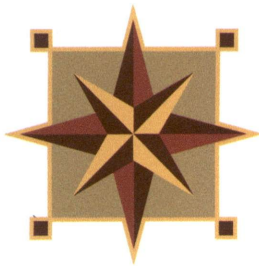

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of the Veridiam, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). 

Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following description of the Veridiam, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Veridiam, Inc. (the “Company”). Individuals are eligible to participate after meeting the eligibility requirements. Effective January 1, 2022 the Plan was amended to require participants to complete a two month service requirement and be twenty-one or older to participate. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 75% of pretax annual compensation up to the maximum amount allowed by the IRS, including catch-up contributions for participants aged 50 or older, as defined in the Plan. Effective January 1, 2016, the Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at four (4) percent of eligible compensation with a rate escalator of two (2) percent until a maximum of eight (8) percent is reached or until changed by the participant. Participants may also make discretionary after-tax contributions and contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans, subject to the rules of the Plan. The Company has the option of making discretionary matching and or profit-sharing contributions. The Company is not required to make these contributions. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participants' Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocations of (a) the Company’s contribution(s) and, (b) Plan earnings or losses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in all contributions, including any discretionary Company contributions, plus actual earnings thereon.

Forfeited Accounts

Because participants are immediately vested in all contributions, including any discretionary Company contributions, there are no forfeitures. Therefore, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$0 and \$0, respectively.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or fifty (50) percent of their vested interest. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer to (from) the investment fund from (to) the Participant Notes fund. Loan terms range to a maximum of five (5) years (the term may be extended for acquisition of a principal residence); however, the term of any loan may not extend beyond the participant’s normal retirement date, as defined in the Plan. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with regional bank notes for similar loans. Principal and interest are paid ratably through weekly payroll deductions. Interest rates range from 4.5% to 9.5%.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant may receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Participants may receive a lump sum distribution from their rollover accounts at any time.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Common/Collective Trusts

The Plan has investments in various T Rowe Price Retirement Funds which are common/collective trusts. Common collective trust funds are comprised of shares or units in commingled funds that are not publicly traded. The underlying assets in these funds are primarily publicly traded equity securities, fixed income securities, and commodity related securities and are valued at their NAV, as a practical expedient, that is calculated by the investment manager or sponsor of the fund and have varying liquidity, redemption period notices and other restrictions. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the Plan will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

Investment Contract with Insurance Company

The Plan invests in the Voya Fixed Funds which are fully benefit responsive investment contracts. Contributions are maintained in the insurance company's general account. The funds primary investment objectives are to preserve principal, maintain a competitive interest rate, and provide daily liquidity at contract value for plan-permitted, participant-directed withdrawals. Contract value is generally equal to the principal amounts invested in the underlying investments, plus interest accrued at a crediting rate established under the contract, less any adjustment for withdrawals. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits presents the contract value of the investment contracts. The Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits is prepared on a contract value basis.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 6 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net gain on investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Operating Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company.

Note 3 - Funding Policy

Participating employees may make elective contributions to the Plan, pursuant to Internal Revenue Code Section 401(k). Employer matching and profit-sharing contributions are discretionary. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the matching contributions paid by the employer were \$349,181. No Company profit sharing contributions were made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 4 - Information Certified by Plan's Trustee

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's rules and regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the following investment information was certified by Voya Institutional Trust Company as complete and accurate and was not subjected to any auditing procedures performed by the independent public accountants:

Note 5 - Investments

The Plan's investments are (were) administered by Voya Institutional Trust Company and held in a trust fund.

During 2024, the Plan's investments (including gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year) appreciated in value by \$1,335,096.

Note 6 - Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under US GAAP are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlations or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Registered Investment Companies (Mutual Funds): Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Common Collective Trusts: Reported at fair value using the net value (“NAV”) of shares held by the Plan at year end and not classified in the fair value hierarchy in accordance with ASC subtopic 820-10. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liability. The practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchased and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that the securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The objectives of the Common Collective Trusts are to provide a proper mix of investments that target various retirement ages based upon when the participant plans to retire. These are also known as “LifeStyle” or “LifeCycle Funds”. They invest in a combination of assets that attempt to achieve the best result based upon risk tolerance and length of time to the investment goal.

