## **INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT**

To the Trustee of  
Nussbaum Transportation Services Employee Stock Ownership Plan

### **Opinion**

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Nussbaum Transportation Services Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits of the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the changes in its net assets available for benefits for the years then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

### **Emphasis of Matter**

As discussed in Note 3, investments amounting to \$27,728,000 and \$29,592,000 and representing 99.83% and 98.40% of total assets as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, whose fair values, in the absence of readily ascertainable fair values, have been estimated by the trustee with the assistance of an independent third-party appraisal firm. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

### **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

### **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

## **Other Matter – Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA**

Our audits were conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the financial statements as a whole. The schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024 is presented for the purpose of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion, the information in the accompanying schedule is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the financial statements as a whole, and the form and content was presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

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**1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of Nussbaum Transportation Services Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is an employee stock ownership plan established on January 1, 2018 to allow employees to share in the ownership of In Motion Group, Inc. (the Company). The Plan is designed to qualify as a "stock bonus plan" under section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (IRC), as amended, and intended to be an employee stock ownership plan within the meaning of Section 4975(e)(7) of the IRC and Section 407(d)(6) of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Plan covers substantially all employees of Nussbaum Transportation Services who have completed one year of service (12 consecutive months with at least 1,000 working hours) and have reached 18 years of age. The trustee controls and manages the operations of the Plan. The trustee of the Plan is an independent third-party trust company.

The Plan is designed to invest primarily in the preferred stock of the Company.

The Plan holds the preferred stock in a trust established under the Plan.

The loan from the Company is secured by the unallocated shares purchased with the note. Accordingly, the financial statements for the plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, present separately the assets and liabilities and changes pertaining to (1) the accounts of employees with vested rights in allocated preferred stock (allocated) and (2) preferred stock not yet allocated to employees (unallocated). Shares are released from collateral and become allocated generally in the period in which debt services are actually paid.

During 2024 and 2023, the Plan allocated 54,638 and 55,830 shares, respectively, of Company preferred stock to eligible employees' accounts. As the Plan makes each payment of principal and interest, an appropriate percent of preferred stock is allocated to eligible employees' accounts in accordance with applicable regulations under the IRC.

The Plan was restated effective January 1, 2024 in order to comply with required legislative updates. There were no significant changes to the plan provisions as a result of the restatement.

Contributions

The Company is obligated to make non-elective contributions in cash to the Plan which, when aggregated, the Plan's dividends, contributions and interest earnings, equals the amount necessary to enable the Plan to make its regularly scheduled payments of principal and interest due on its loan payable. Contributions are subject to the limitations established by the IRC and are limited to the maximum allowable by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

There were no shares contributed in 2024 or 2023. Plan shares purchased with debt proceeds are held in suspense. As debt service payments are made by the Plan, shares are released from suspense and allocated to active participants.

Contributions are subject to certain limitations as mandated by the IRC. Contributions and forfeitures from the accounts of terminated participants are allocated to participants as of the end of the plan year.

The Plan does not allow for voluntary contributions by employees.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited as of the last day of each plan year with an allocation of (a) shares of the Company's preferred stock released by the trustee from the unallocated account, (b) any Company dividends, (c) Plan earnings (losses), and (d) forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts and charged with the participant's benefit payments. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the Company as of the last day of the plan year will receive an allocation. Allocations are generally based on a participant's eligible compensation, relative to total eligible compensation, and a participant's number of shares held, relative to the total number of shares. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants are credited annually with Company contributions and trust income (losses). Vesting in Company non-elective contributions and trust income (losses) is based on the following table:

Payment of Benefits

Generally, payment of a participant's vested account balance occurs after normal retirement (age 65 or older), death, or disability. Participants eligible to receive benefits receive the distribution in a single lump sum or in annual installments as described in the Plan document. The amount to be distributed is based upon the immediately preceding valuation date. Distributions are made in cash. If separated from service prior to retirement, death, or disability, distributions are taken in cash as a lump sum or over a period of time determined by the size of the vested balance.

For normal retirement, disability, and death distributions, payments will be made as soon as possible after the close of the Plan year in which the employee retires, becomes disabled, or becomes deceased. A participant who terminates employment whose account balance is less than \$7,000 will receive a lump sum cash distribution of their vested aggregate account balance, without the consent of the employee, after the close of the Plan year in which the employee terminates. A participant who terminates employment whose account balance is greater than \$7,000 may receive a lump sum cash distribution of their vested aggregate account balance two years after the close of the Plan year in which the employee terminates.

Voting Rights

Each participant is entitled to exercise voting rights attributable to the shares allocated to their account with regard to the approval or disapproval of any corporate merger or consolidation, recapitalization, reclassification, liquidation, dissolution, sale of substantially all assets, or such similar transactions as the Secretary of Treasury may prescribe in regulations. The trustee is not permitted to vote any allocated share for which a participant has not given instructions. The trustee is required to vote any unallocated shares on behalf of the collective best interests of plan participants and beneficiaries.

Put Option

Under federal income tax regulations, the employer preferred stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand, under certain circumstances, that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the current value of the stock.

