We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the **KiZAN Technologies, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan** (the “Plan”), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [“ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit”]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

(1) **DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of **KiZAN Technologies, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan** (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document and Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established by KiZAN Technologies, LLC (the “Company”) effective as of January 1, 2001, covering substantially all employees of the Company, who have completed 30 days of service and are age 18 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Contributions

Participants may make pre-tax and after-tax Roth elective salary deferrals up to 100% of eligible compensation, as defined in the plan document, subject to limitations imposed by Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) regulations. Eligible participants are also permitted to make special catch-up contributions in accordance with IRC regulations, and may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit plans, defined contribution plans or individual retirement accounts.

The Plan automatically withholds 4% of each eligible employee’s pay on a pre-tax basis. Employees can opt out of the Plan’s automatic enrollment provisions by providing written notice to the plan administrator. A participant may also withdraw automatic enrollment salary deferral contributions, and earnings thereon, without penalty, within 90 days after the date the first automatic deferral is made. Automatically enrolled participants have their contributions invested in a designated target date retirement fund until the investment election is changed by the participant.

The Company made discretionary matching contributions for the plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 equal to 50% of each participant’s deferrals, up to 4% of eligible plan compensation. Company contributions may also include discretionary employer profit sharing contributions. To be eligible for the annual discretionary employer profit sharing contribution an employee must be credited with at least 1,000 hours of service during the plan year and be employed by the Company on the last day of the plan year, unless the employee dies, becomes disabled or retires during the plan year. Discretionary employer profit sharing contributions of \$75,612 were made for the plan year ended December 31, 2023. There were no discretionary employer profit share contributions for the plan year ended December 31, 2024.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions and employer contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds, a pooled separate account, common/collective trusts and a group annuity contract as investment options for participants. Participants may change their investment elections at any time.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, employer contributions, and an allocation of plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of plan losses and administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant compensation, account balances or specific transactions, as defined in the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in employer contributions is based on years of continuous service as defined in the plan document. Participants are 100% vested in their employer contributions after five years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Participants may only have two loans outstanding at any time. Loan terms range from one to five years, or longer terms for loans used to purchase a primary residence. The loans are secured by the remaining balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a commercially reasonable rate of interest. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, participants may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of their vested account balance. The Plan also provides for in-service distributions for participants that have attained age 59½ and for financial hardships. Separated participants with vested account balances exceeding \$5,000 may elect to defer benefits until reaching normal retirement age.

Forfeited Accounts

Participants forfeit employer contribution accounts when terminating service prior to vesting in their employer contributions. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions and plan expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$0 and \$4, respectively. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaling \$20,203 and \$14,433, respectively, were used to reduce employer contributions and pay plan expenses.

(2) **SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“U.S. GAAP”).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from these estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan’s investments are stated at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for additional discussion of fair value measurements and Note 8 for additional discussion of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Capital gain distributions from mutual funds are included in dividend income. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments in mutual funds and common/collective trusts are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for these investments.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant’s account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document. The interest rates on notes receivable from participants outstanding at December 31, 2024 ranged from 4.25% to 10.50%.

Administrative Expenses

Some administrative expenses are paid by the Company, and some are paid by the Plan. Those that were paid by the Plan are reflected in the accompanying financial statements. Employees of the Company perform certain administrative functions for the Plan. Neither the Company nor its employees receive compensation from the Plan.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no allocated amounts to participants who had elected to withdraw from the Plan, but had not yet been paid.

Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated whether any subsequent events that require recognition or disclosure in the accompanying financial statements and related notes thereto have taken place through July 30, 2025, the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

(3) **FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”) Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observed for the asset; or inputs that are derived principally from or can be corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs are not available. Level 3 inputs are used only if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available. There are no plan assets requiring the use of Level 3 inputs for the periods presented.

Mutual Funds

The fair value of mutual funds is based on the quoted NAV of the shares as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds registered with the United States Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds must publish their daily NAV and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are considered to be actively traded.

Pooled Separate Account

Units in the pooled separate account are valued at fair value of the assets underlying the trust. The underlying assets in the Plan's pooled separate account investment consisted of mutual funds at December 31, 2024 and 2023. The fair value of mutual funds is based on the quoted NAV of the shares as reported by the fund. The mutual fund held by the Plan through the pooled separate account is an open-end mutual fund registered with the United States Securities and Exchange Commission. The fund must publish its daily NAV and transact at that price. The mutual fund held by the Plan through the pooled separate account is considered to be actively traded.

