Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Consumer Product Testing Co., Inc. 401(K) Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). - The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Consumer Product Testing Co., Inc. 401(K) Profit Sharing Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. The information included in the supplemental schedules - modified cash basis, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules - modified cash basis that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

1. Description of Plan

The following description of Consumer Product Testing Co., Inc. 401(K) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established effective March 1, 1994, as restated April 19, 2021. The Plan covers all employees, excluding union, certain nonresident aliens, and leased employees, of Consumer Product Testing Co., Inc. (the "Company") who have completed 6 months of service and are age 21 or older. Furthermore, participants employed on the last day of the Plan year and terminated employees who have completed at least 500 hours of service during the plan year are eligible for matching and profit sharing contributions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA").

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a percentage of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan document, for up to the maximum limits of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Participants also may designate all or a portion of their deferral contributions as after-tax contributions into a Roth account. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants also may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans ("rollover"). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company may also make additional matching and profit sharing contributions to the Plan at the sole discretion of its Board of Directors. For the year ended October 31, 2024, the Company made a matching contribution equal to 25 percent of total employee deferrals (traditional and Roth) contributed during the year for eligible participants. Profit sharing contributions, if made, will be allocated in the same dollar amount for each qualifying participant. For the year ended October 31, 2024, there were no profit sharing contributions remitted to the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Company matching contributions, allocations of the Company's profit sharing contributions, and an allocation of the Plan's earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and the Company's contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate, determined at the time of the loan, is based on the prevailing interest rates charged by persons in the business of lending money for loans which would be made under similar circumstances. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Terms range up to five years or greater for the purchase of a primary residence. As of October 31, 2024 and 2023, the interest rates on the outstanding loans ranged from 4.25% to 9.50%.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest, or portion thereof, in his or her account. If a terminated participant's vested balance is less than or equal to \$5,000, the amount may be automatically distributed in the form of a lump sum cash payment or rolled over to an individual retirement plan. The Plan allows in-service withdrawals for participants reaching 59.5 years of age, and other qualified distributions. In addition, the Plan allows for hardship distributions if certain criteria are met.

Forfeited Accounts

As of October 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$195 and \$4, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or in payment of administrative expenses. During the year ended October 31, 2024, no forfeitures were used to reduce employer contributions and for administrative expenses.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Accordingly, additions are included in the year in which they are collected and deductions are included in the year in which they are disbursed; however, earnings on investments include adjustments to fair value.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Company's management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Plan's investment advisers. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on the settlement date under the modified cash basis of accounting. Interest and dividend income are recorded on the cash basis. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Interest income is recorded on the cash basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are paid.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these modified cash basis financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments and are not readily determinable.

Subsequent Events

The Plan's management evaluated events that occurred after October 31, 2024 through August 14, 2025, the date when the financial statements were available to be issued. Based on that evaluation, the Plan's management has determined that no subsequent events have occurred which would require disclosure in the financial statements.

3. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation technique are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation technique include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation technique are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation techniques used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the techniques used as of October 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts: Included in the self-directed brokerage accounts are common stock and interest bearing cash. Such investments are valued at quoted market prices in active markets at year-end.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its evaluation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by the trustee, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of the investment.

Additionally, the Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the participants' account balances. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Certain administrative functions of the Plan are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

5. Information Certified by Trustee

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA for the years ended October 31, 2024 and 2023. Accordingly, Fidelity Management Trust Company, the Trustee of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and notes receivable from participants reported in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits - modified cash basis as of October 31, 2024 and 2023, and the supplemental Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4(i) - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) - modified cash basis as of October 31, 2024, and the related investment activity and interest income on notes receivable from participants reported in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits - modified cash basis for the year ended October 31, 2024.

6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

7. Tax Status

The Plan adopted a pre-approved plan offered by Fidelity Management Trust Company. The pre-approved plan received an IRS Opinion Letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the IRS Opinion Letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Plan management is required to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits - modified cash basis. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, three investments represented a concentration of greater than 10% of the Plan's net assets available for benefits.

9. Delinquent Participant Contributions

For the years ended October 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company did not remit certain participant contributions to the Plan on a timely basis as defined by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Untimely remittances identified on the Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4a - Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions - Modified Cash Basis, which totaled \$144,278, were corrected outside of the Department of Labor Voluntary Fiduciary Correction Program subsequent to year end. Untimely remittances of \$82,682 were identified on the Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions in a prior year and were not corrected prior to November 1, 2023. The prior year untimely remittances were corrected outside of the Department of Labor Voluntary Fiduciary Correction Program in 2024. Additionally, the Company will be compensating participants for lost earnings resulting from the delay in contributions.
