Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of University of Jamestown 403(b) DC Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter – Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule H, line 4i-schedule of assets held at end of year and schedule H, line 4a-schedule of delinquent participant contributions as of or for the year ended December 31, 2024, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- the form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following brief description of the University of Jamestown 403(b) DC Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering qualified employees of the University of Jamestown (University). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (the ERISA).

The Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

Eligibility

Employees are eligible to participate in elective deferrals immediately upon hire unless in an excluded class. Employees become eligible to receive matching contributions the month after they have met the requirements of working 250 hours during a three-month period and 21 years of age. Excluded employees are students enrolled and attending classes offered by the University.

Entry Date

Employees may enter the Plan on their first day of eligibility.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of their pretax annual compensation subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan allows participants to designate contributions as Roth contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover). The University may contribute a discretionary matching contribution. The University contributed 100% of the first 5% of eligible base compensation that a participant contributed to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and the University's discretionary matching contribution, as well as an allocation of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant's compensation, account balances, or specific participant transactions as defined by the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment to the Plan, a participant may direct employee and employer contributions in any of the funds offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in all contributions, plus earnings thereon.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts, a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates at the time funds are borrowed, as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through paycheck deductions over a period not to exceed five years, unless the proceeds of the note were used to acquire the participant's residence, in which case the Plan administrator may permit a 10-year repayment term. A participant may have no more than 3 outstanding notes at any one time. The following table sets forth a summary of notes receivable by service provider as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively:

Payment of Benefits

Participants may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of their vested interest, partial payments, or installments, as defined in the Plan document upon retirement, termination, death or disability. Distributions may be made at the participant's election prior to termination upon attainment of age 59 ½ or hardship as defined in the Plan document. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the University has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, all assets would be distributed among participants in accordance with Plan provisions.

Note 2 - Significant Accounting Policies and Use of Estimates**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The Plan Sponsor determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the custodians. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as those held during the year.

The classification of investment earnings (losses) reported in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits may differ from the classification of earnings (losses) on Form 5500 due to different reporting requirements on Form 5500.

Contributions

Participant contributions and the related University matching contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent notes receivable are recorded as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payments of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid by either the Plan or the University, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the University are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statement of changes in net asset available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent Events

The Plan Sponsor has evaluated subsequent events through August 19, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritized the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds (including money market mutual funds) - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Pooled Separate Account (TIAA Real Estate) - Valued at fair value based on the NAV of units as determined by the insurance company. The NAV is based on the observable market prices of the underlying assets within the account less liabilities. The NAV for the underlying assets of the account is a readily determinable measure of their fair value and is the basis for current transactions. The pooled separate account (PSA) generally invests in real estate properties and real estate-related investments. Accumulation units in the PSA are available for transactions at the closing accumulation unit value on any day the NYSE is open for business. Transfers out of the PSA are limited to one per calendar quarter. Although the underlying assets of the PSA cannot be quickly sold and converted to liquid assets, The TIAA General Account provides the PSA's with a liquidity guarantee.

Pooled Separate Accounts (TIAA Access Annuity and Equitable) - Valued at fair value based on the NAV of units as determined by the insurance company. The NAV is based on the observable market prices of the underlying assets within the account less liabilities. The NAV for the underlying assets of the account is a readily determinable measure of their fair value and is the basis for current transactions. Subaccount unit values are calculated daily. The underlying investments are generally valued using market quotations obtained from independent pricing services.

Fixed Annuity Contracts with Insurance Companies - The annuity contracts with an insurance company are not actively traded and significant other observable inputs are not available. Thus, the fair value of the annuity contract is determined using an income approach and discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar investments with comparable durations considering the credit worthiness of the issuer.

Variable Annuity Contracts with Insurance Companies - Fair value is determined on the value of the net assets in the separate subaccounts. The value of the net assets in the subaccounts shall be taken at their fair market value or where there is no readily available market, their value, as determined by dividing the net assets of each subaccount by the number of shares outstanding for each respective subaccount.

Guaranteed Investment Contract – The fair value of the non-fully benefit responsive guaranteed investment contract is measured using an income approach and discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar instruments with comparable durations considering the creditworthiness of the issuer.

Note 4 - Certified Information

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, dividends and interest, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by TIAA and CREF, Equitable Financial Life Insurance Company, Ameriprise Trust Company and RiverSource Life Insurance Company, Matrix Trust Company, Horace Mann Life Insurance Company, Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, Empower Life & Annuity Insurance Company of New York, and Empower Trust Company, LLC (the custodians).

