Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of EasyK Multiple Employer Plan as adopted by Pedigree Ovens and Trust, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of EasyK Multiple Employer Plan as adopted by Pedigree Ovens and Trust's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2022 and 2021

Plan Description

The following description of EasyK Multiple Employer Plan as adopted by Pedigree Ovens (the Company) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was adopted January 1, 2015, and was amended and restated effective November 1, 2018 whereby the EasyK Multiple Employer Plan Board of Directors of Pedigree Ovens assumed the role of Plan Sponsor. The Plan is a multiple employer contribution retirement plan of a defined contribution plan type. The Plan covers all employees who have two months of service and are age 21 or older. The Plan does not cover union employees whose employment is governed by a collective bargaining agreement, certain nonresident aliens, or leased employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

As of December 31, 2020 employers include Pedigree Ovens (the Company). The Company is the administrator of the Plan. As administrator, the Company has exclusive authority and responsibility for all matters in connection with the operation and administration of the Plan. Reliance Trust Company was appointed custodian for the Plan since 2020, and acted at the direction of the Plan's administrator. Effective March 2016, Pentegra Retirement Service was appointed third-party administrator of the Plan and the Plan was restated and adopted Pentegra's Volume Submitter 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants may authorize payroll deductions up to 100% of compensation as before-tax contributions up to the maximum amount allowed by the IRS. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans.

For 2022, the Company made flexible discretionary matching contributions of 100% up to 5% of eligible compensation.

For 2021, the Company elected to make safe harbor matching contributions of 100% of the first 3% and 50% of the next 2% of compensation for eligible participants.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's contribution, and allocations of (a) Plan earnings and (b) administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the Plan agreement. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are 100% vested immediately in their contributions, the Company's safe harbor matching contributions, the Company's discretionary matching contributions, and the Company's nonelective profit sharing contributions.

Plan Description (continued)

Investment Options

A participant may direct contributions in any of the investment funds offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

Payment of Benefits

A participant may receive a lump-sum, equal installment payment amounts equal to the value of the participant's vested interest, or partial withdrawal not less than \$500 in his or her account upon termination of service due to separation of service, death, disability, retirement, or other reasons. Additionally, participants may elect to receive in-service withdrawals if they become 59.5 during the Plan year. Participants who terminate employment with the Company, and with balances less than \$5,000, may have their account distributed as soon as administratively feasible. Participants are allowed hardship withdrawals in excess of \$500.

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Administrative Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and trustee. See Fair Value Measurements footnote for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or the participant, as provided by the Plan agreement.

Fair Value Measurements

ASC 820 establishes a framework for measuring fair value which provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described below:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset values and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Fair Value Measurements (continued)

Common Collective Trust: Valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the Custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidation will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Certified Investment Information

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulation for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Reliance Trust Company, a qualified institution, has certified the following information included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as complete and accurate:

- Investments as shown in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021;
- Net depreciation in fair value of investments and dividends and interest as shown in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2022;
- Investment information included in the Notes to Financial Statements;
- All investment information included in the Supplemental Schedule, Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) – As of December 31, 2022.

At the request of the Plan administrator, the Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

Related Party Transactions

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50 percent or more of such an employer or employee association, or relatives of such persons.

The Plan paid \$2,759 of administrative fees to the recordkeeper and Custodian for the year ended December 31, 2022. The Company provides certain administrative services at no cost to the Plan. If revenue received by the Custodian from mutual fund service providers under revenue sharing arrangement, the Custodian remits to the Plan on a quarterly basis. Such amounts are used to reduce Plan administrative expenses.

Tax Status

The Plan has received a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated March 31, 2014, stating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (Code). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Tax Status (continued)

The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2022, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2018.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions and terminate the Plan. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Corrective Contribution

During 2022, the Company did not withhold on certain eligible compensation as defined by the Plan document. The Company will enter the Voluntary Corrective Program to correct the prohibited transactions. The Plan recorded a receivable in the amount of \$44,708 to correct the error.

Subsequent Events

The Plan evaluated subsequent events through July 28, 2025, the date the financial statements were issued.

Effective January 1, 2022, the Plan signed new Plan documents with an IRS opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 that incorporated the changes for the cycle three restatement period. The basic terms and operations of the Plan did not change.

The Plan did not file a complete 5500 before the deadline. The Plan will file the 5500 under the DOL's Delinquent File Voluntary Compliance Program. The Plan Sponsor will pay all fees associated with the filing. Management does not believe this will impact the Plan's qualified tax status.

As a result of the Company merger, the Company made the determination to terminate the Plan. The Plan Sponsor expects liquidation to begin in 2025.