Note 7 – Investment Contract with Insurance Company

The Plan invests in Voya Fixed Funds which are fully benefit responsive investment contracts. Contributions are maintained in the insurance company’s general account. The funds primary investment objectives are to preserve principal, maintain a competitive interest rate, and provide daily liquidity at contract value for plan-permitted, participant-directed withdrawals. Contract value is generally equal to the principal amounts invested in the underlying investments, plus interest accrued at a crediting rate established under the contract, less any adjustment for withdrawals.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon by the issuer. For contracts entered into and funded prior to June 15, 2017, the rate is guaranteed to not be less than 3%. For all other contracts the fund the rate is guaranteed to not be less than 1.0%. The investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. However, certain events may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to plan’s prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestures or spin-offs of a subsidiary), (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974.

At December 31, 2024, the Plan Sponsor believes the occurrence of an event that would limit the ability of the fixed funds to transact at contract value with the participants in the funds is not probable.

Note 8 – Excess Contribution Refundable

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, payables of \$6,370 and \$0, respectively, are recorded for amounts refundable, as a result of failing the average deferral percentage test, by the Plan to participants for contributions made in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service.

Note 9 – Party-in-Interest and Related Party Transactions

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds and investment contracts with insurance company managed by Voya Institutional Trust Company. Voya is the asset custodian, as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Participant notes receivable qualify as party-in-interest transactions as identified on Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year).

The Company provides certain accounting and administrative services to the Plan for which no fees are charged. The Company also pays for certain recordkeeping fees for the Plan.

Note 10 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

Note 11 - Tax Status

The Company adopted a Prototype Standardized Profit Sharing 401(k) Plan with a cash or deferral arrangement which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) on June 30, 2020. The favorable opinion letter stated that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 12 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

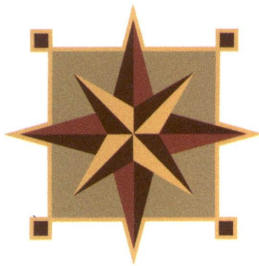

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of the Veridiam, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audit and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Veridiam, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.



Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following description of the Veridiam, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Veridiam, Inc. (the “Company”). Individuals are eligible to participate after meeting the eligibility requirements. Effective January 1, 2022 the Plan was amended to require participants to complete a two month service requirement and be twenty-one or older to participate. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 75% of pretax annual compensation up to the maximum amount allowed by the IRS, including catch-up contributions for participants aged 50 or older, as defined in the Plan. Effective January 1, 2016, the Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at four (4) percent of eligible compensation with a rate escalator of two (2) percent until a maximum of eight (8) percent is reached or until changed by the participant. Participants may also make discretionary after-tax contributions and contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans, subject to the rules of the Plan. The Company has the option of making discretionary matching and or profit-sharing contributions. The Company is not required to make these contributions. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participants' Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocations of (a) the Company’s contribution(s) and, (b) Plan earnings or losses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in all contributions, including any discretionary Company contributions, plus actual earnings thereon.

Forfeited Accounts

Because participants are immediately vested in all contributions, including any discretionary Company contributions, there are no forfeitures. Therefore, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$0 and \$0, respectively.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or fifty (50) percent of their vested interest. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer to (from) the investment fund from (to) the Participant Notes fund. Loan terms range to a maximum of five (5) years (the term may be extended for acquisition of a principal residence); however, the term of any loan may not extend beyond the participant’s normal retirement date, as defined in the Plan. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with regional bank notes for similar loans. Principal and interest are paid ratably through weekly payroll deductions. Interest rates range from 4.5% to 9.5%.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant may receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Participants may receive a lump sum distribution from their rollover accounts at any time.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Common/Collective Trusts

