Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of The Entwistle Company Employee 401(k) Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for plan benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of The Entwistle Company Employee 401(k) Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

Effective Date: January 1, 1983

Plan Year: January 1 through December 31

Coverage: All eligible employees of The Entwistle Company LLC and related divisions (the Company)

Plan Administrator: A representative of the Company is the Plan's administrator (Plan Administrator).

Eligibility: Effective September 1, 2021, the Plan was amended to allow all employees to be eligible for participation on the first day of the following month.

Contributions: A participant may authorize a basic participant contribution consisting of any whole percentage up to a maximum of 6% of the participant's annual compensation, subject to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) regulations. If a participant has authorized the maximum basic participant contribution of 6%, the participant may authorize an additional supplementary participant contribution consisting of any whole percentage of the participant's compensation up to a maximum of 84% of the participant's compensation to a combined maximum of 90% of the participant's compensation.

The employer shall contribute for each plan year from current or accumulated net profits on behalf of each participant in the Plan on December 31 of each plan year, an amount equal to 100% of the first 3% and 50% of the next 2% of the basic participant contribution authorized and deducted from the participant's compensation. A participant must be employed as the end of the plan year in order to receive an employer contribution.

For the year ended December 31, 2024, the total annual additions made with respect to a participant may not exceed the lesser of 100% of the participant's total compensation for the plan year or \$69,000.

Participants are also permitted to rollover account balances from other qualified plans.

Investment Elections: Each participant shall direct the investment of his or her account. Each participant shall elect among funds in various mutual funds or a common collective trust.

Vesting: All participant (including rollover) and employer contributions and the earnings thereon are 100% vested and nonforfeitable at all times.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Description of the Plan (Continued)

Withdrawals:	Withdrawals may be made from a participant's account at retirement, death, disability or upon termination of employment. If a participant terminates service, the entire vested amount in his or her account may be distributed or rolled over as directed by the participant. A participant may also request certain in-service withdrawals subject to eligibility as outlined in the Plan.
Hardship Withdrawals:	In accordance with a uniform and nondiscriminatory policy adopted by the Plan Administrator, a participant may withdraw a portion of his or her vested balance to meet immediate and heavy financial needs, subject to the certain limitations outlined in the Plan.
Pre-Retirement Death:	In the event of a death of a participant, his or her designated beneficiary will be entitled to receive 100% of the amount of his or her account.
Disability Benefit:	A participant who becomes disabled to the extent that he or she no longer remains an employee of the Company is entitled to receive 100% of the amount of his or her account.
Notes Receivable from Participants:	A participant is eligible to apply for a loan from his or her account in the Plan. The total amount of loans outstanding for an individual under the Plan cannot exceed the lesser of one-half of the participant's account or \$50,000. Most loans cannot exceed five years (10 years for a loan to purchase a principal residence) and carry a current market interest rate as determined by the Plan Administrator as of the issuance date of the loan.
Expenses:	All reasonable costs and expenses incurred for the administration of the Plan may be paid from plan assets; however, the Company has elected to pay the majority of administrative costs of the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024.
Plan Amendment:	The Plan was most recently amended with an effective date of January 1, 2024, to include 401(k) safe harbor matching employer contributions.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting: The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting standards set by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB). The FASB sets accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) to ensure net assets available for plan benefits and changes in net assets available for plan benefits are consistently reported. References to U.S. GAAP issued by the FASB in these footnotes are to the FASB Accounting Standards Codification (FASB ASC).

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment valuation and income recognition: The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants as of the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded when earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. In the statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits, the Plan presents the net appreciation in the fair value of investments, which consists of the realized gains or losses and the net unrealized appreciation on those investments.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Use of estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Payment of benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Notes receivable from participants: Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued, but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan.

Income taxes: U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan. Management evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded the Plan had maintained its tax exempt status and had taken no uncertain tax positions that require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. Therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the financial statements. With few exceptions, the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations by federal, state or local tax authorities for years before 2021.

Fair value measurements: FASB ASC 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures (FASB ASC 820), defines fair value and establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1: Inputs are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the reporting entity has the ability to access as of the measurement date.

Level 2: Valuations based on quoted prices in markets that are not active or for which all significant inputs are observable, either directly or indirectly.

Level 3: Prices or valuations that require inputs that are both significant to the fair value measurement and unobservable.

