NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Martin 401(K) Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

GENERAL

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering full-time employees of Martin Resource Management Corporation (the Company) and its subsidiaries and affiliates. Employees are eligible to participate in the plan regardless of age or service requirements. Effective April 1, 2021, the Plan was amended to adopt an automatic enrollment feature for all newly eligible employees. Newly eligible employees, unless they elect not to participate, will be automatically enrolled in the plan, and have pre-tax contributions withheld and remitted to the plan at five percent of compensation. Plan entry dates are the date of hire for each employee. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Securities Act of 1974 (ERISA).

PLAN ADMINISTRATION

The trustee of the Plan, Fidelity Management Trust Company, is responsible for managing the Plan's investment assets. Fidelity Management Trust Company also performs the Plan's administrative duties such as preparation of the Form 5500, participant recordkeeping, compliance testing and enrollment and transaction processing. Employees of the Company may perform certain other administrative functions; however, such employees receive no compensation from the Plan.

CONTRIBUTIONS

Participants may elect to contribute up to 30% in whole percentages of their pretax annual compensation, not to exceed the limit of Code Section 401(k), which is \$23,000 in 2024 and \$22,500 in 2023, of their annual wages including overtime (\$30,500 for participants who attain age 50 by the end of the Plan year). Through September 30, 2016 the Company made matching contributions based on the Safe Harbor Matching formula which is 100% of applicable contributions up to the first 3% of compensation, plus 50% of applicable contributions up to the next 2% of compensation. As of January 1, 2022, the plan was amended to change its matching contribution rate to 100% of the first 3% of participants deferred compensation, for participants not covered under a collective bargaining agreement. The amendment does not affect collectively bargained employees who receive the safe harbor matching. For 2024 and 2023, compensation is limited to \$345,000 and \$330,000, respectively, for determining employer contributions. In addition, the employer may also make a discretionary, non-elective contribution on behalf of active participants. These discretionary, non-elective contributions, if any, shall be allocated to active participants based on compensation. Combined employer contributions and employee deferrals per employee for all employer sponsored defined contribution plans are limited to 100% of wages up to \$69,000 and \$66,000 for 2024 and 2023, respectively.

PARTICIPANT ACCOUNTS

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, an allocation of the Company's contribution and Plan earnings. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

INVESTMENT OPTIONS

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct employee contributions and employer matching and discretionary contributions to any options provided by Fidelity Management Trust Company. One of the investment options offered through Fidelity is the Fidelity Brokerage Link Account, which enables a participant to invest in individual common stocks, preferred stocks, mutual funds, corporate bonds, Fidelity funds, and short-term investments as stipulated in the Plan document. The Plan does not guarantee any rates of return or investment results.

VESTING

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Under the Safe Harbor Matching Formula, employer matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon are also 100% vested. In the event the Company makes a discretionary, non-elective contribution on behalf of active participants, vesting in the contribution plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service as follows:

Full vesting also occurs at retirement (normal retirement age is sixty-five years), disability or death.

Effective January 1, 2017, the plan was amended to provide for vesting on matching contributions for participants first employed after January 1, 2017 and to follow the same schedule as discretionary, non-elective contributions.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of 50% of the participant's account balance or \$50,000. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loans bear interest rates ranging from 4.25% - 9.50%. Repayment of loans is required to be made through payroll deductions. Effective June 1, 2017, participants are limited to one loan outstanding at a time. Participants with more than one loan on June 1, 2017 may pay the existing loans under stated terms of the existing notes. Effective April 21, 2020 the Plan adopted the temporary loan repayment deferral provision of the CARES Act. The deferral provision allows qualified Plan participant who have plan loan repayments to defer such repayments until December 31, 2020.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

Participants are entitled to the benefits that can be provided from their individual account balances, subject to vesting, upon retirement, death, or termination. Payment is required to be made as soon as administratively feasible after one of these events occurs. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may withdraw his or her account balance through a lump sum payment, installment payments, or as of June 1, 2017, receive a partial distribution. The participant may elect to defer distribution until April 1 of the calendar year following the calendar year in which such a participant reaches age 70 1/2 years of age.

The Plan sponsor makes mandatory distributions to separated participants with balances less than \$5,000 if the participant does not make an alternative election. Balances greater than \$1,000 but less than \$5,000 are distributed to an Individual Retirement Account (“IRA”) on behalf of the participant. Balances less than or equal to \$1,000 are paid to the participant in a lump sum.

FORFEITURES

Forfeitures are used to reduce employer contributions or pay administrative fees for the Plan. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited amounts that have not been applied to reduce employer contributions or pay administrative fees of the Plan totaled \$208,639 and \$88,347, respectively. For the years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures used reduce employer contributions were \$120,026 and \$185,229. In 2024, \$8,661 of forfeitures were used to pay administrative fees and in 2023, no forfeitures were used to pay administrative fees.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements of the plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

INVESTMENT VALUATION AND INCOME RECOGNITION

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis of accounting. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS

Participant loans are classified as notes receivable and are measured at their unpaid principal balance. When a participant fails to comply with the terms of a plan loan, the loan is in default. A defaulted loan may be treated as an actual distribution, a deemed distribution, or a combination of the two.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

Benefits are recorded when paid for financial statement purposes.

OPERATING EXPENSES

Annual fees for testing and reporting as well as fees for Form 5500 preparation were paid to Fidelity by the Company on behalf of the plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 and are not reflected in the financial statements. All other participant account and loan fees were deducted from respective participant accounts and are reflected as administrative fees in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosure, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identifiable assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Common stocks: Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective trusts: Valued at the NAV practical expedient per unit held by the plan at year end as reported by the trust, which is based on the fair value of underlying investments held by the trust.

Money market funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Money market mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS – CONTINUED

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine that fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 4 – CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, December 31, 2024, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company (the trustee of the Plan).

NOTE 5 – PLAN TERMINATION AND AMENDMENTS

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan with respect to either a portion of all of the participants by delivering to the trustee written notice of such termination. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts. The Company also has the right to amend the Plan at any time.

Effective April 1, 2021, the Plan was amended to adopt an automatic enrollment feature for all newly eligible employees. Newly eligible employees, unless they elect not to participate, will be automatically enrolled in the plan, and have pre-tax contributions withheld and remitted to the plan at five percent of compensation.

Effective July 25, 2023, the plan amended section 1.07 and 1.09 to allow Roth contributions and incoming Roth rollovers to the plan to comply with Secure Act 2.0

NOTE 6 – TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES IN INTEREST

Certain Plan investments are managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company. Fidelity Management Trust Company is the trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees to the Plan for the recordkeeping services were netted against credits to the plan from Fidelity’s Revenue Credit Program (RCP) where recordkeeping revenue received by Fidelity exceeds agreed upon compensation. As a result, the plan received credits of \$59,817 and \$56,139 for year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 7 – INCOME TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company, by a letter dated March 21, 2012, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan’s tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC and has no income subject to unrelated business income tax. The Plan’s income tax returns for the past three years are subject to examination by tax authorities and may change upon examination.

NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in a variety of investment funds. Investments in general are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall volatility risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 10 – SECURE ACT 2.0

On December 23, 2022, Congress passed the Consolidated Appropriation Act of 2023, which included the SECURE Act 2.01. SECURE Act 2.0 contains over 90 new retirement plan provisions, with varying effective dates through 2027. Since the SECURE Act 2.0 provisions include both required and optional elements, the plan administrator will determine the optional provision to elect and amend in the Plan Document accordingly.

NOTE 11 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through June 20, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Effective January 1, 2025, the plan was amended to extend safe harbor matching to all participants.
