NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Rancho Bernardo Wings, LLC 401(K) Profit Sharing Plan & Trust Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

Effective January 1, 2018, Rancho Bernardo Wings, LLC. (the "Company" or "Employer") established and adopted the Plan for its employees. The Plan is a defined contribution savings Plan covering substantially all employees who have reached the age of eighteen and completed three months of service and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The Company serves as the sponsor of the Plan. The Plan is administered by trustees consisting of one or more people appointed by the Board of Directors of the Company.

Contributions

Under the terms of the Plan, participants may elect to defer a percentage of their regular earnings from the Company to the Plan. Such salary reduction contributions on a pre-tax basis shall not exceed the maximum Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") dollar limit of \$23,000 in 2024 and \$22,500 in 2023. Additionally, participants who will be at least age 50 by the end of the tax year may make an additional "catch up" contribution of \$7,500 in 2024 and 2023. Contributions are subject to certain limitations under IRS regulations. Participants may also contribute rollover distributions from other qualified plans. Participants are automatically enrolled into the plan with a one percent deferral rate once they become eligible.

The Company may elect to contribute a discretionary non-elective contribution, the amount of which is determined each year. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company did not make any contributions to the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and an allocation of (a) the Company's contribution, and (b) the Plan's earnings or losses, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or losses on account balances, as defined. Forfeited balances of terminated participants' non-vested accounts are used to reduce employer contributions or pay Plan expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment into the Plan, a participant may direct their employee contributions in various percentage increments among any of the various investment options. Participants may change their investment options at any time via internet access.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferral. Participants become vested in any employer profit-sharing contributions based on years of continuous service. A participant becomes fully vested after six years of continuous service. Any amount not vested upon a participant's separation from service is forfeited and used to reduce the profit-sharing contribution or pay Plan expenses. A participant becomes fully vested in the entire balance of their account upon retirement, disability, death or termination of the Plan.

The discretionary matching and profit-sharing contributions of a participant shall vest subject to the following vesting schedule:

Notes Receivable from Participants

Loans from the Plan are not permitted per the Plan documents.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service for any reason a participant is entitled to the vested value of their accounts. If the vested value is below \$5,000 the participant may receive either a lump sum or have the funds transferred to an IRA or other plan. If the vested value is more than \$5,000 the participant in addition to the options above may also defer benefits to Normal Retirement Age or age 62.

Termination or Modification of the Plan

The Company has the right to terminate the Plan at any time by delivering to the Trustee and Administrator written notice. The sponsor may amend any or all provisions of this Plan without obtaining the approval or consent of the Employer providing the amendment does not permit any part of the corpus or income of the Plan to be used for any purpose other than for the benefit of the participants and their beneficiaries. In the event the Plan is terminated, all participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Administrative Expenses

The employer is authorized to reimburse the Plan for all expenses and fees incurred in the administration of the Plan and paid out of the assets of the fund. During 2024 and 2023 the Plan expenses were \$2,276 and \$1,039, respectively. In addition, investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual method of accounting and present the net assets available for Plan benefits on December 31, 2024 and 2023, and changes in net assets available for Plan benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Investment contracts held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value. However, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the Plan. The statements of net assets available for benefits present the contract value which approximates the fair value of the investment contracts. The statement of changes in net assets available for benefits is prepared on a contract value basis.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. If available, quoted market prices are used to value investments. Shares of registered investment companies are valued at quoted market prices, which represent the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end. Participant loan receivables are valued at costs which approximate the current value. See note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition (Cont.)

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Forfeitures

Upon termination of service, a participant forfeits any non-vested Company contributions. Forfeitures of non-vested participant account balances can be used to reduce the Company's contributions or pay Plan expenses. On December 31, 2024 and 2023 forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$0.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 the Plan reported distributions of \$5,295 and \$6,771.

Administrative Expenses

Certain Plan expenses are deducted from participant accounts or investment income, and the remainder of the Plan expenses are paid by the Company.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and charges therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 3 - INCOME TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Plan's Prototype sponsor by an opinion letter dated January 1, 2018, that the Volume Submitter Profit Sharing Plan with CODA sponsored by Paychex Inc., which has been adopted by the Plan, is acceptable pursuant to Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code and in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Although the plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the plan is designed and is currently being

operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and therefore believe that the plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability or asset if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or asset or disclosure in the financial statements. The plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions, however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

NOTE 4 - ADMINISTRATION OF PLAN ASSETS

The Plan's assets are held by the trustees of the Plan consisting of one or more people appointed by the Board of Directors of the Company. On December 31, 2024 and 2023, the assets of the Plan were administered under a trust agreement with Mid-Atlantic Trust Company, and a Custodian agreement with Paychex Inc., (the "Custodian").

NOTE 5 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Registered investment companies (Mutual funds): Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. Mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and therefore classified at Level one.

Guaranteed investment contract: Fair value represents contract value adjusted to reflect current market interest rates only to the extent such market rates differ from crediting rates.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.
