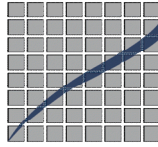

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Colorado Springs Radiologists, P.C. Profit Sharing Plan ("Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("Investment Information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency ("Qualified Institution"), provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Management has obtained a certification from a Qualified Institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified Investment Information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified Investment Information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("US GAAP").
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a Qualified Institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("US GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of the report. 1. PLAN DESCRIPTION

The following description of the Colorado Springs Radiologists, P.C. Profit Sharing Plan ("Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan, which became effective January 1, 2001, is a defined contribution and profit sharing plan covering all eligible employees of Colorado Springs Radiologists, P.C. ("Company"). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Eligibility

Eligible employees include all employees as defined in the plan document. Employees are eligible to participate after one year and 1,000 hours of service. Some long-term, part-time participants are also eligible to participate after meeting certain service requirements. Participants may enroll in the Plan on the first day of each quarter after satisfying eligibility requirements.

Contributions

Deferral contributions cannot exceed certain limits as set forth by the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") (\$23,000 in 2024 and \$22,500 in 2023; \$30,500 and \$30,000 for employees age 50 or older in 2024 and 2023, respectively). The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") adjusts this limitation each year as necessary for cost-of-living increases. Participants may change their contribution percentage throughout the year and may cease making contributions at any time. Rollover contributions are permitted by the Plan. Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

The Company makes a safe harbor contribution of 3% of eligible compensation to each eligible participant. The Company may also make discretionary profit-sharing and matching contributions to each eligible participant.

During 2024, the Company made discretionary profit-sharing contributions to eligible participants of 5.70% of eligible compensation up to \$168,600, plus 11.40% of eligible compensation in excess of \$168,600 up to \$345,000. During 2023, the Company made discretionary profit-sharing contributions to eligible participants of 5.70% of eligible compensation up to \$160,200, plus 11.40% of eligible compensation in excess of

\$160,200 up to \$330,000.

During 2024, the Company made discretionary matching contributions to eligible participants of 28.65% of employees' salary deferral amounts up to 6.00% of employees' compensation. During 2023, the Company made discretionary matching contributions to eligible participants of 25.82% of employees' salary deferral amounts up to 6.00% of employees' compensation.

Participant accounts

Each participant's account is increased with the participant's contributions, the Company's contributions, and allocations of plan earnings, and is decreased by the participant's distributions and an allocation of plan losses and expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and Company safe harbor contributions plus actual earnings thereon. There is a five-year graded vesting schedule for Company discretionary profit-sharing and matching contributions.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts in amounts from a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance less the highest outstanding balance of their plan loan during the last 12 months. The notes are secured by the participant's account balance and bear a reasonable rate of interest. The term is a maximum of five years, unless the note is for the purchase of a primary residence. Participants may not have more than two notes outstanding at any time. Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Payment of benefits

Upon termination of service, distributions may either be a lump-sum distribution of the entire vested balance or, for vested account balances in excess of \$5,000 and if elected by the participant, in periodic installments over a specified period not to exceed the life or life expectancy of the participant and/or the participant's designated beneficiary.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures may be used to pay plan expenses or reduce employer contributions. Total forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, totaled \$56,496 and \$0, respectively. Total forfeitures used to pay plan expenses during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, totaled \$47,148 and \$53,784, respectively. Unallocated forfeitures balances as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, totaled \$57,081 and \$127,795, respectively.

Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in the Company's discretionary profit-sharing and matching contributions.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("US GAAP") requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Income recognition

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Plan administrative fees

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements.

Tax status

The IRS has determined and informed the plan sponsor by a letter dated August 19, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the letter, the Plan administrator and tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

US GAAP requires plan management to evaluate income tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the income tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits in progress.

Subsequent events

Management evaluated subsequent events through the date of the attached independent auditor's report, the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce amounts that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although Plan management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. There have been no changes in the methodologies used between December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three levels.

Level 1 - Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities

Level 2 - Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities; quoted prices in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities

Mutual funds - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are considered to be actively traded.

Self-directed brokerage accounts - Valued at the closing price recorded on the active market on which the individually-owned securities are traded.