To the extent that valuation is based on models or inputs that are less observable or unobservable in the market, the determination of fair value requires more judgment. Accordingly, the degree of judgment exercised by the Plan in determining fair value is greatest for instruments categorized in Level 3. A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

Fair value is a market-based measure considered from the perspective of a market participant rather than an entity-specific measure. Therefore, even when market assumptions are not readily available, the Plan's own assumptions are set to reflect those that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability as of the measurement date. The Plan uses prices and inputs that are current as of the measurement date, including during periods of market dislocation. In periods of market dislocation, the observability of prices and inputs may be reduced for many instruments. This condition could cause an instrument to be reclassified from Level 1 to Level 2 or Level 2 to Level 3.

Valuation techniques: There have been no changes in the valuation techniques used during the current period.

Mutual funds: Mutual funds are valued at quoted market prices. These securities are categorized in Level 1 as they are actively traded and no valuation adjustments have been applied.

Common collective trust: The investment in the Fidelity Managed Income Portfolio Fund (the Fund) is stated at net asset value (NAV) per unit based on the fair value of the underlying assets of the Fund.

Note 3. Information Prepared and Certified by the Plan's Trustee

The following is a summary of the Plan's asset information as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, included throughout the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year), that was prepared by or derived from information provided by Fidelity Management Trust Company (Trustee) and furnished to the Plan Administrator. The Plan Administrator has obtained certifications from the Trustee that the information provided to the Plan Administrator by the Trustee related to the following assets is complete and accurate. Accordingly, as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to information related to the following assets:

In addition, the Fund permits participant-directed exchanges on a daily basis provided that the exchanges are not directed into a competing fund (money market fund and certain fixed income funds). With a competing fund, exchanges must be held in a noncompeting investment option for 90 days before transfer into a competing fund can occur. Nonparticipant-directed withdrawals that affect the partial or complete withdrawal of the Plan from the Fund may be delayed by the Fund at its sole discretion for up to 12 months from the date written notice is received by the Fund.

Note 5. Tax Status

The Plan obtained its latest prototype opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the IRS stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Note 6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

Note 7. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain investments of the Plan are shares of mutual funds and a common collective trust managed by the Trustee and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the balances in the participants' accounts, which also constitute party-in-interest transactions.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for plan benefits.

Note 9. Subsequent Events

The Company evaluates events occurring after the date of the financial statements to consider whether or not the impact of such events needs to be reflected and/or disclosed in the financial statements. Such evaluation is performed through the date the financial statements are available for issuance, which was July 21, 2025, for these financial statements.

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of The Entwistle Company Employee 401(k) Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for plan benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of The Entwistle Company Employee 401(k) Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

Effective Date: January 1, 1983

Plan Year: January 1 through December 31

Coverage: All eligible employees of The Entwistle Company LLC and related divisions (the Company)

Plan Administrator: A representative of the Company is the Plan's administrator (Plan Administrator).

Eligibility: Effective September 1, 2021, the Plan was amended to allow all employees to be eligible for participation on the first day of the following month.

Contributions: A participant may authorize a basic participant contribution consisting of any whole percentage up to a maximum of 6% of the participant's annual compensation, subject to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) regulations. If a participant has authorized the maximum basic participant contribution of 6%, the participant may authorize an additional supplementary participant contribution consisting of any whole percentage of the participant's compensation up to a maximum of 84% of the participant's compensation to a combined maximum of 90% of the participant's compensation.

The employer shall contribute for each plan year from current or accumulated net profits on behalf of each participant in the Plan on December 31 of each plan year, an amount equal to 100% of the first 3% and 50% of the next 2% of the basic participant contribution authorized and deducted from the participant's compensation. A participant must be employed as the end of the plan year in order to receive an employer contribution.

For the year ended December 31, 2024, the total annual additions made with respect to a participant may not exceed the lesser of 100% of the participant's total compensation for the plan year or \$69,000.

Participants are also permitted to rollover account balances from other qualified plans.

Investment Elections: Each participant shall direct the investment of his or her account. Each participant shall elect among funds in various mutual funds or a common collective trust.

Vesting: All participant (including rollover) and employer contributions and the earnings thereon are 100% vested and nonforfeitable at all times.

