Fusion Health 401(k) Plan Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1 – Description of Plan

The following description of the Fusion Health 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement, as amended, for a more complete description of Plan provisions.

General – The Plan is a 401(k) salary deferral and profit sharing plan covering substantially all employees of Fusion Healthcare Staffing, LLC and Tess II OpCo, LLC dba Fusion Advantage, (collectively the Company), and is subject to provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Fusion Healthcare Staffing, LLC is the Plan's sponsor and serves as Plan administrator. The Plan was newly formed and became effective on January 1, 2024.

Eligibility – Employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan upon reaching age 21 and become eligible for entry into the Plan on the first of the month following their hire date. Participants must complete at least 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year and be employed as of the last day of the Plan year, to be eligible to receive any employer paid profit sharing contributions.

Contributions

Participant contributions – Each year, participants may contribute between 1% and 90% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also elect to make Roth contributions utilizing after-tax contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 6% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated fund until elected otherwise by the participant. Unless elected otherwise by the participant, deferrals are automatically increased annually by 1%, up to a maximum auto-deferral of 10%.

Employer match and profit sharing contributions – The Company may elect to make discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions to the Plan. The discretionary matching contribution will not exceed 4% of the participant's eligible compensation. Profit sharing contributions are allocated to participants in the same proportion as a participant's compensation bears to the total of all participants' compensation. There were no profit sharing contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Employer safe harbor – The Company also makes safe harbor contributions equal to the sum of 100% of the participant's salary deferrals that do not exceed 1% of the participant's eligible compensation, plus 50% of the participant's salary deferrals between 1% and 6% of the participant's eligible compensation, regardless of the employee's hours of service or employment on the last day of the plan year. The safe harbor contribution for the year ended December 31, 2024 was \$387,529.

Contributions are subject to regulatory limitations.

Participant accounts – Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and Company safe harbor matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company’s profit sharing contributions, if any, and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account. Participants direct the investment of their account into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Vesting – Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company’s contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service and the type of contribution made by the Company. Participants vest in the Company’s contributions based on the following schedule:

Payment of benefits – On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant (or their beneficiary) may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest in his or her account or partial withdrawals determined by the Participant or their beneficiary. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. The Plan will automatically distribute balances for terminated employees with balances less than \$1,000.

Forfeitures – Forfeitures are the nonvested portion of a participant’s account that are lost upon termination of employment. Forfeitures are retained in the Plan, must be used in the subsequent year, and will first be used to pay the Plan’s administrative expenses, with any remaining amount used to reduce future Company contributions. As of December 31, 2024, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$779. For the year ended December 31, 2024, Company matching contributions were reduced by \$1,837 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting – The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP), using the accrual method of accounting.

Use of estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the use of estimates and assumptions that may affect certain amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Fusion Health 401(k) Plan Notes to Financial Statements

Investment valuation – The investments are reported at fair value. The Plan’s custodian, Transamerica Life Insurance Company Inc., certifies the fair value of all investments. If available, quoted market prices are used to value investments.

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (the “exit price”) in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Income recognition – Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. The net appreciation in fair value of investments consists of both the realized gains and losses and unrealized appreciation and depreciation of those investments.

Contributions – Contributions from participants and corresponding matching contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Payment of benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses – Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Administrative expenses paid by the Plan may include distribution fees charged to participants’ accounts and administrative Plan fees. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent events – The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through August 26, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

The plan was amended effective January 1, 2025, changing the eligibility service requirements to 90 days and the auto-enrollment deferral to 3%.

Note 3 – Investments

Pooled separate accounts – Units held in pooled separate accounts (PSAs) are valued using the net asset value practical expedient (NAV practical expedient) of the PSA as reported by the account managers. The NAV practical expedient is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the PSA, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. The PSAs can be redeemed daily, and there are no redemption restrictions or notice requirements. The fair value of the PSAs totals \$1,296,305 as of December 31, 2024.

Note 4 – Tax Status

The Plan document is a prototype standardized defined contribution plan that received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service on June 30, 2020, which stated that the plan, as then designed, was in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since the date of the opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

In accordance with guidance on accounting for uncertainty in income taxes, the Plan administrator has evaluated the Plan's tax positions and does not believe the Plan has any uncertain tax positions that require disclosure or adjustment to the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 5 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market volatility, and credit risks. It is reasonably possible, given the level of risk associated with investment securities, that changes in the values of the investments in the near term could materially affect a participant's account balance and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 6 – Information Certified by the Custodian

The following information related to investments was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by the Custodian, a qualified institution:

- Investments reflected on the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024.
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments reflected on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Investments reflected on the schedule of assets (held at end of year).

Note 7 – Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan paid expenses related to the Plan's operations and investment management to various service providers. Certain Plan investments are managed by Transamerica Retirement Solutions, LLC. Transamerica Life Insurance Company Inc. is the custodian of the Plan and an affiliate of Transamerica Retirement Solutions, LLC and, therefore, transactions with these entities qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

Note 8 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right to terminate the Plan and discontinue its contributions at any time, subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan is terminated, amounts allocated to a participant's account become fully vested.
