NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following brief description of the Susquehanna Community Bank Profit Sharing Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more comprehensive description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering the employees of Susquehanna Community Bank (the “Bank”) who have attained the age of 18 and have completed a minimum 60-day service period beginning on the date of hire. Entry into the Plan is permitted the first day of the following month that the service requirement is completed. The Plan includes a 401(k) before-tax savings feature, and an after-tax Roth savings feature, which permits participants to defer compensation under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Financial Services Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan, which determines the Plan’s valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and custodians.

Contributions

The Plan permits eligible employees through a salary deferral election to have the Bank make annual contributions of up to 100 percent of eligible compensation, limited by the maximum amount permitted by the IRC, which was \$23,000 for 2024. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions up to an additional \$7,500 for 2024. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Bank provides a safe harbor matching contribution to meet certain nondiscrimination requirements. The safe harbor contribution matches employee contributions that do not exceed 3 percent of compensation for the Plan year plus another 50 percent of elective deferrals that exceed 3 percent of compensation for the Plan year, but do not exceed 5 percent of compensation. The Bank may also make a profit-sharing contribution to the Plan each year. To be eligible to receive the profit-sharing contribution, certain requirements, which are stated in the Plan document, must be satisfied. There were no profit-sharing contributions made to the Plan in 2024.

Participant Accounts

All contributions are directed by the participant into various investment options offered by the Plan. Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and the Bank’s discretionary matching contribution and an allocation of the Bank’s profit-sharing contribution (if applicable) and Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the vested balance in the participant’s account. The value of participant accounts will fluctuate with the fair values of the securities in which the accounts are invested.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

Vesting

A participant has, at all times, a vested and nonforfeitable right to the entire balance in his or her contribution, employer safe harbor matching contributions, and rollover contribution accounts. Each participant attains a vested and nonforfeitable right in the Bank's discretionary matching and profit-sharing contributions according to the following schedule.

Vesting in the Bank's safe harbor matching contributions is 100 percent at the time the contribution is made.

A participant becomes 100 percent vested in profit-sharing contributions upon death or disability.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000, up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate that is commensurate with prime rate plus 1.0 percent at time of origination. Principal and interest are paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Upon termination of service, participants whose accounts do not exceed \$5,000 will receive either a lump sum or rollover distribution in the amount equal to the value of their account. Participants whose vested account balance at the time of termination exceeds \$5,000 may receive either a lump sum, partial lump sum, or a rollover distribution. Distributions are available immediately for participants age 59 ½ or over.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures may be applied as additional Bank contributions, reductions of the Bank's contributions, or to pay administrative expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there was \$0 and \$23,232 in the forfeiture account, respectively. During 2024, forfeitures totaling \$49,063 were used to reduce employer contributions.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Net realized gains or losses on investment transactions represent the difference between proceeds received and cost.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. There were no excess contributions payable recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments. Expenses are recorded as incurred.

NOTE 3 – INVESTMENTS

The Plan’s investments are administered by Matrix Trust Company (the “Trustee”) under an agreement dated June 1, 2023.

The following is a summary of the investment information as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, included throughout the Plan’s financial statements and supplemental schedule, that was prepared by or derived from information provided by the Trustee and furnished to the Plan Administrator. The Plan Administrator has obtained certifications from the Trustee that information provided to the Plan Administrator by the Trustee related to the following investments is complete and accurate. Accordingly, as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor (DOL)’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan’s independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to information that appears throughout the financial statements and supplemental schedule, related to the following investments:

The Trustee also certified the completeness and accuracy of \$762,980 of net appreciation in fair value of investments, and \$514,062 of interest and dividends related to the aforementioned investments and participant loans, for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 4 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although they have not expressed any intent to do so, the Companies have the right, under the Plan, to discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination of the Plan, participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

NOTE 5 – TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed the Companies, by letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator and the Plan’s tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is exempt.

The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

NOTE 7 – RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Parties in interest are defined under the DOL regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the employer, and certain others. Participant loans held by the Plan reflect party-in-interest transactions as well as certain administrative functions that are performed by officers or employees of the Bank. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

The costs related to the operation of the Plan, that are party-in-interest transactions, include recordkeeping fees, Trustee fees, and loan administrative fees, and totaled \$30,389 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held 55,206 and 52,397 shares of Susquehanna Community Financial, Inc. common stock, respectively, which is the common stock of the Plan Sponsor and is, therefore, a party in interest. Dividends in the amount of \$38,344 were received on shares of this stock for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 8 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The following disclosures show the hierarchal disclosure framework associated with the level of pricing observations utilized in measuring assets and liabilities at fair value. The three broad levels of pricing observations are as follows:

- Level I: Quoted prices are available in active markets for identical assets or liabilities as of the reported date.
- Level II: Pricing inputs are other than the quoted prices in active markets, which are either directly or indirectly observable as of the reported date. The nature of these assets and liabilities includes items for which quoted prices are available but traded less frequently and items that are fair-valued using other financial instruments, the parameters of which can be directly observed.
- Level III: Valuations derived from valuation techniques in which one or more significant inputs or significant value drivers are unobservable.

This hierarchy requires the use of observable market data, when available.

(a) In accordance with Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification Topic 820, certain investments that were measured at net asset value (NAV) per unit (or its equivalent) have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The fair value amounts presented in this table are intended to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the line items presented in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Susquehanna Community Financial, Inc. Common Stock

The common stock is traded on OTC Pink under the symbol SQCF. If the stock is traded on the valuation date, then it is valued at the price at which shares were last traded.

Mutual Funds

Mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded, and these investments are classified as Level I.

NOTE 8 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

Exchange-Traded Funds

Exchange-traded funds (ETFs) hold a portfolio of stocks and trade throughout the day on stock exchanges. ETFs are valued based on their NAV, which depends on the prices of the positions that it holds. The ETF fair value is the price at which shares in the ETF can be bought or sold on the exchanges during trading hours. The NAV of an ETF represents the value of each share's portion of the fund's underlying assets and cash at the end of the trading day.

Collective Trust Funds

Common trusts are valued at the NAV of shares held by the Plan at year-end, adjusted for any cash held for liquidity purposes and any fees imposed by the fund. The NAV per unit is determined by dividing the net assets by the number of units outstanding on the day of valuation. In accordance with the terms of the Plan of Trust, the NAV of the fund is determined daily. Units are issued and redeemed daily, at the daily net asset value. Also, the net investment income and realized and unrealized gains on investment are not distributed.

Investments measured at NAV per share and excluded from the fair value hierarchy are collective trust accounts in the amounts of \$1,271,595 and \$622,812 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The fair value of these investments are measured using the NAV per share as a practical expedient. These investments can be redeemed daily and without any restrictions on the timing of the redemption. There are no unfunded commitments associated with these investments.

Money Market Fund

The money market mutual fund attempts to stabilize (NAV of its shares at \$1.00) by valuing its portfolio securities using the amortized cost method. A market-based NAV per share is calculated on a periodic basis. The fund does not guarantee that the NAV will always remain at \$1.00 per share. Shares can be redeemed on a same-day basis but only directly with the fund. Such transactions do not constitute an active market.

NOTE 9 – RISK AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had investments of \$706,637 and \$602,565, respectively, that were concentrated in Susquehanna Community Financial, Inc. common stock.

NOTE 10 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management has reviewed events occurring through August 4, 2025, and no subsequent events occurred requiring accrual or disclosure.
