1. Plan Description

The following brief description of the Five Points Bank 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is provided for general informational purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan was established to provide retirement benefits for the employees of Five Points Bank (the Company).

Employees are eligible to make pre-tax and after-tax Roth salary deferral contributions and to receive safe harbor matching and non-elective contributions. Permanent employees are eligible after attaining age 18 and may enter the Plan immediately. Temporary or seasonal employees become eligible once they have reached 1,000 hours of service in a given plan year.

Contributions

Participants are permitted to make voluntary pre-tax and after-tax Roth salary deferral contributions up to 75% of their eligible compensation as provided by the Plan, up to the maximum deferral dollar amounts allowed by law. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

Safe harbor matching contributions will be made equal to 100% of elective deferrals that are not in excess of 4% of compensation plus 50% of elective deferrals between 4% up to 6% of compensation. Additional non-elective contributions may be contributed at the option of the Company's Board of Directors. The non-elective contributions require a participant to be employed on the last day of the Plan year and have 1,000 hours of service in the Plan year.

Participants are automatically enrolled with a 2% salary contribution. Deferral amounts will increase 1% annually until a rate of 6% is reached. At any time, a participant can elect not to contribute or may increase or decrease their deferral rate to any rate allowed under Plan provisions.

Participants who are eligible to make pre-tax salary deferral and Roth after-tax contributions and who are projected to attain age 50 before the close of the calendar year shall be eligible to make catch-up contributions. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and a) Company safe harbor matching contributions, b) Company non-elective contributions, c) Plan earnings or losses, and d) an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. The Company's safe harbor matching contributions are allocated among participants based on each eligible participant's elected salary deferral. The Company's non-elective contributions are allocated among participants based

upon eligible compensation of eligible participants. Plan earnings or losses are allocated on the basis of actual results of the investments selected by each participant.

Investments are maintained in individual member accounts managed by Empower Trust Company, LLC (Empower).

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferrals plus actual earnings thereon, as well as Company safe harbor matching contributions. The Company's non-elective contributions credited to participants' accounts are vested based on years of continuous service. A participant is 20% vested after two years of credited service and vesting increases 20% per year until a participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination, retirement, disability, or death, the participant or beneficiary may elect to receive either a lump sum or installment payments equal to the value of the vested funds allocated to the participant's account. Hardship withdrawals and in-service distributions are also permitted by the Plan. The Plan requires that distribution payments between \$1,000 and \$5,000 be directly rolled over to an individual retirement account designated by the plan administrator in the event the participant does not elect otherwise. Distributions under \$1,000 will be paid out to the participant in the event the participant does not elect a payout option. Benefits are recorded when paid.

Forfeitures

Upon a participant's termination of employment before normal retirement, disability, or death, the portion of their Company contributions not then vested shall be forfeited. Forfeitures can also be created from over match of the Company's safe harbor contributions. The forfeitures account will be used to reduce the Company's contributions or pay plan expenses. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures of \$11,567 and \$17,468, were used to reduce Company contributions or pay plan expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested amounts totaled \$10,624 and \$9,240, respectively.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants currently employed may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes may not exceed five years unless it is a qualified home loan, and only two notes are allowed at any one time. The notes are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate based on the prime rate published in the Wall Street Journal on the first business day of the month of loan origination, plus 1%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

A summary of the significant accounting policies consistently applied in the preparation of the accompanying financial statements is set forth below.

Basis of Presentation

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Presentation of Participant-Directed Funds

The Plan's presentation of participant-directed investments is in accordance with the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 962, *Plan Accounting – Defined Contribution Pension Plans*.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Company determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and custodians. See Note 4 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued interest. Participant notes receivable are deemed past due and in default after a scheduled payment remains unpaid beyond the last day of the calendar quarter following the calendar quarter in which the participant missed the scheduled payment. These are treated as a deemed distribution from the Plan.

Other

Certain expenses of the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administrative activities are paid by the Plan and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Recordkeeping expenses, audit fees, and the fidelity bond premium are paid by the Company on behalf of the Plan.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events are events or transactions that occur after the statement of net assets available for benefits date, but before the financial statements are available to be issued and may require potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. Management has considered such events or transactions through August 1, 2025, noting no items requiring disclosure.

3. Information Certified by Empower

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the plan administrator instructed the Plan’s independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified by Empower, except for comparing such information certified by the custodian/trustee to information included in the Plan’s financial statements and supplementary information.

4. Fair Value Measurements

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
 - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The assets or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds and Money Market Fund: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their Net Asset Value (NAV) and to transact at that price. Mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective Trust Funds: Valued at NAV based on the fair value of its underlying investments. These funds contain investment contracts comprised of both underlying investment and contractual components which have observable level 1 or level 2 pricing inputs, including quoted prices for similar assets in active or non-active markets. FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurement* allows NAV per share to serve to estimate the fair value if certain requirements are met. It is the Plan’s assessment that these funds meet those requirements. Since the participants can redeem funds at NAV as of the measurement date daily.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Tax Status

The Plan is qualified as a profit-sharing plan under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code and is exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authority. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested. Distribution to participants of the account balances would be made as soon as practicable after the termination date.