Note 5 - Tax Status

The Plan uses a pre-approved plan document sponsored by Goldleaf Partners (now known as FuturePlan), which received an advisory letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated March 31, 2017, stating the pre-approved document satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. The Plan's management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 6 - Contracts with Insurance Companies

The Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit responsive group annuity contract (GAC) with TIAA and CREF, and a traditional fully benefit responsive guaranteed investment contract (GIC) with Empower Retirement LLC (formerly Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Company). TIAA and CREF and Empower Retirement LLC maintain the contributions in a general account, which is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and is charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The GAC and GIC issuers are contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer but may not be less than the guaranteed minimum rate of between 1% and 3%. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The GAC and GIC do not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

Because the GAC and GIC are fully benefit responsive, contract value is the relevant measure for the investment contracts. Contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value as reported to the Plan by the insurance companies represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, transfers, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The contract value of the investment contracts at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$360,927 and \$367,928, respectively.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan terminations or merger with another plan), (2) the assets held, or the participants covered under the contract are less than the amount, or number required for the Contract to be considered a GAC or GIC in the state in which the contract was issued, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under the ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and what would limit the ability of the Plan to transact value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuers to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, or (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuers.

Non-Fully Benefit-Responsive Contract

The Plan entered into investment contracts with TIAA and CREF, Ameriprise Financial Services, Equitable Financial Life Insurance Company (formerly AXA Equitable), and Horace Mann Life Insurance Company. As part of the contracts, the above listed custodians maintain a portion of the contributions in guaranteed accounts. The accounts are credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for Plan withdrawals and administrative expenses charged. The guaranteed accounts are included in the financial statements at fair value.

Note 7 - Related Party and Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are held and managed by the custodians, as defined by the Plan. As described in Note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are exempt party-in-interest transactions under the ERISA.

Note 8 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or global conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9 - Delinquent Participant Contributions

During 2024, the Company failed to remit to the Plan's trustee certain employee contributions totaling \$92,567 within the period prescribed by DOL regulations. Delays in remitting contributions to the trustee were due to administrative errors, and the Company has or will make contributions to the affected participants' accounts to compensate those participants for potential lost income due to the delay.

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of University of Jamestown 403(b) DC Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following brief description of the University of Jamestown 403(b) DC Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering qualified employees of the University of Jamestown (University). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (the ERISA).

The Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

Eligibility

Employees are eligible to participate in elective deferrals immediately upon hire unless in an excluded class. Employees become eligible to receive matching contributions the month after they have met the requirements of working 250 hours during a three-month period and 21 years of age. Excluded employees are students enrolled and attending classes offered by the University.

Entry Date

Employees may enter the Plan on their first day of eligibility.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of their pretax annual compensation subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan allows participants to designate contributions as Roth contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover). The University may contribute a discretionary matching contribution. The University contributed 100% of the first 5% of eligible base compensation that a participant contributed to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and the University's discretionary matching contribution, as well as an allocation of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant's compensation, account balances, or specific participant transactions as defined by the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment to the Plan, a participant may direct employee and employer contributions in any of the funds offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in all contributions, plus earnings thereon.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts, a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates at the time funds are borrowed, as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through paycheck deductions over a period not to exceed five years, unless the proceeds of the note were used to acquire the participant's residence, in which case the Plan administrator may permit a 10-year repayment term. A participant may have no more than 3 outstanding notes at any one time. Payment of Benefits

Participants may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of their vested interest, partial payments, or installments, as defined in the Plan document upon retirement, termination, death or disability. Distributions may be made at the participant's election prior to termination upon attainment of age 59 ½ or hardship as defined in the Plan document. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the University has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, all assets would be distributed among participants in accordance with Plan provisions.

Note 2 - Significant Accounting Policies and Use of Estimates**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The Plan Sponsor determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the custodians. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as those held during the year.

The classification of investment earnings (losses) reported in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits may differ from the classification of earnings (losses) on Form 5500 due to different reporting requirements on Form 5500.