The Company can pay for the purchase in a lump sum within 30 days of the put option being exercised. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

Diversification

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company preferred stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least 10 years of participation in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a 6-year period. In each of the first 5 years, a participant may diversify up to 25 percent of the number of post-1986 shares allocated to his or her account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth year, the percentage changes to 50 percent.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures for participants who terminate will be allocated after the expiration of a five-year period during which the forfeiture balances are reinstated if the participants are rehired or subsequent to the terminated participant receiving a full distribution from the Plan, whichever is earlier. Forfeitures allocated were \$263,872 and \$439,669 in 2024 and 2023, respectively.

**2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Cash

Cash is defined as currency on hand, in demand deposits.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements is in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP) and requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's trustee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and custodians.

The investment in the Company's preferred stock is valued as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 at \$27,728,000 (\$34.66 per share) and \$29,592,000 (\$36.99 per share), respectively, based upon an appraisal performed by an independent valuation firm, and approved by the Plan's trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis and dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Dividends

When declared, dividends may be used to repay any ESOP loan taken out by the trustee to finance the purchase of Company preferred stock or paid directly in cash by the trustee to the participants in proportion to the amounts of Company preferred stock allocated to their accounts as of the record date of the dividends. Dividends allocated were \$693,525 and \$593,031 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Administration of Plan Assets

The Plan assets, which consist principally of the Company's preferred stock, are held by the trustee of the Plan.

Company non-elective contributions are held and managed by the trustee, who invests cash received, interest, and dividend income and makes distributions to participants. The trustee also administers the payment of interest and principal on the loan, which was reimbursed to the Plan through contributions, as determined by the Company.

Administrative expenses are paid directly by the Company.

Recent Accounting and Regulatory Pronouncements

The SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 was signed into law on December 29, 2022. This legislation includes a vast array of provisional changes to retirement plans, becoming effective in 2023 and beyond. Plan management adopted mandatory provisions effective for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Plan management continues to evaluate the impact of the optional provisions of SECURE 2.0 and awaiting additional regulatory guidance from the IRS and Department of Labor (DOL). The application of SECURE 2.0 Act did not have a material effect on the Plan's financial statements for the plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan will be amended to reflect any changes made in response to SECURE 2.0 prior to the deadline set by law or applicable regulations.

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**4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- a. Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets,
- b. Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets,
- c. Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability,
- d. Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full-term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Preferred stock:* The fair value of the In Motion Group, Inc. preferred stock held by the Plan is valued at estimated fair value based upon an independent appraisal as of the last day of each annual reporting period. This appraisal was based upon the income and market approaches. The income approach establishes value by capitalizing future anticipated benefits, such as income or cash flow, by a discount or capitalization rate that reflects rates of return in public markets, incorporating expectations and conditions in the market, as well as specific investment risk in the subject company. The market approach determines value by comparing the Company to similar businesses, business interests, or securities that are for sale or have been sold. The results of these two valuation approaches were considered as a whole. The appraiser took into account estimated fair value of Company assets and liabilities along with a non-marketability discount of 5 percent for each of the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Plan management accumulates the data as requested by its independent financial advisor from the audited financial statements of the Company. The trustee's independent advisor prepares a preliminary report which the trustee reviews in detail, discuss, and approve. The results of this process are documented by the trustee.

Those policies and procedures are reassessed at least annually to determine if the current valuation techniques are still appropriate. At that time, the unobservable inputs used in the fair value measurements are evaluated and adjusted, as necessary, based on the current market conditions and other third-party information.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**5. LOANS PAYABLE**

In 2018, the Plan entered into a \$18,000,000 term loan agreement with the Company. The proceeds of the loan were used to purchase Company preferred stock. The term loan is secured by the unallocated shares purchased with the original proceeds from the loan. The agreement provides for the loan to be repaid over 15 years due in annual principal and interest payments of \$1,200,000 through December 31, 2032 and bearing interest at a rate of 2.66%. The balance of the loan payable was \$8,686,452 and \$9,886,452 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

**6. PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions. Any unallocated assets of the Plan shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Company may determine.

**7. TAX STATUS**

Prior to 2024, the IRS determined and informed the Company by letter dated December 20, 2018, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Effective January 1, 2024, the Company adopted a non-standardized pre-approved plan document which received an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 in which the IRS stated that the non-standardized pre-approved plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since adopting the non-standardized pre-approved plan document; however, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC.

US GAAP requires management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

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**8. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Plan investments as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 were held by the Company. As all investments are held in custody by this party, which also represents the issuer and manager of the corresponding investments that they hold, all investments and transactions thereof are considered related party transactions. Employees of the Company provide administrative services to the Plan for which no fees are charged.

**9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in Company stock. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**10. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through August 12, 2025, which was the date that these financial statements were available for issuance and noted the following subsequent events:

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was amended and as a result, the following plan provision was added:

- Participants who attain normal retirement (age 65 with 5 years of vesting service) can request an in-service distribution of their vested account balance from the Plan. The stock value of the most recent valuation date is used.

On February 9, 2025, the Plan's investment in the preferred shares of In Motion Group, Inc. automatically converted to common stock. Common stock does not earn priority dividends and holds similar voting rights as preferred shares.
