Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the 2024 Financial Statements

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of the InsideRE 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024, the related statement of changes in assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion on the 2024 Financial Statements

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the *Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2024 Financial Statements* section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).
- the information in the financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion on the 2024 Financial Statements

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2024 Financial Statements* section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the 2024 Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter—2024 Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) and schedule of delinquent participant contributions are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the InsideRE 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document, adoption agreement, and summary plan description for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was established January 1, 2012 and has an effective restatement date of November 15, 2023. The Plan was previously named the Boomtown ROI, LLC 401(k) Plan. In January 2023, the prior Plan sponsor was acquired by InsideRE, LLC. Effective November 15, 2023 the name of the Plan was amended to InsideRE 401(k) Retirement Plan. The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of InsideRE, LLC (the Company or Employer), who are not covered by another plan. To be eligible to participate in the Plan, employees must be 18 years of age. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA)

Contributions

Contributions to the Plan include: (i) salary reduction contributions authorized by participants, (ii) matching contributions made by the Company, (iii) discretionary profit-sharing contributions made by the Company, and (iv) participant rollovers from other plans.

Participants may elect to contribute a percentage of their eligible compensation, as defined by the Plan document, to the Plan each year, subject to the limitations of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Regular 401(k) contributions are excluded from the participant's taxable income for federal income tax purposes until received as a withdrawal or distribution from the Plan. Roth 401(k) contributions are not excluded from the participant's taxable income for federal income tax purposes, but withdrawals of contributions and earnings thereon are tax free. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

Company matching contribution amounts and profit-sharing amounts may be contributed at the discretion of the Company's Board of Directors. Participants may also contribute to the Plan amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. During the year-ended December 31, 2024, the Company did not make a profit-sharing contribution to the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each participant of the Plan. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit-sharing contribution and Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. Participants may direct the investment of their account balance into various investment options offered by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution and profit-sharing portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant becomes vested based on years of credited service, as follows:

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or one-half of their vested account balance. Participants may only have one outstanding note at any given time. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined appropriate by the plan administrator. The notes have a maximum term of five years, unless the notes are used for the purchase or construction of a primary residence. As of December 31, 2024, participant loans had maturities through 2029 with interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual installments. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution. Participants are also eligible to make hardship withdrawals from their deferred contributions in the event of certain financial hardships.

Forfeitures

When certain terminations of participation in the Plan occur, the nonvested portion of the participant's account represents a forfeiture. The Plan document permits the use of forfeitures to either reduce future Employer contributions or pay Plan administrative expenses. A total of \$17,542 was forfeited during 2024. During 2024, \$32,498 of forfeited amounts were used to fund employer contributions and plan expenses. The Plan had a forfeiture balance of \$4,895 and \$19,851 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Administrative Expenses

Plan administrative expenses may be charged directly to the Plan (either allocated to the participants or using forfeiture funds) or paid by the Employer. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan paid \$96,885 of administrative expenses. Certain administrative expenses are paid by the Company. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

Plan Termination

The Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants become 100% vested in their accounts.

Plan Mergers

Effective January 1, 2024, the Inside Real Estate 401(k) Plan was merged into the Plan. All assets from this plan were transferred into the Plan during the year ended December 31, 2024. The total amount transferred into the Plan during the year ended December 31, 2024, was \$5,416,591.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared using the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for investments in securities that are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, currency exchange rate, credit, and the overall fluctuation in the market. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of assets available for benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments in mutual and money market funds are stated at fair value based upon quoted market prices.

Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes realized and unrealized gains or losses on investments and is recognized in income currently. Amounts invested may earn interest and dividends, which in turn are reinvested.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid by the Plan.

Subsequent Events

Plan management has evaluated events and transactions occurring subsequent to year-end through August 6, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Fair Value Measurements

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Financial Accounting Standards Board established a framework for measuring fair value in the form of a fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes inputs into valuation techniques used to measure fair value into three broad levels. This hierarchy requires assets to be classified by level in their entirety based upon the lowest level of input that was significant to the fair value measurement. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are as follows:

Level 1 – Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2 – Observable inputs other than Level 1, including quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in less active markets, or other observable inputs that can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3 – Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market data for financial instruments whose value is determined using pricing models, discounted cash flow methodologies, or similar techniques, as well as instruments for which the determination of fair value requires significant management judgment or estimation.

4. Federal Income Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has informed Plan management by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust were designed in accordance with the applicable regulations of the IRC. Plan management believes that the Plan is currently designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and the Plan and related trust continue to be tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

US GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by tax authorities. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions of the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there were no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits in tax jurisdictions for tax years for which the applicable statutes of limitations have not expired; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

5. Information Certified by the Trustee

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under that election, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, except for comparing such information certified by the trustee to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedules:

- All investment assets held by the Plan.
- Notes receivable from Participants
- The recording of transactions related to all investment assets and notes receivable from participants, including related earnings (losses) and interest and dividends.
