Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter –Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules, schedule H, line 4i – schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024 and schedule H, line 4a – schedule of delinquent participant contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from

the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of Allied Crawford Steel, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all full-time employees of Allied Crawford Steel, Inc. (the Company) who are age twenty-one or older. Leased employees, union employees and non-resident aliens are not permitted to participate in the Plan. Part-time, temporary or seasonal employees are only permitted to participate in the Plan after satisfying the 1,000 hour service requirement during the eligibility computation period. Participants may enter the Plan on the first day of the quarter after which the participant meets the Plan's eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, (ERISA). Effective June 1, 2024, the Plan was amended and restated.

Contributions: Each year, participants may contribute up to 90% of eligible pre-tax compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who are age fifty or older by the end of the year are eligible to make an additional catch-up contribution to the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollover contributions). The Plan was amended on June 1, 2024 to allow Roth contributions.

At their discretion, the Company may make a flexible discretionary matching contribution to the Plan. For the plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company elected to make a 20% matching contribution on 100% of compensation deferred into the Plan for all participants. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the employer matching contribution amounted to \$75,458 (\$58,824 - 2023). The Company may also elect to make a discretionary nonelective employer contribution. Participants who have reached 1,000 hours of service and are employed on the last day of the plan year are eligible for discretionary nonelective contributions. The Company did not elect to make a discretionary nonelective contribution to the Plan during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of the Company's contribution and Plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations of Company's contributions are based on a match of participant deferral contributions. Allocations of Plan earnings and administrative expenses are based on account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investment Options: Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct employee contributions and employer matching contributions into any of the available investment options offered under the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds, a money market account and a common collective trust fund as investment options for participants. Participants may change their investment options as often as permitted under the investment vehicles chosen by the participant.

Notes Receivable from Participants: Participant loans are not permitted by the Plan.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon and fully vested in discretionary employer contributions upon death or total and permanent disability. Vesting in the Company's discretionary contributions plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of credited service. A participant vests according to the following schedule:

Payment of Benefits: On retirement, death, disability, or termination of service, a participant (or participant's beneficiary in the event of death) receives a lump sum distribution equal to the participant's vested account balance. Hardship distributions are permitted if certain criteria are met.

Forfeitures: There were no forfeitures, including earnings thereon, used to reduce the 2024 employer matching contributions (\$10,017 - 2023). The remaining forfeiture balance at December 31, 2024 totaled \$2,516 (\$275 - 2023).

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

Basis of Accounting: The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

The Plan's Trustees determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Plan's investment advisors and custodians. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses: Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan are paid by the Plan and are recorded in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits as administrative expenses. Expenses of maintaining the Plan that are paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events: The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through August 22, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standard Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification* (ASC) 820: *Fair Value Measurements*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts: The separate accounts are stated at net asset value (NAV) per unit based on the quoted market prices of the underlying investments. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the separate accounts will sell the investments for an amount different from the NAV. In accordance with Subtopic 820-10, investments that were measured at net asset value per share (or its equivalent) are not required to be classified in the fair value hierarchy.

NOTE 4. GUARANTEED INTEREST ACCOUNT

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held \$13,631 and \$8,434, respectively, of fixed interest investments under an Agreement with Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Company (Mass Mutual). The declared rate of interest on the fixed interest investments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 was equal to 2.80% and 1.65%, respectively. The Guaranteed Interest Account, backed by Mass Mutual's general assets, is designed to provide stable, long-term investment growth. The diversified portfolio is composed primarily of high-quality, fixed-income investments including public bonds, private placements, commercial mortgage loans and short-term investments. Investments are made using a conservative approach by matching assets to liabilities.

Participants are guaranteed preservation of principal and a stated rate of return regardless of economic events while their investment is active. The guaranteed interest rate is determined in advance thus allowing plan sponsors and participants to make informed decisions regarding current allocations of their investment holdings.

Participants' accounts invested in the Guaranteed Interest Account are available for participant-initiated transactions at book value, including transfers to other investment options, loans and distributions in the event of hardship and upon a participant's retirement, death, disability and certain separations from service. Because these participant-initiated transactions occur at book value, participants' investments are not subject to changes in value due to market conditions. Mass Mutual backs its commitments with its own surplus and capital.

If the Agreement is fully or partially terminated, participants will receive the liquidation value of the Guaranteed Interest Account instead of the book value. The liquidation value is determined in accordance with a formula contained in the Agreement, which is designed to reflect the value of the assets in the account. The liquidation value may be more or less than the book value of the plan's investments in the account. This means that upon partial or full termination of the Agreement, a participant's account balance in the Guaranteed Interest Account may be either increased or decreased.

The Guaranteed Interest Account is considered fully-benefit responsive. As such, the investment has been reported at contract value in the statements of net assets available for benefits at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 5. FINANCIAL CERTIFICATION

The following financial information regarding the Plan's assets at December 31, 2024 and 2023, as well as income and transactions for the years then ended, has been derived from information provided by Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Life and Annuity Insurance Company of New York on behalf of Mass Mutual (collectively "Empower"), the custodian of the Plan, and has been certified as complete and accurate. The incorporation of this financial information in the accompanying financial statements is based solely on its certification and has not been audited by independent accountants.

NOTE 6. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the plan, subject to plan provisions and ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in the company contributions portion of their account.

NOTE 7. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Fees incurred by the Plan for the recordkeeping services are included in the net appreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. For the plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan did not make any direct payments to Empower that were not covered by revenue sharing. The Company pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations. Additionally, the Company provides certain administrative services to the plan for which no fees are charged.

NOTE 8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the individual participant account statements and the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9. PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS

The Plan Sponsor inadvertently failed to deposit \$4,295 of participant elective deferral contributions for the year ended December 31, 2022 within the required time frame as stated by the United States DOL regulations. This represents elective deferral contributions for payroll periods during 2022. The Plan Sponsor corrected this deficiency in January 2024 by filing a Form 5330 for the late remittances and remitting lost earnings to the Plan.

NOTE 10. TAX STATUS

The underlying non-standardized prototype plan offered by Nova 401(k) Associates has received an opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020 stating that the form of the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken uncertain tax positions that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there were no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the notes to the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
