a 1% annual increase in deferral percentage until a maximum contribution percentage of 10% is reached, unless the participant opts-out of the auto-escalation feature. The Plan also permits participants to make rollover contributions from other qualified retirement plans.

Company

Each year, the Company has agreed to contribute the following amounts to the Plan:

- An employer matching contribution is made to individual accounts equal to 50% of the first \$1,000 of salary deferral contributions and 25% of the second \$1,000 of salary deferral contributions, not to exceed \$750 by participant.
- A discretionary profit-sharing amount determined each year by the Company's board of directors. This contribution is to be made out of the Company's current or accumulated net profits and is allocated to participant accounts based on the participant's share of eligible compensation for the year. The total discretionary profit-sharing contribution for the Plan year ended December 31, 2024, was \$430,169 excluding forfeitures used.

A participant will share in the employer's matching contribution and employer's discretionary profit-sharing contribution if he or she has attained eligibility within the Plan, is employed on the last day of the Plan year and completed at least 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year.

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained by the recordkeeper for each Plan participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the employer's matching contributions, the employer's discretionary profit-sharing contributions and an allocation of Plan earnings or losses and administrative expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the vested portion of the participant's account.

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of all employee and employer contributions plus actual earnings thereon into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers mutual funds, collective trust funds and an unallocated insurance contract as investment options for participants. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Payment of Benefits

A participant's account balance may not be withdrawn prior to death, retirement, disability, termination of employment, or termination of the Plan, unless the participant is 59½ years of age, or the distribution qualifies as a financial hardship or a qualified birth and/or adoption, as defined in the Plan agreement.

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, the participant or beneficiary is entitled to receive as benefits the entire amount credited to his or her account as of that date. Upon a participant's termination from employment with the Company for a reason other than death, disability or retirement, the participant is entitled to the vested balance of his or her account.

Payment of the vested portion is required to be made in a lump-sum cash payment or installment cash payment.

Any non-vested portion of a terminated participant's account is forfeited and used to reduce employer contributions. If the terminated employee returns to work within five years, the forfeited portion may be restored. Forfeitures used to reduce the employer discretionary profit-sharing contribution and employer matching contribution for the Plan year ended December 31, 2024 were \$3,050. The forfeiture account balance was \$3,050 and \$5,325 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Vesting

Employee contributions to the Plan, including earnings thereon, are fully vested at all times. A participant's vested portion of the amounts of employer contributions credited to his or her account is based on the number of full years of service to the Company in accordance with the following schedule.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Participants may only have one outstanding loan at any time. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The terms of each participant's loan require payments of principal and interest to be made through regular payroll deductions under a level amortization schedule. The interest rate and the loan term are fixed at the inception of each loan based on the requirements in the Plan agreement, with loan terms not to exceed five years unless the loan is used for the purchase of a primary residence. The range for interest rates in effect on outstanding notes receivable from participants was 4.25% to 9.50% at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Expenses of the Plan

Certain administrative expenses are paid by the Company. All other administrative expenses are paid by the Plan and expensed when incurred.

Revenue Sharing

The Plan provides that revenue sharing earned in connection with Plan investments that exceeds recordkeeping fees will be returned to the Plan on a quarterly basis and placed in an "ERISA spending account". The Plan allows for any excess in the ERISA spending account to be allocated to eligible participant accounts pro rata in proportion to their applicable account balances.

Plan Termination

Although they have not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, each participant shall become fully vested and the assets of the trust shall be liquidated and the accrued benefits shall be paid to the participants after the provision is made for the expenses of liquidation.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A summary of the Plan's significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of the accompanying financial statements are as follows.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investment contracts held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value. However, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The statements of net assets available for benefits and statement of changes in net assets available for benefits are prepared on a contract-level basis for the Plan's investments in the unallocated insurance contract.

Except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, the Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note C for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Risks and Uncertainties

Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such change could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of additions to net assets and deductions from net assets during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits paid to participants are recognized when the funds are disbursed.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses have been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant's loan to be in default, the participant's loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

NOTE C - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan records investments at fair value using a fair value hierarchy that distinguishes between assumptions based on market data (observable inputs) and the Plan's assumptions (unobservable inputs). The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value.

Mutual funds - Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

Collective trust funds - Valued at net asset value (NAV) for the units of the collective trust. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying securities, minus liabilities, and then divided by the number of units held by the Plan at year-end. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE D - INCOME TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined by a letter dated March 31, 2014, that the prototype document on which the Plan is based is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The letter stated that the prototype document is qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC and is, therefore, not subject to tax under present income tax laws.

The Plan has adopted certain discretionary amendments. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE E - RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the custodians of the Plan, Empower Annuity Insurance Company, the recordkeeper of the Plan, and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the trustee of the Plan (collectively, Empower), are considered party-in-interest transactions. Additionally, the Plan issues notes receivable to participants, which are also considered party-in-interest transactions. These transactions are not considered prohibited transactions under 29 CFR 408(b) of the ERISA regulations.

Certain administrative expenses are paid directly by the Company.

NOTE F - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S TRUSTEES

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the trustee and custodian have certified that the following data included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate.

- Investments, at fair value, the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, at contract value, and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants, as shown in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Schedule H, line 4(i) - schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

The Plan's independent accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

NOTE G - UNALLOCATED INSURANCE CONTRACT

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan has a benefit-responsive investment contract with Empower. The investment contract is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

The crediting interest rate is based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium-long term new portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate, as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions. Such interest rates are reset on a quarterly basis.

Events that would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer or the participant include, but are not limited to, premature termination of the contracts by the Plan, plant closings, layoffs, Plan termination, bankruptcy, mergers and early retirement incentives.

If the contract is terminated prior to Empower's recovery of any and all start-up costs incurred by the Company, it would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value. However, as there are no plans to terminate the contract, this is not a probable outcome.

The contract can be terminated by either the Plan or Empower with at least 60-days advance written notice to the other party.

NOTE H - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan evaluated its December 31, 2024 financial statements for subsequent events through August 6, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, noting no items requiring further disclosure in the financial statements, except as disclosed below.

Effective July 1, 2025, the Plan was amended to increase the auto-enrollment to 5% unless elected otherwise by the participant.

Effective August 1, 2025, the participant eligibility service requirements and Plan entry dates were amended. The service requirement for participation in the Plan as it relates to employee contributions was amended to three months of service with an entry date in the Plan amended to the first day of the calendar month following satisfaction of the eligibility criteria.
