### ***Opinion***

We have audited the financial statements of Ceramic Tile and Terrazzo Local 67 B.A.C. Annuity Trust Fund (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits of Ceramic Tile and Terrazzo Local 67 B.A.C. ## **Notes to Financial Statements**

December 31, 2024 and 2023

### **Note 1. Description of the Plan**

Ceramic Tile and Terrazzo Local 67 B.A.C. Annuity Trust Fund (the Plan) was established June 1, 1990, as a result of collective bargaining agreements between participating contractors and Administrative District Council 1 of Illinois. The Plan is funded by contractor contributions as specified in the collective bargaining agreements. Participant contributions are not permitted under the Plan. The Plan is a multiemployer defined contribution retirement plan, subject to provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. Benefits under the Plan are not insured by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation.

The Plan covers persons working within the jurisdiction of the district council who have agreed to participate in the Plan and have satisfied eligibility requirements, as defined in the Plan agreement.

An individual account is established for each participant. The individual account is credited with contractor contributions made on the participant's behalf, and is adjusted for Plan earnings or losses, contingency allocations, and administrative and related expenses, if any. Allocations are based on individual account balances, as defined. Participants are immediately vested in their individual account balance. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Effective January 1, 2021, the Plan converted from a money purchase plan to a profit sharing plan. For those participants who accrued a balance prior to December 1, 2020, the individual account consists of two sub-accounts: (i) the money purchase plan account for contributions received prior to January 1, 2021, and the investment earnings thereon and (ii) the profit sharing plan account for contributions received after December 31, 2020, and the investment earnings thereon. If a participant first accrues benefits on or after December 1, 2020, the individual account will consist solely of the profit sharing account. Administrative fees are charged first to the money purchase plan account, if any, and the remainder of these charges, if any, to the profit sharing account.

Upon death, disability, retirement or separation from service for more than 12 consecutive months, participants and their beneficiaries are entitled to receive their account balance subject to the payment provisions of the Plan.

## **Note 1. Description of the Plan (continued)**

A participant may obtain a one-time hardship distribution upon determination of immediate and heavy financial need. The hardship distribution is limited to profit sharing contributions that have been held in the Plan for at least two years. Hardship distributions are limited to the lesser of 50% of profit sharing contributions or the sum required to satisfy the financial need.

Participants should refer to the summary plan description for more complete information.

## **Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

**Method of Accounting** - The accompanying financial statements have been prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

**Investments** - The investments of the Plan are reported at fair value. The fair value of a financial instrument is the amount that would be received to sell that asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (the exit price). Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Purchases and sales of the investments are reflected on a trade-date basis.

Dividend income is recorded on the ex dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis.

**Contributions Receivable** - Contractor contributions due and unpaid prior to year end are recorded as contributions receivable and include amounts for liquidated damages and underpayments. Contractor contributions due as determined by payroll compliance audits are recorded upon settlement with the contractor. An allowance for uncollectible accounts is considered unnecessary and is not provided.

**Property and Equipment** - Property and equipment are carried at cost. Major additions are capitalized while replacements, maintenance and repairs which do not improve or extend the lives of the respective assets are expensed currently. Depreciation is computed by the straight-line method over estimated useful lives of five years.

Depreciation expense was \$894 and \$1,422 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

**Revenue Recognition** - Revenue derived from contractor contributions is recognized in the period in which covered work is performed, based on the number of hours worked in covered employment and the contribution rates set forth in the collective bargaining agreement. Contractors are required to remit contributions monthly. The Plan carries out its purpose as described in Note 1 within a jurisdiction primarily located in the state of Illinois.

## **Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)**

**Reciprocal Contributions** - The Plan is signatory to reciprocity agreements with various multiemployer retirement plans for its participants who perform work outside the geographic jurisdiction of the district council. Participants who are normally employed within the territory of one local union (home local union) may be temporarily employed within the territory of another local union (reciprocating local union). When a participant of the home local union works in the territory of a reciprocating local union, the latter is to make contributions to the former's benefit plans on the participant's behalf. Monies received by the Plan on behalf of persons from outside participating local unions are forwarded to their home local union benefit plans. The Plan uses the same recognition and measurement criteria for contributions received on behalf of its participants under the terms of reciprocity agreements, as for all other contractor contribution revenue. Amounts paid to other plans under the terms of reciprocity agreements are not reflected in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits, as the amounts received are not revenue earned by the Plan, and the corresponding payments are not an expense of the Plan. The Plan recognizes a liability upon receiving reciprocal contributions on behalf of non-participants working within the jurisdiction of the local union and recognizes a decrease in that liability upon remitting those contributions to the appropriate plan. Contractor contributions included reciprocal contributions of \$239,343 and \$152,872 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, from various retirement plans under the terms of reciprocity agreements. The Plan remitted a total of \$168,705 and \$164,564 in reciprocal contributions to various other retirement plans under the terms of reciprocity agreements for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

**Payment of Benefits** - Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution. There were no participants who elected to withdraw from the Plan but were not yet paid at either December 31, 2024 or 2023.

