Note 1 - Plan Description

The following brief description of the Team Wireless 401k Plan (Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the plan document for more complete information.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution pension plan covering substantially all employees of Team Wireless (Company) who have six months of eligible service and are at least 18 years of age. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) as amended.

Contributions

Participants may defer up to 100% of their compensation as a pre-tax or Roth contribution each year not to exceed the thresholds set by the Internal Revenue Code. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans and certain IRAs (rollovers). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an automatic deferral feature, and accordingly, the plan sponsor will automatically withhold 3% of eligible participants' compensation and contribute that amount to the Plan as a pre-tax 401(k) deferral unless the participant elects not to defer or enters into a salary reduction agreement with an alternative percentage of withholding. The Plan is designed to qualify as a safe harbor plan and the Company contributes 100% of the first 4% of plan compensation and 50% up to the next 2% of plan compensation. The Company's matching contributions were \$661,826 and \$598,948 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Additional amounts may be contributed at the option of the Company's board of directors. No additional amounts were contributed during 2024 and 2023.

Participant Accounts and Rollovers

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, an allocation of the Company's matching and profit sharing contributions and Plan earnings/losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. The Plan permits the transfer of funds from other qualified plans to a separate participant's rollover account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and related earnings. Safe harbor contributions vest on a two-year cliff and participants would be fully vested after the second year. Additional company contributions vest on a six year tiered schedule starting at 20% after year one.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant (or beneficiary in the case of death) may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum amount. If the value of the vested benefit is less than \$5,000, however, a lump-sum distribution will be made regardless of whether or not consent has been obtained from the participant. The Plan permits hardship distributions if certain criteria are met. The Plan permits in-service distributions at age 59½.

Forfeited Accounts

Plan forfeitures arise as a result of participants who terminate service from the Company before becoming 100% vested in the Company's contributions and related earnings. Forfeitures are used for the restoration of prior participant forfeitures or are allocated to all participants eligible to share in the allocations in the same proportion that each participant's compensation for the year bears to the compensation of all participants for such year. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were forfeited balances of \$9,744 and \$148, respectively. There was \$27,346 and \$7,794 of forfeitures used for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The Plan's significant accounting policies consistently applied in the preparation of the accompanying financial statements follows.

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared using the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value or net asset value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or be paid to transfer a liability in an ordinary transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Net asset value is the fair market value of a mutual fund or exchange traded fund's underlying holdings, minus its liabilities, divided by the number of outstanding shares and represents the net worth of a fund on a per share basis and is used to determine shares at the end of a trading day. The Plan's investment committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor and custodian. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year as well as interest and dividend income.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through August 25, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Income Taxes

The Company adopted the volume submitter prototype non-standard 401(k) profit sharing plan, described in Note 1. The prototype has received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service on June 30, 2020. As such, the Plan qualifies under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Service Code and, therefore, is not subject to tax under present income tax laws. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and to recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

The Financial Accounting Standards Board has established a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

- Level 1 Quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access as of the measurement date.

- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; or inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common Collective Trust Funds: Valued at the NAV of units of a common collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. The NAV readily determinable fair value was used, since it was determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the common collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Fixed Account: Valued daily based on the valuation method disclosed in the account contract as calculated. Thus, mutual funds are valued at level 2 as not immediately determined.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of other methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5 - Party-in-Interest Transactions

Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (Empower) and John Hancock Life Insurance Company (John Hancock), prior to November 7, 2023, are custodians of the Plan. Empower is the custodian at December 31, 2024 and 2023 (John Hancock prior to November 7, 2023) as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for the investment management and recordkeeping services to the custodians amounted to \$30,737 and \$20,913 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Additional investment fees paid to the custodians are included in net appreciation in the fair value of investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. Certain employees and officers of the Company, who are also participants in the Plan, perform administrative services to the Plan at no cost to the Plan.

Note 5 - Party-in-Interest Transactions (Continued)

Empower and John Hancock received certain administrative services to the Plan pursuant to a Master Plan Services Agreement (MSA) between the Company and Empower and John Hancock. Empower and John Hancock receive revenue from fund service providers for services Empower and John Hancock provide to the funds. This revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to Empower and John Hancock for their administrative services to the Plan.

If the revenue received by Empower and John Hancock from such fund service providers exceeds the amount owed under the MSA, Empower and John Hancock remit the excess to the Plan's trust on a quarterly basis. Such amounts may be applied to pay plan administrative expenses or allocated to the accounts of the participants. During 2024 and 2023, there were no excess amounts. The Plan or Company may make a payment to Empower and John Hancock for administrative expenses not covered by revenue sharing.

Note 6 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 7 - Information Certified by Plan's Custodians

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments held by the Plan at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest and dividends for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and John Hancock Life Insurance Company prior to November 7, 2023.

Note 8 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
