Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the 2022 and 2021 Financial Statements

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the California Retina Consultants 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of January 7, 2022, December 31, 2021, and December 31, 2020, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period ended January 7, 2022 and the year ended December 31, 2021, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's 2022 and 2021 financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not to extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency ("qualified institution"), provided that the investment information regarding assets so held is prepared and certified to by the qualified institution in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of January 7, 2022 and December 31, 2021, and for the period ended January 7, 2022 and the year ended December 31, 2021, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion on the 2022 and 2021 Financial Statements

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2022 and 2021 Financial Statements* section of our report

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying 2022 and 2021 financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").
- the information in the accompanying 2022 and 2021 financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion on the 2022 and 2021 Financial Statements

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAS”). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor’s Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2022 and 2021 Financial Statements* section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Emphasis of Matter – Plan Merger With Parent Company 401(k) Plan

As further discussed in Note 1 to the financial statements, the Board of Directors of California Retina Consultants, Inc., the Plan sponsor, authorized the freeze of the Plan to new participants and contributions effective December 31, 2021, and on January 1, 2022, became a participating employer in its parent company’s 401(k) plan. All Plan assets were transferred into the parent company’s 401(k) plan in 2022. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management’s election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management’s responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan’s ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan’s transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan’s provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor’s Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2022 and 2021 Financial Statements

Except as described in the *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the 2022 and 2021 Financial Statements* section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the 2022 and 2021 financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor’s report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.

Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the 2022 and 2021 financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information and to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the 2022 and 2021 financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that were identified during the audit.

Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying

accounting and other records used to prepare the 2022 and 2021 financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the 2022 and 2021 financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the 2022 and 2021 financial statements or to the 2022 and 2021 financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

JANUARY 7, 2022 AND DECEMBER 31, 2021

1. PLAN DESCRIPTION

The following description of the California Retina Consultants 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants and other interested parties should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering eligible employees who have been employed by California Retina Consultants, Inc. (the "Company" and the "Plan Sponsor") who have attained 21 years of age and have worked at least 1,000 hours. Employees must be employed on the last day of the Plan year and have worked at least 1,000 hours during the Plan year to be eligible for Company profit sharing contributions. Participants are not permitted to borrow from their account. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

In response to the Company being acquired by Retina Consultants of America ("RCA") in 2020, effective December 31, 2021, the Company's Board of Directors amended the Plan to freeze all future participation and future contributions. Effective January 1, 2022, the Company became a participating employer in the Retina Consultants of America 401(k) Plan (the "RCA Plan") and effective January 7, 2022, the Plan was merged into the RCA Plan and accordingly, assets of \$14,606,446 were transferred to the RCA Plan. The remaining assets of \$2,007 were transferred to the RCA Plan on April 7, 2022.

Contributions - Prior to December 31, 2021, participants could make pre-tax and Roth deferrals of up to 100 percent of their annual compensation, as defined by the Plan and subject to Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year were eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants could also contribute amounts representing distributions from other eligible retirement plans, as defined. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Prior to December 31, 2021, the Company made a safe harbor nonelective contribution to eligible employees equal to three percent of their eligible compensation. The Company made a safe harbor nonelective contribution in the amount of \$244,056 for the year ended December 31, 2021. The Company could also elect to make a discretionary profit sharing contribution. The Company made a profit sharing contribution of \$302,428 for the year ended December 31, 2021. The Company contribution for the year ended December 31, 2021 includes \$87,202 of earnings restitution as the contribution was not deposited to the RCA Plan until 2024.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit sharing contribution and safe harbor nonelective contribution, and Plan earnings, and charged with any withdrawals or distributions requested by the participant, investment losses and allocation of administrative expenses, if applicable. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and Company safe harbor nonelective contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's profit sharing contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of service. Participants are vested in Company profit sharing contributions over a six-year period, as defined.

Forfeitures - Forfeitures of the Company's profit sharing contributions may be used to pay Plan administrative expenses or to reduce future Company contributions and total \$52,942 and \$25,307 as of December 31, 2021 and 2020, respectively. On January 7, 2022, forfeitures of \$54,959 were transferred to the RCA Plan. During the year ended December 31, 2021, forfeitures of \$4,000 were utilized to pay Plan administrative expenses.

Payment of Benefits - On termination of service for any reason, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account as permitted under the Plan. The Plan provides for a mandatory cash-out following severance of employment for account balances less than \$5,000.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting - The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Investments are valued daily. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Concentrations - Through participant direction, approximately 46 percent and 49 percent of the Plan's net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2021 and 2020, respectively, were invested in the TIAA-CREF Lifecycle Index 2030 Fund (a pooled separate account).