Common/Collective Trusts

Investments in the common/collective trusts are valued at the NAV of the units held by the Plan based on the fair value of the assets underlying the funds, as reported by the fund manager. NAV is used as a practical expedient for fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily, and there were no redemption or frequency restrictions on the common/collective trusts as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. In addition, there were no unfunded commitments related to common/collective trust investments at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Gains and losses included in changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, are reported in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

(4) RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Fees paid by the Plan to the custodians, service providers or affiliates of the custodians or service providers for the administration of the Plan are reflected in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. Administrative fees paid by the Plan to Principal Life Insurance Company were \$47,286 and \$36,178 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA.

(5) PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

(6) TAX STATUS

The Plan is based on a pre-approved plan which has received a favorable opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020, that the pre-approved plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The plan sponsor has not separately applied for a determination letter from the IRS. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

(7) RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in mutual funds, pooled separate accounts, common/collective trusts, and a group annuity contract that are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with the investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

(8) GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT

The Plan offers participants the option to invest in the Guaranteed Option Fund (the "Fund"), which is a group annuity contract that offers a full guarantee on principal and interest by Principal Life Insurance Company. The insurance company maintains the contributions in a general account, which is credited with earnings and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

Since the group annuity contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the group annuity contract. The group annuity contract is presented in the statements of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Principal Life Insurance Company. Such events include, but are not limited to, a spin-off, sale, merger, or full or partial plan termination. Plan management believes that the occurrence of events that would cause the Plan to transact at less than contract value is not probable. The Company was not aware of any events that would have limited the Plan's ability to transact at contract value at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Principal is contractually obligated to pay the principal and specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The interest crediting rate is reset semi-annually. The interest crediting rate in effect at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was 4.85% and 6.05%, respectively.

(9) INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIANS

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Management has obtained certifications from Principal Life Insurance Company and Principal Trust Company, the custodians, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information is complete and accurate.

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the **KiZAN Technologies, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan** (the “Plan”), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [“ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit”]. Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 9 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

(1) **DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of **KiZAN Technologies, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan** (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document and Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established by KiZAN Technologies, LLC (the “Company”) effective as of January 1, 2001, covering substantially all employees of the Company, who have completed 30 days of service and are age 18 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Contributions

Participants may make pre-tax and after-tax Roth elective salary deferrals up to 100% of eligible compensation, as defined in the plan document, subject to limitations imposed by Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) regulations. Eligible participants are also permitted to make special catch-up contributions in accordance with IRC regulations, and may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit plans, defined contribution plans or individual retirement accounts.

The Plan automatically withholds 4% of each eligible employee’s pay on a pre-tax basis. Employees can opt out of the Plan’s automatic enrollment provisions by providing written notice to the plan administrator. A participant may also withdraw automatic enrollment salary deferral contributions, and earnings thereon, without penalty, within 90 days after the date the first automatic deferral is made. Automatically enrolled participants have their contributions invested in a designated target date retirement fund until the investment election is changed by the participant.

The Company made discretionary matching contributions for the plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 equal to 50% of each participant’s deferrals, up to 4% of eligible plan compensation. Company contributions may also include discretionary employer profit sharing contributions. To be eligible for the annual discretionary employer profit sharing contribution an employee must be credited with at least 1,000 hours of service during the plan year and be employed by the Company on the last day of the plan year, unless the employee dies, becomes disabled or retires during the plan year. Discretionary employer profit sharing contributions of \$75,612 were made for the plan year ended December 31, 2023. There were no discretionary employer profit share contributions for the plan year ended December 31, 2024.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions and employer contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds, a pooled separate account, common/collective trusts and a group annuity contract as investment options for participants. Participants may change their investment elections at any time.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, employer contributions, and an allocation of plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of plan losses and administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant compensation, account balances or specific transactions, as defined in the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in employer contributions is based on years of continuous service as defined in the plan document. Participants are 100% vested in their employer contributions after five years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Participants may only have two loans outstanding at any time. Loan terms range from one to five years, or longer terms for loans used to purchase a primary residence. The loans are secured by the remaining balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a commercially reasonable rate of interest. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, participants may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of their vested account balance. The Plan also provides for in-service distributions for participants that have attained age 59½ and for financial hardships. Separated participants with vested account balances exceeding \$5,000 may elect to defer benefits until reaching normal retirement age.

