Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Medical Center Emergency Services Retirement Savings Thrift Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (an *ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit*). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits-modified cash basis as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits-modified cash basis for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Medical Center Emergency Services Retirement Savings Thrift Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from *Fidelity Management Trust Company*, a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Medical Center Emergency Services Retirement Savings Thrift Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Medical Center Emergency Services Retirement Savings Thrift Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit* section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.

- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Medical Center Emergency Services Retirement Savings Thrift Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

NOTE 1 - Plan Description

The following description of the Medical Center Emergency Services Retirement Savings Thrift Plan (the "Plan") sponsored by the Medical Center Emergency Services, a not for profit organization, as defined in the plan documents, is for the benefit of the participants. This information is provided for their eligible employees' purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information.

- a) General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of the Medical Center Emergency Services (the "Organization") that have completed four months of service. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Board of Trustees oversees governance of the Plan.
- b) Contributions – The Organization may make discretionary non-elective contributions to the plan in an amount determined by the Board of Directors. Contributions related to a Plan year are generally deposited in the following year.

Participants may only make rollover contributions to the Plan.
- c) Participant Accounts – Each participant's account is credited with the Organization's contribution in a ratio that a participant's eligible compensation bears to the total eligible compensation of all participants subject to a limit of the lesser of \$66,000 (based on the 2023 plan contribution limit) for December 31, 2024, and \$61,000 (based on the 2022 plan contribution limit) for plan year ended December 31, 2023, or 100% of the participant's annual compensation. Each participant's account is also credited with investment earnings from a participant's self-directed investments net of an allocation of administrative expenses. The allocation is based on participant account balances. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants may direct the investments of their account balances into various investment options offered by the Plan.
- d) Payment of Benefits – Benefit payments of the plan are normally provided in the form of a lump sum payment. A participant may elect other forms of distribution such as an annuity or installment distributions.
- e) Vesting –
 1. Employee Rollover Contributions – A participant will always have 100 percent vested and non-forfeitable interest in his or her own rollover contributions plus actual earnings thereon.
 2. Employer Contributions – A participant vests 100 percent after one year of service.
- f) Forfeitures – Any balance in the account of a participant, who has separated from service, to which he or she has no vested interest will be forfeited and will first be used to pay administrative fees and then may be used to reduce sponsors contributions to the Plan.
- g) Notes Receivable from Participants – Participants may borrow from their fund accounts subject to a minimum amount of \$1,000 as prescribed in the Plan and in the Internal Revenue Code. Customarily the maximum amount that can be borrowed is the lesser of 50% of the vested balance of their account or \$50,000 (reduced by the highest prior 12-month outstanding loan balance). The interest rate is a fixed rate determined by the plan administrator based upon prevailing interest rates. Repayment of the loan is normally made through payroll deduction in a level generally amortized amount over a 5-year period for a term not to exceed 10 years. The loans are secured by the vested balance of the participant's account.

NOTE 1 - Plan Description (continued)

- h) Termination - The Organization has the right to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan is terminated, partially terminated or if there is a complete discontinuance of contributions under the Plan, all amounts credited to the accounts of participants shall become 100% vested and become non-forfeitable. In the event of termination, the employer shall direct the Custodian to distribute accounts to or for the exclusive benefit of participants or their beneficiaries. The employer has no intentions to terminate the plan.

NOTE 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following is a summary of significant accounting policies followed by the Plan:

- a) Modified Cash Basis - The accompanying financial statements of the plan have been prepared on a modified cash basis of accounting, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP). On a GAAP basis of accounting, revenue is recognized as earned and expenses are recognized when the obligation is incurred. On a modified cash basis of accounting, revenue is recognized when cash is received, and expenses are recognized when paid. Investments are recognized at fair value, which is consistent with GAAP basis of accounting.
- b) Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Shares of registered investment companies are valued at quoted market prices, which represent the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end. Participants' loans are valued at cost, which approximates fair value. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded generally on the modified accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Gains and losses (realized and unrealized) are included in net appreciation in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

See Note 6 for a discussion of fair value measurements and additional information.

- c) Administrative Expenses – Administrative expenses of the Plan paid by the Plan are related to the third-party administrator's fee, which is paid first out of forfeitures and custodian credits. The greater majority of plan costs and administrative fees are paid by the Plan employer.
- d) Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions and deductions during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.
- e) Participant Notes Receivable – Participant notes receivable are recorded at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued interest. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the note receivable to be in default, the participant's note receivable is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.
- f) Payment of Benefits to Participants – Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

NOTE 3 - Related Party Transactions and Party-in-interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company (the "Custodian") and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions as defined under ERISA guidelines.

NOTE 4 - Tax Status

The Plan is a volume submitter provided by the plan custodian and trustee Fidelity Management Trust Company. The volume submitter plan has received an advisory letter dated March 31, 2014 from the Internal Revenue Service that the plan, as designed, is qualified from federal income tax-exempt status. The Plan has not individually sought its own determination letter.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 5 - Certification of Investment Information

Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity), as custodian of the Plan, have supplied the Plan administrator with certifications as to the completeness and accuracy of all the investments reflected in the accompanying *Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits* at December 31, 2024 and 2023, the information in the December 31, 2024 *Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year)*, and the related investment activity and interest income from participant notes receivable reflected in the *Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits* for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 6 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under US GAAP are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- a. Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- b. Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- c. Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- d. Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

Classification within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investment measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds - The Fidelity and non-Fidelity mutual funds held in the plan are traded on the open market and are priced as of the close of each business day and quoted in open market prices. Mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded. Therefore, the mutual funds are classified as a Level 1 Fair Value Measurement.

Self-Directed Brokerage accounts - These accounts are permitted by the plan whereby participants can elect to invest their plan assets in individual securities by establishing a plan level brokerage account. Assets may not be valued daily, and, as a result plan management considers these accounts as a Level 2 classification.

Common/collective Trust at NAV* - The investment in Managed Income Portfolio Class 2 is a stable value fund valued using the unadjusted net asset value (“NAV”) as of the reporting date, which is the basis for current transactions. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The fund seeks to preserve the investment while earning a level of interest income that is consistent with principal preservation. The fund seeks to maintain a stable net asset (NAV) of \$1 per share. The fund invests in benefit-responsive investment contracts issued by insurance companies and other financial institutions (“Contracts”), fixed income securities, and money market funds. This portfolio is not a mutual fund. The fund is managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company. There may be restrictions and notice required on redemption (refer to the funds Annual Report for more information.)

The fund is valued using the NAV of units held by the Plan at year end and is not assigned a level in the fair value hierarchy. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the fixed income accounts, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. * Investments whose fair value is reflected using the NAV practical expedient are not required to be leveled in the fair value hierarchy.
