Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Gold Cross Services, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 8 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Basis for Opinion

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Gold Cross Services, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement, adoption agreement and summary plan description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Gold Cross Services, Inc. and affiliates (the Employer or the Plan Sponsor) who have reached a minimum of 18 years of age. The Plan, established effective January 1, 1987 and amended and restated effective January 1, 2022, is intended to be a qualified retirement plan under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of their pretax compensation as defined in the Plan, subject to the maximum amount allowable under the IRC of \$23,000 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Participants who have reached 50 years of age or older before the end of the Plan year were eligible to make additional catch-up contributions of \$7,500 for 2024. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions, and the related matching contributions made by the Plan Sponsor, into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Eligible employees automatically become participants and are enrolled into the Plan with a 5% deferral rate, unless they elect otherwise. These contributions are credited a designated target fund investment option, based on the participant's current age and normal retirement date. Participants can transfer money from the default investment at any time by electing an alternative investment.

The Plan allows for a discretionary matching contribution to each participant based on his or her elective deferrals in a percentage set by the Employer that is not in excess of 100% of each participant's contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Employer matched participant contributions 20% of eligible contributions.

Participants Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Employer's matching contribution, and an allocation of earnings, and is charged with withdrawals and an allocation of losses and expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants are always fully vested in their voluntary contributions. Employer matching contributions on elective deferrals and the actual earnings thereon become fully vested after 3 years of service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

A participant may borrow up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of his or her vested account balance, with a minimum loan amount of \$1,000. Loans are repayable over a period not to exceed five years, unless for the purchase of a principal residence, through principal and interest payroll deductions. The loans are collateralized by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates at the time funds are borrowed.

Payment of Benefits

Upon a participant's death, retirement, or termination of employment, a participant or his or her beneficiaries may receive a distribution equal to the vested balance in his or her account in a single, lump-sum cash payment, subject to the Plan's provisions. Upon termination of employment participant account balances less than \$5,000 may be automatically distributed without participant consent. Under certain circumstances, including financial hardship, participants may withdraw their contributions prior to the occurrence of these events.

Administrative Expenses

Plan administrative expenses may be paid by the Plan Sponsor or charged to the Plan and deducted from participants' individual accounts. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan paid \$66,277 in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures occur as of the earlier of (1) the last day of the Plan year in which the Plan Administrator distributes the participant's entire vested interest, or (2) the last day of the Plan year of the fifth consecutive break in service, as defined by the Plan. Forfeitures of terminated participant's non-vested accounts are used to pay administrative expenses and to reduce the Employer's contributions.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$33,298 and \$32,723, respectively. For the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeiture losses were \$23,175 and the forfeiture account had net investment loss of \$843. A total of \$21,757 Plan expenses were paid from forfeitures in 2024.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments in mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded. Investments in the collective investment fund are stated at net asset value (NAV) per share as a practical expedient, which is based on the fair value of the underlying investments. The fully benefit responsive fixed annuity (guaranteed investment contract) is recorded at contract value, which is calculated as contributions plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses, minus early withdrawal charges, which charges are contractually defined.

Net appreciation in the fair value of investments includes realized and unrealized gains on investments, and is currently recognized in income. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Dividends and interest are reinvested as earned.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are recorded at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest, and are secured by the participants' vested account balances. Interest income is recognized over the terms of the notes at the rate specified in the loan documents.

Fees related to notes receivable from participants are recorded as administrative expenses when they are incurred. If a participant defaults, the carrying amount of the note receivable from the participant is eliminated and a benefit payment is recorded at the time the participant has a distributable event. As of December 31, 2024, notes receivable from participants have maturities ranging from January 2025 through July 2048 and bear interest at rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%.

Risks and Uncertainties

In general, investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the accompanying statements of assets available for benefits.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid by the Plan.

Subsequent Events

The Plan Administrator has evaluated events occurring subsequent to year end through August 29, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Fair Value Measurements

Investments are reported in accordance with established authoritative guidance, which requires a three-level valuation hierarchy for disclosure of fair value measurements.

The valuation hierarchy is based upon the transparency of inputs to the valuation of an asset or liability as of the measurement date. The three levels are defined as follows:

Level 1 – Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2 – Observable inputs other than Level 1 including quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in less active markets, or other observable inputs that can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3 – Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market activity for financial instruments whose value is determined using pricing models, discounted cash flow methodologies, or similar techniques, as well as instruments for which the determination of fair value requires significant management judgment or estimation.

4. Fully Benefit Responsive Guaranteed Investment Contract

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract (GIC) with Empower Annuity Insurance Company. Empower Annuity Insurance maintains the contributions in a general account, which is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Accordingly, the GIC is considered a traditional investment contract. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 0 percent. The contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date. Since the GIC is fully benefit-responsive, it is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan’s prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination of the contract. Management has concluded that no events are probable of occurring that would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan’s investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

5. Party-In-Interest Transactions

The notes receivable from participants are exempt party-in-interest transactions permitted by ERISA.

6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

7. Federal Income Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a non-standardized prototype plan which has obtained a favorable tax opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated June 30, 2020, stating that the non-standardized prototype plan is qualified under the appropriate sections of the Internal Revenue Code.

Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Sponsor believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes is included in the accompanying financial statements.

Management evaluates tax positions taken by the Plan and recognizes a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. Plan management has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions that require either recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to audits by taxing authorities for tax years for which the applicable statutes of limitations have not expired. There are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

8. Information Certified by The Trustee

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under that election, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC (formerly known as Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company and Great-West Trust Company, LLC, respectively), the trustees of the Plan, except for comparing such information certified by the trustee to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule:

- All investment assets held by the Plan
- Notes receivable from participants
- The recording of Plan investment transactions and related income and loss

9. Subsequent events

Effective January 1, 2025 the Plan was amended to increase the automatic enrollment deferral rate from 5% to 6%. All covered employees with a current deferral between 0% and 5% were automatically enrolled at 6% deferral rate beginning February 26, 2025, unless they chose to opt out. All covered employees were given 30 days to choose a different contribution amount or opt out completely. In conjunction with this amendment, the Plan also increased discretionary matching contribution from 20% to 25% of eligible contributions.