Forfeited Accounts

Participants forfeit employer contribution accounts when terminating service prior to vesting in their employer contributions. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions and plan expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$0 and \$4, respectively. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaling \$20,203 and \$14,433, respectively, were used to reduce employer contributions and pay plan expenses.

(2) **SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“U.S. GAAP”).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from these estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan’s investments are stated at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for additional discussion of fair value measurements and Note 8 for additional discussion of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Capital gain distributions from mutual funds are included in dividend income. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments in mutual funds and common/collective trusts are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for these investments.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant’s account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document. The interest rates on notes receivable from participants outstanding at December 31, 2024 ranged from 4.25% to 10.50%.

Administrative Expenses

Some administrative expenses are paid by the Company, and some are paid by the Plan. Those that were paid by the Plan are reflected in the accompanying financial statements. Employees of the Company perform certain administrative functions for the Plan. Neither the Company nor its employees receive compensation from the Plan.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no allocated amounts to participants who had elected to withdraw from the Plan, but had not yet been paid.

Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated whether any subsequent events that require recognition or disclosure in the accompanying financial statements and related notes thereto have taken place through July 30, 2025, the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

(3) **FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”) Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observed for the asset; or inputs that are derived principally from or can be corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs are not available. Level 3 inputs are used only if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available. There are no plan assets requiring the use of Level 3 inputs for the periods presented.

Mutual Funds

The fair value of mutual funds is based on the quoted NAV of the shares as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds registered with the United States Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds must publish their daily NAV and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are considered to be actively traded.

Pooled Separate Account

Units in the pooled separate account are valued at fair value of the assets underlying the trust. The underlying assets in the Plan's pooled separate account investment consisted of mutual funds at December 31, 2024 and 2023. The fair value of mutual funds is based on the quoted NAV of the shares as reported by the fund. The mutual fund held by the Plan through the pooled separate account is an open-end mutual fund registered with the United States Securities and Exchange Commission. The fund must publish its daily NAV and transact at that price. The mutual fund held by the Plan through the pooled separate account is considered to be actively traded.

Common/Collective Trusts

Investments in the common/collective trusts are valued at the NAV of the units held by the Plan based on the fair value of the assets underlying the funds, as reported by the fund manager. NAV is used as a practical expedient for fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily, and there were no redemption or frequency restrictions on the common/collective trusts as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. In addition, there were no unfunded commitments related to common/collective trust investments at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Gains and losses included in changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, are reported in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

(4) RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Fees paid by the Plan to the custodians, service providers or affiliates of the custodians or service providers for the administration of the Plan are reflected in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. Administrative fees paid by the Plan to Principal Life Insurance Company were \$47,286 and \$36,178 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA.

(5) PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

(6) TAX STATUS

The Plan is based on a pre-approved plan which has received a favorable opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020, that the pre-approved plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The plan sponsor has not separately applied for a determination letter from the IRS. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

(7) RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in mutual funds, pooled separate accounts, common/collective trusts, and a group annuity contract that are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with the investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

(8) GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT

The Plan offers participants the option to invest in the Guaranteed Option Fund (the "Fund"), which is a group annuity contract that offers a full guarantee on principal and interest by Principal Life Insurance Company. The insurance company maintains the contributions in a general account, which is credited with earnings and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

Since the group annuity contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the group annuity contract. The group annuity contract is presented in the statements of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Principal Life Insurance Company. Such events include, but are not limited to, a spin-off, sale, merger, or full or partial plan termination. Plan management believes that the occurrence of events that would cause the Plan to transact at less than contract value is not probable. The Company was not aware of any events that would have limited the Plan's ability to transact at contract value at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Principal is contractually obligated to pay the principal and specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The interest crediting rate is reset semi-annually. The interest crediting rate in effect at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was 4.85% and 6.05%, respectively.

(9) INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIANS

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Management has obtained certifications from Principal Life Insurance Company and Principal Trust Company, the custodians, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information is complete and accurate.
