(1) Description of Plan

The following description of Jeffers, Mann & Artman Pediatric and Adolescent Medicine, P.A., Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan is sponsored by Jeffers, Mann & Artman Pediatric and Adolescent Medicine, P.A. (the “Company”).

(a) General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan available to all eligible employees of the Company who have completed 1 year of service and 1,000 hours and are age 21 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). The Plan administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan's management determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan administrator.

(b) Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 90% of annual compensation through voluntary deferral deductions. Participants may also contribute after-tax contributions along with qualified Roth contributions to the Plan, and may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Company offers automatic enrollment at 1% for employees, unless otherwise elected by the participant. Contributions are subject to certain limitations as determined by the Internal Revenue Code. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Plan has a safe harbor employer contribution and currently makes a safe harbor contribution of 100% of participant deferrals up to 4% of the employee's gross compensation for the Plan year. The Company can also elect to make a discretionary matching or profit sharing contribution, to be determined by the Company annually. During 2024 and 2023, the Company made a \$400,000 discretionary profit-sharing contribution to the Plan.

(c) Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, including amounts rolled over from other qualified plans, the Company's safe harbor contribution, the Company's discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions, and allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocation of expenses are based on the participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

(d) Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their voluntary contributions, including amounts rolled over from other qualified plans, the Company's safe harbor contributions and the Company's discretionary matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Vesting in the Company's discretionary profit sharing contributions and any actual earnings thereon is determined using a progressive schedule based on years of service. Vesting begins with one year of service and a participant is 100% vested after five years of credited service. For vesting purposes, a year of service is based on the Plan year, as defined by the Plan.

(e) Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 of the vested portion of the participant account balance up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at 1% over the prime rate at the time of issuance, which is commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

(f) Payment of Benefits

Participants are entitled to receive lump-sum payments of all or any portion of their vested account balance upon attainment of age 59½. On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or an installment distribution solely to the extent necessary to satisfy required minimum distribution rules. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. If a participant's vested interest does not exceed \$5,000, a lump-sum distribution will be made regardless of whether the participant consents to receive payment. Participants are permitted to take hardship distributions from selected accounts, as defined by the Plan, upon demonstrations of financial hardship.

(g) Forfeited Accounts

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$29,604 and \$8,095, respectively. Previously, these accounts could be used to reduce future employer contributions or pay administrative expenses. Effective April 1, 2023, these accounts can be used to pay administrative expenses or allocated to participants eligible to share in the profit sharing contributions. During 2024 and 2023, the Plan allocated forfeitures of \$8,095 and \$7,279, respectively, from forfeited nonvested accounts to eligible participants.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America and present the net assets available for plan benefits and changes in those net assets of the Plan.

(b) Fair Value Measurements

For determining fair value measurements, fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants. Management follows an established framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy, which requires an entity to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. The three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value are described below:

Level 1: quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities

Level 2: inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly

Level 3: one or more significant inputs or significant value drivers are unobservable or based on market assumptions

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Money market funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. The money market fund held by the Plan is an open-end mutual fund that is registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC"). The fund is required to publish its daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The money market fund held by the Plan is deemed to be actively traded.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

(c) Investments

Investments are reported at fair value as described above. The Plan administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians and trustee. See note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

(c) Investments, Continued

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year. There are no unfunded commitments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

(d) Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the Plan document. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

(e) Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation or depreciation of fair value of investments. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included with the loan principal amount in notes receivable from participants. Expenses not paid by the Company are paid using the Plan's assets and will generally be allocated among the accounts of all participants in the Plan. These expenses will be allocated either proportionately based on the value of the account balances or as an equal dollar amount based on the number of participants in the Plan. The method of allocating the expenses depends on the nature of the expense itself.

(f) Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

(g) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets available for plan benefits and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for plan benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(5) Related Party Transactions and Party-In-Interest Transactions

Fund management and custodial services, recordkeeping, transaction processing, and loan maintenance services are provided by Reliance Trust Company, a related party, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for these services are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of the investments or administrative expenses. The Plan sponsor directly pays any other fees related to the Plan's operations. The Plan receives revenue sharing payments from the mutual fund service providers, which offsets certain fees paid by the Plan. Fees in excess of revenue sharing are allocated to participant accounts and expensed. Revenue sharing in excess of fees is allocated to the accounts of the participants.

(6) Federal Income Taxes

The Plan adopted a prototype plan on December 1, 2020 sponsored by ADP, LLC. The prototype plan has received a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated October 6, 2020, that the prototype plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions.

(7) Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

(8) Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for plan benefits.
