Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Les Olson Company, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of Les Olson Company, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 6 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the *Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Les Olson Company, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document and Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was created on January 1, 1979 and is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Les Olson Company, Inc. (the Plan Sponsor, Company or Employer) who are not covered by another plan. To be eligible to participate in the Plan, employees must have completed at least two months of service, except leased employees, employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement, and nonresident aliens. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

Contributions

Contributions to the Plan include: (i) salary reduction contributions authorized by participants, (ii) matching contributions made by the Company, (iii) discretionary profit-sharing contributions made by the Company, and (iv) participant rollovers from other plans.

Participants may elect to contribute a percentage of their eligible compensation, as defined by the Plan document, to the Plan each year, subject to the limitations of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Regular 401(k) contributions are excluded from the participant's taxable income for federal income tax purposes until received as a withdrawal or distribution from the Plan. Roth 401(k) contributions are not excluded from the participant's taxable income for federal income tax purposes, but withdrawals of contributions and earnings thereon at retirement are tax free. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 3% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. A participant's deferral rate is increased by 1% annually (up to a maximum of 6%), unless otherwise directed by the participant. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Company makes a matching contribution to each participant's account equal to 100% of the first 3% of each participant's contribution. Additional profit-sharing amounts may be contributed at the discretion of the Company's Board of Directors. During the year-ended December 31, 2024, the Company made a \$499,270 profit-sharing contribution to the Plan. To be eligible for the matching and discretionary profit-sharing contributions, a participant needs to have completed at least one year of service.

Participant Accounts

Participants direct the investment of their contributions and the matching contributions made by the Employer on their behalf into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Individual accounts are maintained for each participant of the Plan. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit-sharing contribution and Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. Participants may direct the investment of their account balance into various investment options offered by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. Prior to November 28, 2022, a participant became vested in the Employer's matching and discretionary profit-sharing contributions as follows:

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of one-half of the vested account balance or \$50,000. The loans are secured by an assignment of a participant's vested interest in the Plan, and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates at the time funds are borrowed as determined by the Plan Administrators. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions or as a lump sum for the outstanding loan balance. Loan terms range from one to five years; however, terms may exceed five years for the purchase of a primary residence. As of December 31, 2024, participant loans had maturities through 2029 at interest rates ranging from 4.50% to 10.50%.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual installments. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution.

Participants are also eligible to make hardship withdrawals from their deferred contributions in the event of certain financial hardships.

Forfeitures

When certain terminations of participation in the Plan occur, the nonvested portion of the participant's account represents a forfeiture. The Plan document permits the use of forfeitures to either reduce future Employer contributions or pay Plan administrative expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$10 and \$14,425, respectively. New forfeitures during 2024 totaled \$25,309.

Administrative Expenses

Plan administrative expenses may be charged directly to the Plan (either allocated to the participants or using forfeiture funds) or paid by the Employer. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan paid \$133,640 of administrative expenses. Certain administrative expenses are paid by the Company. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants become 100% vested in their accounts.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies***Basis of Accounting***

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared using the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for investments in securities that are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, currency exchange rate, credit, and the overall fluctuation in the market. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Investments in mutual funds are stated at fair value based upon quoted market prices. Investments in the common/collective trusts are stated at net asset value (NAV) per share as a practical expedient, which is based on the fair value of the underlying investments.

Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes realized and unrealized gains or losses on investments and is recognized in income currently. Amounts invested may earn interest and dividends, which in turn are reinvested. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as distributions when the participant has a distributable event.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid by the Plan.

Subsequent Events

Plan management has evaluated events and transactions occurring subsequent to year-end through July 31, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Fair Value Measurement

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Financial Accounting Standards Board established a framework for measuring fair value in the form of a fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes inputs into valuation techniques used to measure fair value into three broad levels. This hierarchy requires assets to be classified by level in their entirety based upon the lowest level of input that was significant to the fair value measurement. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are as follows:

- Level 1 Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.
- Level 2 Observable inputs other than Level 1 including quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in less active markets, or other observable inputs that can be corroborated by observable market data.
- Level 3 Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market activity for financial instruments with values determined using pricing models, discounted cash flow methodologies, or similar techniques, as well as instruments for which the determination of fair value requires significant management judgment or estimation.

4. Exempt Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by Empower Trust Company LLC, who is the trustee of the Plan, as well as Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, an affiliate of the trustee. These transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. The notes receivable from participants are also exempt party-in-interest transactions.

5. Federal Income Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Plan Sponsor by letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust were designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Investment Committee believes that the Plan continues to operate in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC and the Plan and related trust continue to be tax exempt. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

US GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by tax authorities. The Plan Administrators have analyzed the tax positions of the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there were no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements.
