Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the All-Foils, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified to by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Note 1. Description of Plan

The following description of the All-Foils, Inc. (the "Company") Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all full-time employees of the Company, Cleveland Tank, and Quality Components Company who have completed three months of service and have attained age 18. The Plan is sponsored and administered by the Company. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as amended.

Contributions

Participants may elect to defer up to 100% of their compensation as defined by the Plan on either a pre-tax or Roth basis. The Plan also provides for catch-up contributions for participants who reach the age of 50 by the end of the Plan year. Employees who have not declined participation in the Plan or completed a salary deferral agreement as of the date of their eligibility to participate in the Plan will be automatically enrolled in the Plan with a pre-tax deferral of 6%, and their contributions are invested in a designated fund until changed by the participant. Employees who are automatically enrolled are subject to an increase of 1% per year to a maximum deferral of 10%. The Plan provides for a discretionary employer matching contribution for each participant, which was 50% of the first 6% of annual compensation (as defined by the Plan) that a participant contributed to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan also provides for a discretionary employer profit sharing contribution. There was no discretionary employer profit sharing contribution during the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan provides for the acceptance of rollover contributions from other plans qualified under the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions, and an allocation of Plan earnings. Participants are also charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based upon participant account earnings, compensation, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Participants are at all times vested in their elective contributions and earnings thereon. Company contributions and earnings thereon follow a vesting schedule as follows:

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of employment, death, disability, retirement, or attainment of age 59½, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Active participants may make hardship withdrawals of the employee contribution portion of their account balances, subject to Plan provisions.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures of nonvested Company contributions are used to reduce the Company's contributions or pay Plan expenses. Unallocated forfeiture balances as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$34,907 and \$10,819, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures of \$17,419 were used to reduce employer contributions.

Termination Provisions

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and Fidelity Management Trust Company, the Trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities, as well as interest and dividend income, are recorded on the settlement-date basis. There is no significant difference between settlement-date basis and trade-date basis for the period presented. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Participant contributions are recorded when withheld from compensation. Employer contributions are recorded in the period in which they become obligations of the Company.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of distributions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Participant accounts are also charged a quarterly fee that is included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

In preparing these financial statements, Plan management has evaluated, for potential recognition or disclosure, significant events or transactions that occurred during the period subsequent to December 31, 2024, the most recent statement of net assets available for benefits presented herein, through the date of the accompanying Independent Auditors' Report, the date these financial statements were available to be issued. No such significant events or transactions were identified.

Note 3. Unaudited Information

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the plan administrator received certifications from Fidelity Management Trust Company acknowledging the completeness and accuracy of all investments reflected in the statements of net assets available for benefits at December 31, 2024 and 2023, the schedule of assets (held at end of year) at December 31, 2024, the related investment activity reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the investment related information in the accompanying notes to the financial statements. This information is unaudited by independent accountants.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

The Plan estimates the fair value of financial instruments using available market information and other generally accepted valuation methodologies. The inputs used to measure fair value are classified into three levels:

- Level 1: Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities
- Level 2: Observable market-based inputs or unobservable inputs that are corroborated by market data
- Level 3: Unobservable inputs in which little or no market data exists

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets of the Plan measured at fair value at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

- The fair values of registered investment companies are determined based on their quoted closing market prices in active markets for identical investments and are classified as Level 1.
- The investment in the common/collective trust is held and managed by the Trustee. The fair value of investments held in these accounts is based on their reported net asset value ("NAV"). The NAV is based primarily on observable inputs and the market value of the underlying investments and is classified at Level 2.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. There have been no changes in methodologies used from 2023 to 2024. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5. Common/Collective Trust

The Plan invests in the Putnam Stable Value Fund 25, which is a common/collective trust fund. Participants may ordinarily direct permitted withdrawals or transfers of all or a portion of their account balances. A transfer of assets from the Putnam Stable Value Fund 25 to a competing investment vehicle must first be held in a non-competing investment vehicle for at least ninety days before the transfer to the competing investment vehicle may be affected. Whether an investment vehicle is a "competing investment vehicle" is within the sole discretion of the Trustee.

Note 6. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are held in a common/collective trust or registered investment companies managed by Fidelity Investments. Administrative expenses were paid to the Trustee of the Plan during the year ended December 31, 2024; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Note 7. Income Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a pre-approved plan document from Fidelity Management & Research Company. Fidelity Management & Research Company obtained its latest opinion letter regarding the prototype on June 30, 2020, in which the IRS determined that the volume submitter plan document was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document, the plan administrator believes the Plan continues to be designed and operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require such recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan holds various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1. Description of Plan

The following description of the All-Foils, Inc. (the "Company") Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all full-time employees of the Company, Cleveland Tank, and Quality Components Company who have completed three months of service and have attained age 18. The Plan is sponsored and administered by the Company. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as amended.