**Expenses** - Certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

**Leases** - The Plan shares facilities with a related party, as described in Note 10. The Plan has determined that because the Plan has not directly entered into a lease and only reimburses a related party for shared facilities, the provisions of generally accepted accounting principles related to recognition of right-of-use assets and lease liabilities are not applicable to the Plan's arrangement. In addition, the reimbursements owed are not considered to be material to the financial statements.

**Estimates** - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Subsequent Events** - Subsequent events have been evaluated through August 20, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**Note 3. Priorities upon Termination**

It is the intent of the Trustees to continue the Plan in full force and effect; however, the right to discontinue the Plan is reserved to the Trustees. Termination shall not permit any part of the Plan assets to be used for or diverted to purposes other than the exclusive benefit of participants and their beneficiaries, except that provision may be made for the payment of necessary expenses resulting from termination of the Plan.

In the event of termination, all participants will remain 100% vested and the net assets of the Plan will be allocated to pay benefits in priorities as prescribed by ERISA and its related regulations. Whether or not a particular participant will receive full benefits should the Plan terminate at some future time will depend on the sufficiency of the Plan's net assets at that time and the priority of those benefits.

**Note 4. Tax Status**

The Plan's latest determination letter is dated February 25, 2016, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code and was, therefore, exempt from federal income taxes under the provisions of Section 501(a). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. The Plan's administrator and the Plan's legal counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code, and therefore believe that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the Plan to evaluate tax positions taken and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by tax authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for tax periods in progress.

## **Note 5. Fair Value Measurements**

The *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures* Topic of the Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification established a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The following describes the three levels of the fair value hierarchy:

### Basis of Fair Value Measurement

Level 1	Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible at the measurement date for identical, unrestricted assets or liabilities
Level 2	Quoted prices in markets that are not considered to be active or financial instruments for which all significant inputs are observable, either directly or indirectly
Level 3	Prices or valuations that require inputs that are both significant to the fair value measurement and unobservable

The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The following tables set forth, by level within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's investment assets at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. As required, assets and liabilities are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. In accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, certain investments that are measured at fair value using the net asset value per share (or its equivalent) practical expedient have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The fair value amounts presented in the following tables are intended to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the amounts presented in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Level 1 Measurements

The fair values of the Level 1 registered investment companies are determined by reference to the underlying assets, which are principally marketable equity and fixed income securities. Shares held are traded on national securities exchanges and are valued at the net asset value on the last business day of each period presented.

Short-term investments represent shares held in registered investment companies.

## **Note 5. Fair Value Measurements (continued)**

### Measurements Using Net Asset Value as a Practical Expedient

Certain investments are valued at the net asset value per share, used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. Net asset value is based on the fair values of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. The practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported net asset value.

The common collective trusts valued at net asset value are direct filing entities (DFEs) and file a Form 5500 annual report with the U.S. Department of Labor. The Plan is not required to disclose the significant investment strategies of DFE investments. Redemptions are available on a quarterly basis with a 45-day or 95-day notice period.

The fair value of one registered investment company has been estimated using the net asset value per share of the investment by reference to the underlying assets, which consist primarily of marketable fixed income securities. Redemptions are available on a monthly basis without notice.

## **Note 6. Investment Concentrations**

The Plan held a significant portion of its assets in one registered investment company, SEI World Equity Ex-U.S. Fund, which represented approximately 20% of the Plan's net assets available for benefits as of both December 31, 2024 and 2023.

## **Note 7. Risks and Uncertainties**

Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits. The current economic environment has increased the degree of uncertainty.

## **Note 8. Funding Policy**

The participating contractors contribute such amounts as are specified in the collective bargaining agreements, which vary depending on the type of work performed. The hourly contribution rates ranged from \$6.80 to \$10.70 for the year ended December 31, 2024, and from \$6.18 to \$9.68 for the year ended December 31, 2023.

**Note 9. Major Contractor**

Contributions from one participating contractor represented approximately 15% and 10% of total contractor contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

**Note 10. Related Organizations**

The Plan shares certain common governance with a district council and a welfare plan.

The Plan reimburses the district council for storage space. Reimbursed expenses totaled \$1,800 for each of the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The Plan shares facilities, equipment and staff with the related welfare plan. The shared expenses totaled \$164,832 and \$153,169 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Plan also reimburses the welfare plan for audit and legal fees and other costs associated with compliance audits. Reimbursed compliance audit fees and costs totaled \$15,710 and \$17,315 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During 2024 and 2023, the Plan also reimbursed the welfare plan for conference related expenses totaling \$13,571 and \$5,487 respectively. Amounts due to the welfare plan of \$27,554 and \$11,166 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, result from the differences between actual expenses and estimated payments.

Contributions for this Plan and related organizations are received and deposited into a lockbox account. On a regular basis, contributions due to the Plan are transferred from the lockbox into the Plan's cash account. The Plan continually monitors lockbox posting activity and makes adjustments as necessary. Contractors and participants are given credit based on reports submitted to the Plan office. Only routine contributions in process were due from the lockbox account at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Note 11. Party-in-Interest Transactions**

SEI is responsible for custody and management of certain Plan investments. Fees paid to SEI for these services represent party-in-interest transactions that are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.