The Plan has investments in various T Rowe Price Retirement Funds which are common/collective trusts. Common collective trust funds are comprised of shares or units in commingled funds that are not publicly traded. The underlying assets in these funds are primarily publicly traded equity securities, fixed income securities, and commodity related securities and are valued at their NAV, as a practical expedient, that is calculated by the investment manager or sponsor of the fund and have varying liquidity, redemption period notices and other restrictions. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the Plan will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

Investment Contract with Insurance Company

The Plan invests in the Voya Fixed Funds which are fully benefit responsive investment contracts. Contributions are maintained in the insurance company's general account. The funds primary investment objectives are to preserve principal, maintain a competitive interest rate, and provide daily liquidity at contract value for plan-permitted, participant-directed withdrawals. Contract value is generally equal to the principal amounts invested in the underlying investments, plus interest accrued at a crediting rate established under the contract, less any adjustment for withdrawals. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits presents the contract value of the investment contracts. The Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits is prepared on a contract value basis.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 6 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net gain on investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Operating Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company.

Note 3 - Funding Policy

Participating employees may make elective contributions to the Plan, pursuant to Internal Revenue Code Section 401(k). Employer matching and profit-sharing contributions are discretionary. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the matching contributions paid by the employer were \$349,181. No Company profit sharing contributions were made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 4 - Information Certified by Plan's Trustee

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's rules and regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the following investment information was certified by Voya Institutional Trust Company as complete and accurate and was not subjected to any auditing procedures performed by the independent public accountants:

Note 5 - Investments

The Plan's investments are (were) administered by Voya Institutional Trust Company and held in a trust fund.

During 2024, the Plan's investments (including gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year) appreciated in value by \$1,335,096.

Note 6 - Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under US GAAP are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlations or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Registered Investment Companies (Mutual Funds): Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Common Collective Trusts: Reported at fair value using the net value (“NAV”) of shares held by the Plan at year end and not classified in the fair value hierarchy in accordance with ASC subtopic 820-10. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liability. The practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchased and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that the securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

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The objectives of the Common Collective Trusts are to provide a proper mix of investments that target various retirement ages based upon when the participant plans to retire. These are also known as “LifeStyle” or “LifeCycle Funds”. They invest in a combination of assets that attempt to achieve the best result based upon risk tolerance and length of time to the investment goal.

Note 7 – Investment Contract with Insurance Company

The Plan invests in Voya Fixed Funds which are fully benefit responsive investment contracts. Contributions are maintained in the insurance company’s general account. The funds primary investment objectives are to preserve principal, maintain a competitive interest rate, and provide daily liquidity at contract value for plan-permitted, participant-directed withdrawals. Contract value is generally equal to the principal amounts invested in the underlying investments, plus interest accrued at a crediting rate established under the contract, less any adjustment for withdrawals.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon by the issuer. For contracts entered into and funded prior to June 15, 2017, the rate is guaranteed to not be less than 3%. For all other contracts the fund the rate is guaranteed to not be less than 1.0%. The investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. However, certain events may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to plan’s prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestures or spin-offs of a subsidiary), (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974.

At December 31, 2024, the Plan Sponsor believes the occurrence of an event that would limit the ability of the fixed funds to transact at contract value with the participants in the funds is not probable.

Note 8 – Excess Contribution Refundable

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, payables of \$6,370 and \$0, respectively, are recorded for amounts refundable, as a result of failing the average deferral percentage test, by the Plan to participants for contributions made in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service.

Note 9 – Party-in-Interest and Related Party Transactions

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds and investment contracts with insurance company managed by Voya Institutional Trust Company. Voya is the asset custodian, as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Participant notes receivable qualify as party-in-interest transactions as identified on Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year).

The Company provides certain accounting and administrative services to the Plan for which no fees are charged. The Company also pays for certain recordkeeping fees for the Plan.

Note 10 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

Note 11 - Tax Status

The Company adopted a Prototype Standardized Profit Sharing 401(k) Plan with a cash or deferral arrangement which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) on June 30, 2020. The favorable opinion letter stated that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 12 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits.