Note 1. Description of the Plan (Continued)

Withdrawals:	Withdrawals may be made from a participant's account at retirement, death, disability or upon termination of employment. If a participant terminates service, the entire vested amount in his or her account may be distributed or rolled over as directed by the participant. A participant may also request certain in-service withdrawals subject to eligibility as outlined in the Plan.
Hardship Withdrawals:	In accordance with a uniform and nondiscriminatory policy adopted by the Plan Administrator, a participant may withdraw a portion of his or her vested balance to meet immediate and heavy financial needs, subject to the certain limitations outlined in the Plan.
Pre-Retirement Death:	In the event of a death of a participant, his or her designated beneficiary will be entitled to receive 100% of the amount of his or her account.
Disability Benefit:	A participant who becomes disabled to the extent that he or she no longer remains an employee of the Company is entitled to receive 100% of the amount of his or her account.
Notes Receivable from Participants:	A participant is eligible to apply for a loan from his or her account in the Plan. The total amount of loans outstanding for an individual under the Plan cannot exceed the lesser of one-half of the participant's account or \$50,000. Most loans cannot exceed five years (10 years for a loan to purchase a principal residence) and carry a current market interest rate as determined by the Plan Administrator as of the issuance date of the loan.
Expenses:	All reasonable costs and expenses incurred for the administration of the Plan may be paid from plan assets; however, the Company has elected to pay the majority of administrative costs of the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024.
Plan Amendment:	The Plan was most recently amended with an effective date of January 1, 2024, to include 401(k) safe harbor matching employer contributions.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting: The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting standards set by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB). The FASB sets accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) to ensure net assets available for plan benefits and changes in net assets available for plan benefits are consistently reported. References to U.S. GAAP issued by the FASB in these footnotes are to the FASB Accounting Standards Codification (FASB ASC).

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment valuation and income recognition: The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants as of the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded when earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. In the statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits, the Plan presents the net appreciation in the fair value of investments, which consists of the realized gains or losses and the net unrealized appreciation on those investments.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Use of estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Payment of benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Notes receivable from participants: Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued, but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan.

Income taxes: U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan. Management evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded the Plan had maintained its tax exempt status and had taken no uncertain tax positions that require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. Therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the financial statements. With few exceptions, the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations by federal, state or local tax authorities for years before 2021.

Fair value measurements: FASB ASC 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures (FASB ASC 820), defines fair value and establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1: Inputs are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the reporting entity has the ability to access as of the measurement date.

Level 2: Valuations based on quoted prices in markets that are not active or for which all significant inputs are observable, either directly or indirectly.

Level 3: Prices or valuations that require inputs that are both significant to the fair value measurement and unobservable.

To the extent that valuation is based on models or inputs that are less observable or unobservable in the market, the determination of fair value requires more judgment. Accordingly, the degree of judgment exercised by the Plan in determining fair value is greatest for instruments categorized in Level 3. A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

Fair value is a market-based measure considered from the perspective of a market participant rather than an entity-specific measure. Therefore, even when market assumptions are not readily available, the Plan's own assumptions are set to reflect those that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability as of the measurement date. The Plan uses prices and inputs that are current as of the measurement date, including during periods of market dislocation. In periods of market dislocation, the observability of prices and inputs may be reduced for many instruments. This condition could cause an instrument to be reclassified from Level 1 to Level 2 or Level 2 to Level 3.

Valuation techniques: There have been no changes in the valuation techniques used during the current period.

Mutual funds: Mutual funds are valued at quoted market prices. These securities are categorized in Level 1 as they are actively traded and no valuation adjustments have been applied.

Common collective trust: The investment in the Fidelity Managed Income Portfolio Fund (the Fund) is stated at net asset value (NAV) per unit based on the fair value of the underlying assets of the Fund.

Note 3. Information Prepared and Certified by the Plan's Trustee

The following is a summary of the Plan's asset information as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, included throughout the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year), that was prepared by or derived from information provided by Fidelity Management Trust Company (Trustee) and furnished to the Plan Administrator. The Plan Administrator has obtained certifications from the Trustee that the information provided to the Plan Administrator by the Trustee related to the following assets is complete and accurate. Accordingly, as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to information related to the following assets:

In addition, the Fund permits participant-directed exchanges on a daily basis provided that the exchanges are not directed into a competing fund (money market fund and certain fixed income funds). With a competing fund, exchanges must be held in a noncompeting investment option for 90 days before transfer into a competing fund can occur. Nonparticipant-directed withdrawals that affect the partial or complete withdrawal of the Plan from the Fund may be delayed by the Fund at its sole discretion for up to 12 months from the date written notice is received by the Fund.

Note 5. Tax Status

The Plan obtained its latest prototype opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the IRS stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Note 6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

Note 7. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain investments of the Plan are shares of mutual funds and a common collective trust managed by the Trustee and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the balances in the participants' accounts, which also constitute party-in-interest transactions.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for plan benefits.

Note 9. Subsequent Events

The Company evaluates events occurring after the date of the financial statements to consider whether or not the impact of such events needs to be reflected and/or disclosed in the financial statements. Such evaluation is performed through the date the financial statements are available for issuance, which was July 21, 2025, for these financial statements.
