Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

Basis for Opinion

Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Southworth Development LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan & Trust (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Summary Plan Description and the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan, established January 15, 2008 and most recently restated effective December 19, 2023, is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Southworth Development LLC and participating affiliates (the Company). All employees age 21 and older are eligible to participate unless they are covered by a collective bargaining agreement. Eligible employees can participate the month following the completion of six months of service effective December 19, 2023 (previously one year of service or 1,000 hours of service). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Effective December 19, 2023, the Plan changed trustee and recordkeeper from Mid Atlantic Trust Company and Paychex Retirement Services to Fidelity Management Trust Company, the new Plan trustee and Fidelity Workplace Services, LLC, the new Plan recordkeeper.

Each year, participants may contribute from 1% to 92% of their respective pretax annual compensation, subject to limitations established by the Internal Revenue Service. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Plan also permits Roth elective deferrals. Roth elective deferrals shall be treated in the same manner as participant elective deferrals, except that Roth elective deferrals are not "pre-tax" deferrals as defined in the Code.

The Company provides a safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of each participant's deferred compensation up to 4%. The Company may also make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution. No discretionary matching contributions or non-elective contributions were made for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

1. Description of Plan (continued)

Participants Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, allocations of the Company's contribution, plan earnings (losses), and charged with applicable loan and/or withdrawal charges. Allocations are based on participant salary deferrals or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are always vested in their elective deferrals, safe harbor matching contributions and rollovers, plus actual earnings thereon.

Vesting in the Company's discretionary profit-sharing contributions, if any, plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 20% vested with less than one year of credited service, 40% after one year, 60% after two years, 80% after three years, and is 100% vested after the completion of four years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$500, up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms must not exceed five years unless for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate of prime plus 1%. Participants are allowed two outstanding loans at any time. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon separation of employment due to termination, death, disability or retirement, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum amount. Prior to termination of employment, a participant can withdraw their deferred compensation balance in the event of certain hardship circumstances or upon reaching 59 1/2 years of age.

Forfeited Accounts

Participants who leave the employment of the Company forfeit the non-vested portion of their accounts. Forfeitures are used to offset future Company contributions to the Plan. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures available totaled \$9,771 and \$-0-, respectively. Forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions or pay plan expenses during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 amounted to \$37 and \$-0-, respectively.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (an exit price). See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition (continued)

Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for the management of investments are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, certain management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when it is earned. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Administrative Expenses

Effective December 19, 2023, the Plan entered into fixed basis point pricing with Fidelity Workplace Services, LLC. The fees related to recordkeeping services are fixed at 16 basis points and subject to certain offsets as described in the service agreement. These fees are billed to participant accounts quarterly. The recordkeeping fee for the year ended December 31, 2024 was \$14,977.

Any revenue generated from the various mutual fund investments above this amount is transferred to a suspense account (ERISA Budget Account). This account can be used to cover plan expenses, such as auditing, legal and consultant fees. These amounts are not available to reduce Company contributions. The amounts available in the ERISA Budget account at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$861 and \$-0-, respectively. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$-0- and \$-0-, respectively, was used from the ERISA Budget account to offset plan expenses.

Administrative Expenses (continued)

The Plan received a revenue credit of \$847 and \$-0- for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Plan Sponsor may direct the recordkeeper to reimburse the Plan Sponsor for fees and expenses associated with services provided to the Plan and/or the amount may be allocated to participant accounts. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the revenue credit amount allocated to plan participant accounts was \$376 and \$-0-, respectively.

In addition, an annual per participant fee of 25 basis points is deducted from participant accounts, on a quarterly basis, for expenses associated with the Plan's investment advisor. The investment advisor fee for the year ended December 31, 2024 was \$18,453.

Certain other administrative expenses such as participant loan processing fees and other participant specific fees are deducted directly from participant accounts. Participant specific fees of \$1,777 were charged to participant accounts for the years ended December 31, 2024.

The Plan's expenses are paid either by the Plan or the Company, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid directly by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

3. Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of mutual funds, interest, dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and the period December 19, 2023 through December 31, 2024 and Mid Atlantic Trust Company, the custodian of the Plan for the period January 1, 2023 through December 18, 2023.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The fair value framework establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The fair value hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below.

Level 1 – Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible to the reporting entity at the measurement date for identical assets and liabilities.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities that are observable either directly or indirectly for substantially the full term of the asset or liability. Level 2 inputs include the following:

- Quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active
- Observable inputs other than quoted prices that are used in the valuation of the asset or liabilities (e.g., interest rate and yield curve quotes at commonly quoted intervals)
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Unobservable inputs for the asset or liability (i.e., supported by little or no market activity). Level 3 inputs include management’s own assumption about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability (including assumptions about risk).

The level in the fair value hierarchy within which the fair value measurement is classified is determined based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measure in its entirety.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used by the Plan. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds are valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective investment trust (Reliance MetLife) is valued at the net asset value provided by Reliance Trust. The net asset value is quoted on a private market that is not active; however, the unit price is based on underlying investments which are traded on an active market. Redemptions are processed daily. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. There are no unfunded commitments. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Withdrawals directed by a Plan Sponsor must be preceded by a 60-day written notice to the Trustee; provided, however, that the Trustee may, in its discretion complete any such plan-level withdrawals before the expiration of such 60-day period. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk, contract issues or restrictions.

The valuation methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while plan management believes the valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

6. Income Tax Status

Effective December 19, 2023, the Plan has adopted the non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan of Fidelity Management & Research LLC. The non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan sponsor received an advisory letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020 in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the form of the non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (Code). The plan administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

6. Income Tax Status (continued)

The Plan had adopted through December 19, 2023, the non-standardized pre-approved profit-sharing plan of Paychex, Inc. The non-standardized pre-approved profit-sharing plan sponsor received an advisory letter from the IRS dated August 31, 2020 in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the form of the non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (Code). The plan administrator believes the Plan in 2023 was being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan was qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting standards require recording uncertain income tax positions that exist in the Plan's financial statements. Plan management has determined there are no uncertain tax positions and believes there is no adjustment or disclosure required in the Plan's financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. Parties-In-Interest

Section 3(14) of ERISA defines a party-in-interest to include, among others, fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan or an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan. Accordingly, notes receivable from participants and the management of investments held by the trustee and custodian are considered party-in-interest transactions.

8. Subsequent Events

The Company has evaluated all subsequent events through August 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. During this period, there have been no material events that would require recognition in the financial statements or disclosures to the financial statements.