Contributions

Participant contributions and the related University matching contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent notes receivable are recorded as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payments of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid by either the Plan or the University, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the University are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statement of changes in net asset available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent Events

The Plan Sponsor has evaluated subsequent events through August 19, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritized the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds (including money market mutual funds) - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Pooled Separate Account (TIAA Real Estate) - Valued at fair value based on the NAV of units as determined by the insurance company. The NAV is based on the observable market prices of the underlying assets within the account less liabilities. The NAV for the underlying assets of the account is a readily determinable measure of their fair value and is the basis for current transactions. The pooled separate account (PSA) generally invests in real estate properties and real estate-related investments. Accumulation units in the PSA are available for transactions at the closing accumulation unit value on any day the NYSE is open for business. Transfers out of the PSA are limited to one per calendar quarter. Although the underlying assets of the PSA cannot be quickly sold and converted to liquid assets, The TIAA General Account provides the PSA's with a liquidity guarantee.

Pooled Separate Accounts (TIAA Access Annuity and Equitable) - Valued at fair value based on the NAV of units as determined by the insurance company. The NAV is based on the observable market prices of the underlying assets within the account less liabilities. The NAV for the underlying assets of the account is a readily determinable measure of their fair value and is the basis for current transactions. Subaccount unit values are calculated daily. The underlying investments are generally valued using market quotations obtained from independent pricing services.

Fixed Annuity Contracts with Insurance Companies - The annuity contracts with an insurance company are not actively traded and significant other observable inputs are not available. Thus, the fair value of the annuity contract is determined using an income approach and discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar investments with comparable durations considering the credit worthiness of the issuer.

Variable Annuity Contracts with Insurance Companies - Fair value is determined on the value of the net assets in the separate subaccounts. The value of the net assets in the subaccounts shall be taken at their fair market value or where there is no readily available market, their value, as determined by dividing the net assets of each subaccount by the number of shares outstanding for each respective subaccount.

Guaranteed Investment Contract – The fair value of the non-fully benefit responsive guaranteed investment contract is measured using an income approach and discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar instruments with comparable durations considering the creditworthiness of the issuer.

Note 4 - Certified Information

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, dividends and interest, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by TIAA and CREF, Equitable Financial Life Insurance Company, Ameriprise Trust Company and RiverSource Life Insurance Company, Matrix Trust Company, Horace Mann Life Insurance Company, Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, Empower Life & Annuity Insurance Company of New York, and Empower Trust Company, LLC (the custodians).

Note 5 - Tax Status

The Plan uses a pre-approved plan document sponsored by Goldleaf Partners (now known as FuturePlan), which received an advisory letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated March 31, 2017, stating the pre-approved document satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. The Plan's management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 6 - Contracts with Insurance Companies

The Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit responsive group annuity contract (GAC) with TIAA and CREF, and a traditional fully benefit responsive guaranteed investment contract (GIC) with Empower Retirement LLC (formerly Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Company). TIAA and CREF and Empower Retirement LLC maintain the contributions in a general account, which is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and is charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The GAC and GIC issuers are contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer but may not be less than the guaranteed minimum rate of between 1% and 3%. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The GAC and GIC do not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

Because the GAC and GIC are fully benefit responsive, contract value is the relevant measure for the investment contracts. Contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value as reported to the Plan by the insurance companies represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, transfers, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The contract value of the investment contracts at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$360,927 and \$367,928, respectively.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan terminations or merger with another plan), (2) the assets held, or the participants covered under the contract are less than the amount, or number required for the Contract to be considered a GAC or GIC in the state in which the contract was issued, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under the ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and what would limit the ability of the Plan to transact value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuers to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, or (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuers.

Non-Fully Benefit-Responsive Contract

The Plan entered into investment contracts with TIAA and CREF, Ameriprise Financial Services, Equitable Financial Life Insurance Company (formerly AXA Equitable), and Horace Mann Life Insurance Company. As part of the contracts, the above listed custodians maintain a portion of the contributions in guaranteed accounts. The accounts are credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for Plan withdrawals and administrative expenses charged. The guaranteed accounts are included in the financial statements at fair value.

Note 7 - Related Party and Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are held and managed by the custodians, as defined by the Plan. As described in Note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are exempt party-in-interest transactions under the ERISA.

Note 8 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or global conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9 - Delinquent Participant Contributions

During 2024, the Company failed to remit to the Plan's trustee certain employee contributions totaling \$92,567 within the period prescribed by DOL regulations. Delays in remitting contributions to the trustee were due to administrative errors, and the Company has or will make contributions to the affected participants' accounts to compensate those participants for potential lost income due to the delay.
