Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Lozier Corporation 401(k) Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. 1. Plan Description

The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a qualified defined contribution – profit-sharing plan covering all employees of Lozier Corporation, NewStreet Properties, LLC (“NewStreet”), Lozier Enterprise, LLC (“Enterprise”), and Lozier Foundation (“Foundation”) (collectively, “the Company”), who are at least 21 years of age and have completed at least 90 days of service. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Subject to Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations, participants may contribute up to 50% of their annual wages. The Company matches 100% of the first 2% contributed by all eligible participants except as follows:

The Company also makes a contribution (referred to as a “core non-elective” contribution) for all employees whether or not they are participants in the Plan except Grandfathered employees, Omaha production employees hired prior to January 1, 2010, and Scottsboro production employees hired prior to January 1, 2008 (until January 1, 2024). This contribution for all other eligible employees is based on a percentage of compensation and years of service.

Grandfathered employees can continue to make pre-tax contributions to the Plan, but the Company will not make a matching or a core non-elective contribution. Participants who have attained age 50 by the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Participants direct the investments of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's matching and core non-elective contributions and an allocation of Plan earnings and is charged with withdrawals and an allocation of Plan losses. Allocations of earnings (losses) are made pro-rata based on the participant's account balance. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Investments are maintained in individual member accounts managed by Empower Annuity Insurance Company and Empower Trust Company, LLC, formerly Prudential Bank & Trust, F.S.B. (collectively "Empower")

Vesting

Employees are vested immediately in their contributions plus earnings (losses) thereon and, after one year of service, are 100% vested in Company contributions.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Note terms range from one to five years; the term may exceed five years if the loan is for the purchase of a primary residence. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the plan administrator. Notes receivable from participants outstanding as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 mature through 2037 with interest rates ranging from 3.25% to 8.50%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination, retirement, disability, or death, the participant or beneficiary may receive a lump sum or installment payments equal to the value of the vested funds allocated to the participants account. The Plan requires benefit payments under \$1,000, or hardship, be paid in a lump sum as designated by the Plan administrator in the event the participant does not elect otherwise. Benefit payments are recorded when paid. Effective May 1, 2025, the Plan requires all termination benefit payments under \$7,000 to be automatically rolled over into an individual retirement account.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures may be applied to reduce Company contributions or pay administrative expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$22,045 and \$6,288, respectively. During 2024 and 2023, Company contributions were reduced by \$0 and \$18,750 from forfeited non-vested accounts, respectively.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis and in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Presentation of Participant-Directed Funds

The Plan's presentation of participant-directed investments is in accordance with the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 962, *Plan Accounting – Defined Contribution Pension Plans*.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan utilizes various investments. Investments, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and, that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Company determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and custodians. See Note 6 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Fully benefit-responsive investment contracts are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined-contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract

value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The Company invests in investment contracts through a guaranteed income fund.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued unpaid interest. Delinquent notes are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Plan Expenses

Certain expenses of the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and qualified domestic relations orders are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in Plan expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Recordkeeping and other Plan expenses are paid by the Plan and are included in Plan expenses.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events are events or transactions that occur after the statement of net assets available for benefits date, but before the financial statements are available to be issued and may require potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. Management has considered such events or transactions through August 7, 2025. See the "Contributions" and "Payment of Benefits" sections of Note 1 for descriptions of subsequent events.

3. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of the Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

4. Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Corporation by a letter dated September 23, 2022, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authority. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

5. Information Certified by Empower

6. Fair Value Measurements

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
Level 2	Inputs to the valuation methodology include: Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means; If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
Level 3	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset’s or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. The fund held by the Plan is an open-end mutual fund that is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. This fund is required to publish daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The fund held by the Plan is deemed to be actively traded.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Valued at the NAV based on the market value of its underlying investments. FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, allows NAV per unit to serve as a practical expedient to estimate the fair value as long as certain requirements are met. It is the Plan's assessment that these accounts meet those requirements. Participants can redeem the accounts at NAV as of the measurement date on a daily basis and there are no unfunded commitments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

7. Investment Contracts

The Plan has fully benefit-responsive investment contracts with Empower in 2024 and 2023. Empower maintains the contributions in a guaranteed income fund. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed income fund issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

The guaranteed income fund is valued at the amount Plan participants would receive currently if they were to withdraw or transfer the contracts within the Plan prior to their maturity for an event other than death, disability, termination or retirement.

Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed income fund. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower, represents contributions made under the contracts, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic developments. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

8. Related Party Transactions

Certain Plan investments are pooled separate accounts, a guaranteed income fund, and mutual funds managed by Empower. Empower is the trustee and custodian of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. There were fees of \$35,708 and \$40,757 paid to the trustee and custodian for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.
