### Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

#### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Sperry Rail, Inc. Savings and Investment Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Sperry Rail, Inc. Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

#### **Opinion**

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

***Basis for Opinion***

**NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the Sperry Rail, Inc. Savings and Investment Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established to provide retirement benefits for eligible employees of Sperry Rail, Inc. (the Company). Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan upon attaining 90 days of credited service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of ERISA.

**Contributions**

Participants may contribute between 1% and 100% of compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans (rollovers). The Company may make a discretionary matching contribution. The discretionary matching contribution was 60% of each participant's elective deferral contribution up to 6% of compensation for the year ended December 31, 2024. All contributions are subject to certain limitations imposed by the Plan and the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company contributions, and allocations of Plan earnings and losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations of Company contributions, investment income (loss), and administrative expenses are based on participants' compensation or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested accounts.

**Investment Options**

Participants may direct their contributions into any of the funds offered by the Plan, which are held at State Street Bank and Trust Company (State Street) or Transamerica Life Insurance Company (Transamerica). These funds include a variety of investment options with various objectives and degrees of financial risk.

**Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their deferral and rollover contributions, including the earnings on those amounts. Vesting in the Company contributions portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. Participants are fully vested in employer contributions upon the completion of four years of service. Participants are also fully vested upon reaching normal retirement age, death or total disability.

**NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)**

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or one-half of their vested account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years and are secured by the balance in the participants' accounts. The loans bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates, which is equal to the Prime Rate plus 1%. The notes currently bear interest at rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%. Participants may only have one loan outstanding at any given time. Generally, principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

**Payment of Benefits**

The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's account. Upon termination of service, death, disability, or reaching normal retirement age, the participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account in various forms of payment, as described in the Plan document. In addition, the Plan also allows for in-service distributions of rollover accounts, or if a participant reaches age 59½ or under certain hardship circumstances. The Plan also provides for automatic cash-out and/or rollover distributions into an individual retirement account for terminated participants whose balance does not exceed certain limits as prescribed by the Plan document and IRC.

**Forfeitures**

Forfeitures of discretionary matching contributions are used to reduce the Company's future matching contributions or to pay eligible Plan expenses. Forfeited nonvested discretionary matching accounts totaled \$23,626 and \$248 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, Company matching contributions were reduced by \$248 from forfeited nonvested discretionary matching accounts and \$7,686 in forfeitures were used to offset Plan expenses.

**ERISA Budget Account**

The Plan holds assets in a plan expense account which is used to pay qualified Plan expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024, deposits to the account totaled \$46,707. For the year ended December 31, 2024, funds from this account totaling \$41,173 were used to pay Plan expenses. The ERISA budget account had a balance of \$14,040 and \$8,226 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

**NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on the trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded on the accrual basis. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

**Payment of Benefits**

Benefits to participants are recorded when paid.

**Plan Expenses**

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company. Expenses paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and distributions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

**Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan provides for various investment options. These investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and those changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**Subsequent Events**

Subsequent events were evaluated through August 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**NOTE 3 CERTIFICATION BY THE QUALIFIED INSTITUTIONS**

Information presented in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefit as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024 and supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, for investments, notes receivable from participants, investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants was derived from information certified to be complete and accurate by State Street Bank and Trust Company (State Street) or Transamerica Life Insurance Company, the qualified institutions of the Plan, as permitted by the election made by the Plan administrator under 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

**NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America establish a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

*Level 1* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

*Level 2* – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

*Level 3* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

**NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS (CONTINUED)**

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. Assets valued using the net asset value (NAV) practical expedient are not required to be reported within the hierarchy.

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value:

*Money Market and Mutual Funds:* Money market and mutual funds are valued at the quoted price of shares held by the Plan at year-end.

*Common and Collective Trust:* The common and collective trust is valued at the NAV of the units held of the collective trust. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund, less liabilities. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Investments in the common and collective trust provide for daily liquidity and have no redemption features or other restrictions.

There were no transfers between levels of investments during the year ended December 31, 2024.

**NOTE 5 GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACT**

During 2022, the Plan entered into a benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Transamerica. Transamerica maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Transamerica is contractually obligated to repay the principal and specified interest rates that are guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for the guaranteed investment contract.

The guaranteed investment contract is presented on the face of the statements of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by TransAmerica, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investments at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The contract is a traditional investment contract. The contract value of the investment contract at December 31, 2024 and 2023, was \$3,129,587 and \$2,807,160 respectively.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with Transamerica. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

**NOTE 6 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Certain plan investments are managed by State Street and Transamerica, or their affiliates. State Street and Transamerica are qualified institutions of the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Other parties-in-interest include professional service firms who provide services to the Plan. Certain employees of the Company who participate in the Plan perform administrative services to the Plan at no cost to the Plan. Notes receivable from participants are also party-in-interest transactions.

**NOTE 7 INCOME TAX STATUS**

The Plan has adopted a preapproved plan document that received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) that it was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan administrator believes the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax exempt as of the financial statement date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**NOTE 8 PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their accounts.
