Note A – Description of Plan

The following description of the 401(k) Profit-Sharing Plan for Employees of Boys & Girls Clubs of Tampa Bay, Inc. (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Boys & Girls Clubs of Tampa Bay, Inc. (collectively, the “Company” or the “Employer”). The Plan was established effective September 1, 2018, and most recently restated effective January 1, 2024. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Employees become eligible to participate in the Plan when they are at least 21 years old and have completed 6 months of eligibility service as defined by the Plan. Eligible employees are allowed to enroll in the Plan on the first day of the month coinciding with or next following the date eligibility requirements are met. Employees that are non-resident aliens who do not receive any compensation from U.S. sources are excluded from the Plan.

The Company changed its Plan Custodian from Mutual of America Life Insurance Company to ADP Retirement Trust Services, LLC effective January 1, 2024. All Plan assets were transferred to ADP Retirement Trust Services, LLC on February 22, 2024.

Administration

The accounting records are maintained by the Company. The Plan’s assets for the year were maintained and administered by Mutual of America Life Insurance Company and ADP Retirement Trust Services, LLC (the “Custodians”). Contributions are held by the Custodians, who invest cash received, interest and dividend income, as directed by the participant, and make distributions to participants.

Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, subject to Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) annual limits. The maximum participant deferral for the year ended December 31, 2024 was \$23,000. A participant who has attained the age of 50 before the end of the plan year may also make catch up contributions, subject to Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) limitations of \$7,500 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

All employees who are at least 21 years old with six months of service are eligible to make pre-tax and Roth contributions to the Plan. The Employer elected to match 100% of participant deferrals up to a maximum of 3% of eligible compensation. Any salary deferrals that are “catch-up contributions” will not be matched. The matching Company contribution is invested into the various investment options of the Plan in accordance with the participants’ contributions.

The Employer will also make Employer nonelective contributions equal to 3% of eligible compensation. To be eligible to share in any Employer non-elective contributions, the participant must be at least 21 years old and have completed one year of service, defined as 1,000 hours in a twelve-month period.

The Plan also allows participants to contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans and Roth deferral contributions. Participants direct the investment of their contributions and Employer contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and the Employer’s nonelective or matching contribution amounts, if applicable. Each participant’s account shall be allocated earnings, gains, expenses, and losses with respect to the investments of the participant’s account. Allocations of Plan earnings or losses are based on each participant’s investment fund balance in proportion to the total investment fund balance.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferral contributions, as well as any rollover contributions, plus or minus any earnings or losses thereon. A participant's vested percentage in the portion of his/her account attributable to any Company matching and nonelective contribution plus actual earnings/losses thereon are 100% vested in the event of death, reaching retirement age, in case of permanent disability, or after three years of credited service as follows:

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account, or other acceptable collateral, and bear interest rate equal to 1% above the prime rate. The interest rate will be fixed for the duration of the loan. The maximum note repayment period is five years unless the note is for the purchase of a primary residence in which case the repayment schedule may be for a term in excess of five years. Principal and interest payments with respect to the notes are credited solely to the account of the borrowing participant from which the note was made. A participant may have two loans outstanding at one time and loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account.

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. The Plan Administrator shall consider a loan in default if any scheduled loan repayment is not made by the end of the calendar quarter following the calendar quarter in which the missed payment was due. In the event of a default, death, disability, or termination of employment, the entire outstanding principal and accrued interest shall be immediately due and payable. Unless the participant rolls over the loan, any default in repayment to the Plan will result in the treating of the balance due as a taxable distribution from the Plan.

Distribution of Benefits

In the event of termination of service, death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, as defined in the Plan agreement, less any applicable taxes. If a participant's vested balance is \$5,000 or less, the Plan Administrator will distribute the entire vested account balance to the participant without their consent. A participant, prior to termination, may elect a hardship distribution from their salary reduction contributions as defined in the Plan. Benefits are recorded when paid. Participants may request in-service distributions upon attaining age 59 ½. Benefits may also be received when a participant demonstrates a situation of financial hardship as defined in the Plan.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures occur when a participant terminates employment and has not vested in a portion of the Company's contribution amount. Forfeitures may be applied to reduce Employer contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled approximately \$0 and \$5,000, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company used approximately \$22,000 of forfeitures to reduce Plan expenses and Company contributions.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination of the Plan, each participant's account will become fully vested and non-forfeitable. All appropriate accounting provisions of the Plan will continue to apply until the accounts of all participants have been distributed.

Note B – Summary of Significant Account Policies

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements are presented on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("US GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and the changes in net assets available for benefits and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Valuation of Investments

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. If available, quoted market prices are used to value investments. Shares of pooled separate accounts are valued at the net asset value ("NAV") of shares held by the Plan at year end. See discussion at Note G on valuation of the guaranteed interest account.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Employer. Expenses that are paid by the Employer are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Fair Value Measurements

The Financial Accounting Standards Board has established a framework for measuring fair value in Accounting Standards Codification 820, Fair Value Measurements. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

<i>Level 1</i>	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
<i>Level 2</i>	Inputs to the valuation methodology include: Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
<i>Level 3</i>	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Common/collective trusts: Valued at NAV provided by the Custodians. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the trust, minus its liabilities, divided by the number of units outstanding. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. There were no unfunded commitments to purchase investments on December 31, 2024. Participant-directed redemptions have no restrictions and are recorded at the end of every business day.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at the NAV provided by the Custodians. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the trust, minus its liabilities, divided by the number of units outstanding. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. There were no unfunded commitments to purchase investments at December 31, 2024 and 2023. Participant-directed redemptions have no restrictions and are recorded at the end of every business day.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Mutual of America Life Insurance Company and ADP Retirement Trust Services, LLC, which are qualified institutions. As of December 31, 2024, and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan Administrator instructed the auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the information certified by Mutual of America Life Insurance Company and ADP Retirement Trust Services, LLC, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements, as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Note D – Party-In-Interest Transactions

Section 3(14) of ERISA defines a party-in-interest to include, among others, fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, or an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan. Certain Plan investments and the related transactions were in investment funds managed by the Custodians; therefore, these investments and transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Notes receivable from participants are also considered to be party-in-interest transactions because they are transacted with Plan participants. Fees paid to parties-in-interest by the Plan for services amounted to approximately \$7,000 during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note E – Income Tax Status

The Plan has received a determination letter from the IRS dated October 6, 2020 stating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. Subsequent to the issuance of the determination letter, the Plan was amended. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan, as amended, is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

The Plan Administrator evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded that the Plan had maintained its tax-exempt status and had taken no uncertain tax positions that require adjustment to the financial statements. Therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the accompanying financial statements. The Plan is no longer subject to examination by taxing authorities for years prior to 2021.

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The Plan invests in a group annuity contract, (General Account, “the Fund”). The Fund is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. As described in Note B, because the Fund is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the Fund. The investment are included in the financial statements at contract value as reported to the Plan by the Fund. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The Fund issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan,) (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures of spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transactions exempt under ERISA. The Plan Administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring. The guaranteed interest account does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.