Contributions

Participants may elect to defer up to 100% of their compensation as defined by the Plan on either a pre-tax or Roth basis. The Plan also provides for catch-up contributions for participants who reach the age of 50 by the end of the Plan year. Employees who have not declined participation in the Plan or completed a salary deferral agreement as of the date of their eligibility to participate in the Plan will be automatically enrolled in the Plan with a pre-tax deferral of 6%, and their contributions are invested in a designated fund until changed by the participant. Employees who are automatically enrolled are subject to an increase of 1% per year to a maximum deferral of 10%. The Plan provides for a discretionary employer matching contribution for each participant, which was 50% of the first 6% of annual compensation (as defined by the Plan) that a participant contributed to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan also provides for a discretionary employer profit sharing contribution. There was no discretionary employer profit sharing contribution during the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan provides for the acceptance of rollover contributions from other plans qualified under the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions, and an allocation of Plan earnings. Participants are also charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based upon participant account earnings, compensation, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Note 1. Description of Plan (Continued)

Vesting

Participants are at all times vested in their elective contributions and earnings thereon. Company contributions and earnings thereon follow a vesting schedule as follows:

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of employment, death, disability, retirement, or attainment of age 59½, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Active participants may make hardship withdrawals of the employee contribution portion of their account balances, subject to Plan provisions.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures of nonvested Company contributions are used to reduce the Company's contributions or pay Plan expenses. Unallocated forfeiture balances as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$34,907 and \$10,819, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures of \$17,419 were used to reduce employer contributions.

Termination Provisions

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and Fidelity Management Trust Company, the Trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities, as well as interest and dividend income, are recorded on the settlement-date basis. There is no significant difference between settlement-date basis and trade-date basis for the period presented. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Participant contributions are recorded when withheld from compensation. Employer contributions are recorded in the period in which they become obligations of the Company.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of distributions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Participant accounts are also charged a quarterly fee that is included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

In preparing these financial statements, Plan management has evaluated, for potential recognition or disclosure, significant events or transactions that occurred during the period subsequent to December 31, 2024, the most recent statement of net assets available for benefits presented herein, through the date of the accompanying Independent Auditors' Report, the date these financial statements were available to be issued. No such significant events or transactions were identified.

Note 3. Unaudited Information

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the plan administrator received certifications from Fidelity Management Trust Company acknowledging the completeness and accuracy of all investments reflected in the statements of net assets available for benefits at December 31, 2024 and 2023, the schedule of assets (held at end of year) at December 31, 2024, the related investment activity reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the investment related information in the accompanying notes to the financial statements. This information is unaudited by independent accountants.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

The Plan estimates the fair value of financial instruments using available market information and other generally accepted valuation methodologies. The inputs used to measure fair value are classified into three levels:

- Level 1: Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities
- Level 2: Observable market-based inputs or unobservable inputs that are corroborated by market data
- Level 3: Unobservable inputs in which little or no market data exists

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets of the Plan measured at fair value at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

- The fair values of registered investment companies are determined based on their quoted closing market prices in active markets for identical investments and are classified as Level 1.
- The investment in the common/collective trust is held and managed by the Trustee. The fair value of investments held in these accounts is based on their reported net asset value ("NAV"). The NAV is based primarily on observable inputs and the market value of the underlying investments and is classified at Level 2.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. There have been no changes in methodologies used from 2023 to 2024. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5. Common/Collective Trust

The Plan invests in the Putnam Stable Value Fund 25, which is a common/collective trust fund. Participants may ordinarily direct permitted withdrawals or transfers of all or a portion of their account balances. A transfer of assets from the Putnam Stable Value Fund 25 to a competing investment vehicle must first be held in a non-competing investment vehicle for at least ninety days before the transfer to the competing investment vehicle may be affected. Whether an investment vehicle is a "competing investment vehicle" is within the sole discretion of the Trustee.

Note 6. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are held in a common/collective trust or registered investment companies managed by Fidelity Investments. Fidelity Management Trust Company is the Trustee as defined by the Plan and related to Fidelity Investments. Administrative expenses were paid to the Trustee of the Plan during the year ended December 31, 2024; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Note 7. Income Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a pre-approved plan document from Fidelity Management & Research Company. Fidelity Management & Research Company obtained its latest opinion letter regarding the prototype on June 30, 2020, in which the IRS determined that the volume submitter plan document was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document, the plan administrator believes the Plan continues to be designed and operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require such recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan holds various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
