Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the Martel Construction 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Martel Construction 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The Plan was originally effective on January 1, 1993, and has subsequently been amended and restated to conform the Plan to current tax laws. Effective May 1, 2022, the Plan was restated pursuant to the cycle three restatement period and includes an addendum intended as a good faith effort to comply with the requirements of the Further Consolidated Appropriations Act, including the SECURE Act provisions, the Coronavirus, Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act and the Consolidated Appropriations Act.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all full-time employees of Martel Construction, Inc. (the Company). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) as amended.

Eligibility

An employee will enter the Plan on the first day of the calendar month subsequent to satisfying a 90 day waiting period. The Plan allows for automatic enrollment and automatic escalation. If no affirmative deferral election is made, an eligible employee shall be deemed to make a pre-tax contribution of five percent per pay period. The automatic deferral provision applies to all newly eligible participants. An automatic one percent increase to the salary deferral election will occur annually up to a maximum of ten percent.

Plan Administration

The administration of the Plan is the responsibility of the Plan Sponsor. All money that is contributed to the Plan is held for the benefit of the participants.

Contributions

Participants may contribute a percent of pre-tax and post-tax Roth elective deferrals into the Plan, up to 100% of qualified compensation (subject to the maximum limits set by the Internal Revenue Service). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing rollover distributions from certain other qualified retirement plans. Rollover contributions were \$94,637 and \$1,170 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Plan Sponsor may elect to make discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions to eligible participants. Participants are eligible to receive discretionary Company contributions upon satisfying one year of service and 1,000 hours. Effective June 1, 2024, Plan entry eligibility was amended for discretionary company contributions to the first day of the calendar month subsequent to meeting the eligibility requirements. The Company made matching contributions of \$231,798 and \$174,897 to eligible participants for the years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Company made profit sharing contributions of \$100,313 and \$100,000 to the Plan for the years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. Loan terms range from 1-5 years or a longer reasonable period of time no greater than 30 years for the purchase of a primary residence.

Notes Receivable from Participants (Continued)

The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Interest rates are prime plus 2%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, employer contributions, and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferral contributions and Davis-Bacon contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the employer matching or the Company's profit sharing contribution portions of their accounts are based on years of continuous service. A participant is 20% vested after two years of covered service and vesting increases 20% for each year of covered service thereafter. A participant is 100% vested after six years of covered service.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service a participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Additionally, a participant may elect to receive partial installment distributions over a specified period of time not to exceed the life expectancy of the participant.

Forfeited Accounts

Nonvested forfeited accounts may be used to restore forfeitures, reduce future employer contributions or pay Plan expenses. In the Plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, amounts forfeited were \$5,738 and \$2,741, respectively. In the Plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures used to pay Plan expenses were \$6,540 and \$0, respectively. Forfeitures available to be used were \$1,330 and \$2,619 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition (Continued)

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to a fully benefit-responsive investment contract because contract value is the amount the participant would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The financial statements are prepared on the contract value basis for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are recorded at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the loan is reclassified as a distribution based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the employer contributions from the Company are based on eligible compensation paid during the year.

Plan Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by Martel Construction, Inc. Expenses that are paid by Martel Construction, Inc. are excluded from these financial statements.

Benefit Payments

Deductions for benefits are recorded when paid.

3. CERTIFIED INFORMATION

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Investment information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and schedule including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, dividends, and gains on sales of assets for the years then ended were obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Empower Annuity Insurance Company and Empower Company, LLC, the qualified institutions.

Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the following information was not subjected to any auditing procedures performed by the independent public accountants, except for comparing such information certified by the qualified institutions to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule:

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the “Fair Value Measurements” under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted market prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - inputs to the valuation methodology include (a) quoted market prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, (b) quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets, (c) inputs other than quoted market prices that are observable for the asset or liability, or (d) inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - inputs to the valuation methodology that are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Registered investment companies: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year end.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan maintains a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America. The account is credited with all contributions made by or on behalf of the participants, all interest credited to the fixed account on an annual effective basis pursuant to the guaranteed interest rate applicable, any amounts transferred or distributed from the account and applicable charges and fees. The contract is included in the financial statements at contract value as reported to the Plan. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

As described in Note 2, because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The contract value of the investment contract was \$815,565 and \$1,281,145 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than 0%. Such interest rates are reviewed for resetting. The average yields earned by the fixed annuity investment contract were 2.36% and 2.18% for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include but may not be limited to a participant termination of employment due to: (1) removal of a group of participants from Plan coverage as a result of temporary absence; (2) change in position or other occurrence qualifying as a temporary break in service under the Plan; (3) transfer or other change of position resulting in employment by an entity controlling, controlled by, or under common control with the employer; or (4) cessation of an employment relationship resulting from a reorganization, merger, layoff or the sale or discontinuance of all or any part of the Plan Sponsor's business. Such events also include: (1) removal from the Plan of one or more groups or classifications of participants; (2) partial or complete Plan termination; or (3) Plan disqualification.

6. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan paid service provider fees of \$31,204 and \$19,361 to Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Additionally, the Plan paid investment advisor fees of \$21,259 and \$17,702 to LPL Financial as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Additionally, the Plan paid plan administration fees of \$12,367 and \$4,023 to United Pension Administration as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

7. TAX STATUS

The Plan is operating under a Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing/Money Purchase/CODA Plan that obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Since then, the Plan has been amended, however, the Plan administrator and the Plan trustees believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, they believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

7. TAX STATUS (Continued)

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by applicable taxing authorities. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken or expected to be taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no such tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

8. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts and the assets will be distributed to participants in proportion to their respective account balances.

9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

10. DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS

Certain participant contributions were remitted to the Plan later than shown possible. The Plan is in the process of making the corrections for the year listed below outside of the Voluntary Fiduciary Correction Program (VFCP). Late contributions identified totaled \$75 and \$0 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

11. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Effective May 1, 2025, the Loan Policy was amended to only allow a loan to be refinanced once.

Management has evaluated subsequent events through August 20, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Management determined there were no other subsequent events that required reporting in the financial statements.