Administrative Expenses - Certain administrative expenses incidental to the administration of the Plan may be paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Administrative expenses paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements.

Most investment options have fees which reduce the overall return on assets. The net appreciation (depreciation) of investments is inclusive of these fees.

According to the Revenue Account Agreement between the Company and American United Life Insurance Company ("AUL"), AUL is required to make contributions to a Revenue Account. The funds in the Revenue Account may be used to pay Plan administrative expenses or may be allocated to participants at the discretion of the Company. During the period ended January 7, 2022, there were no contributions to the Revenue Account. During the year ended December 31, 2021, AUL contributed \$26,368 to the Revenue Account, all of which was utilized to pay Plan administrative expenses. There was no balance in the Revenue Account as of December 31, 2021 and 2020.

Benefits Payable to Participants - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events - The Company has evaluated subsequent events through February 6, 2025, which is the date that the financial statements were available to be issued, and determined that there were no subsequent events or transactions that required recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.

3. FAIR VALUE

The Plan accounts for its financial instruments using a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are the following:

- Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology that are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 – Inputs other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are inactive; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.
- Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation that are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

A financial instrument's categorization within the valuation hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2021 and 2020.

Pooled Separate Accounts – Valued at the net asset value (“NAV”) of units of a pooled separate account (“PSA”) maintained by an insurance company held by the Plan at year-end. The NAV, as provided by the insurance company, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the PSA less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

The primary investment objective of the PSA is to allow participants to achieve the same rate of return as the underlying mutual fund, less fees charged by the insurance company. The PSAs do not have any unfunded commitments relating to its investments, or any significant restrictions on redemptions. Participant-directed redemptions can be made on any business day and do not have a redemption notice period.

4. FINANCIAL DATA CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIAN

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the following information was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified by American United Life Insurance Company (the "Custodian") and was not subjected to any auditing procedures performed by the independent public accountants:

- a. Investments, at fair value and contract value as shown in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of January 7, 2022, December 31, 2021 and 2020.
- b. Net appreciation (depreciation) of investments and interest income on investments as shown in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period ended January 7, 2022 and for the year ended December 31, 2021.
- c. Investments and fully benefit-responsive investment contract as listed in the accompanying Schedule H, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2021.

5. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with AUL totaling \$81,866 for 2021 and \$109,595 for 2020. AUL maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. AUL is contractually obligated to repay the principal and specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with AUL. Such interest rates are reset on a quarterly basis.

The AUL Fixed Account meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by AUL, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on AUL's ability to meet its financial obligations. AUL's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain restrictions exist related to how often a participant may exchange to and from the fixed option account and how much can be exchanged. The plan administrator believes that no events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with AUL and that would also limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants.

The contract with AUL was terminated effective January 7, 2022 and the assets were liquidated at contract value.

6. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

7. PLAN TERMINATION

The Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their Company contributions. The Plan was merged into the RCA Plan effective January 7, 2022.

8. TAX STATUS

The Plan is a prototype plan that is the subject of a favorable tax opinion letter from the IRS dated March 31, 2014. The Company routinely self reviews the administration of the Plan and has identified operational errors relating to vesting, the definition of eligible compensation, and eligibility for profit sharing contributions. Plan management is the process of analyzing these operational errors and determining the appropriate correction methodology with legal counsel. As of the report date, it is uncertain what impact the ultimate resolution of these operational errors will have on the accompanying financial statements. Accordingly, except for the operational errors noted, the plan administrator believes the Plan is currently being operated in accordance with the applicable provisions of the IRC and, accordingly, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is exempt from income taxes.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Company has taken a significant uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of January 7, 2022 and December 31, 2021, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

9. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by the Custodian. Transactions with the Custodian qualify as party in interest transactions for which exemptions exist. For the period ended January 7, 2022, the Custodian received \$40 for administration fees, all of which was paid the participants in the Plan, and \$386 of indirect compensation based on a formula. For the year ended December 31, 2021, the Custodian received \$4,440 for administration fees, of which \$4,000 was paid from forfeitures and the remainder was paid by the participants through the Plan, and \$19,768 of indirect compensation based on a formula. In addition, the Plan utilizes an investment advisor that received \$26,368 which was paid from the Revenue Account.

10. DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS

Certain 2021 contributions were not remitted timely to the Custodian, as required by the Department of Labor's regulations. These late remittances are detailed in the attached Schedule H, Line 4a - Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions for the period ended January 7, 2022 and the year ended December 31, 2021.
