Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audits does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the Plan; and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audits, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules, Schedule H, Line 4a – Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions as of December 31, 2024, and Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such

information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion—

- the form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to, or is derived from, the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS Years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023

1. Plan description

The following brief description of the Hays Automotive Group (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more comprehensive description of the Plan's provisions. Copies of the Plan Agreement are available from Town & Country Ford, LLC (Louisville, Kentucky).

General – The Plan is a contributory defined contribution plan covering all employees of Town & Country Ford, LLC (Louisville, Kentucky), Town & Country Ford, Inc. (Evansville, Indiana), Town & Country Ford, Inc. (Nashville, Tennessee), Hays Automotive Supervision, Inc., Hays Nissan, Inc., and Commonwealth Dodge, LLC (collectively, the Companies) who have completed one year of service and are age 21 or older. The Plan is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

Contributions – Participants may contribute up to the maximum salary deferral set by law. Participants may also contribute after-tax Roth deferrals and amounts representing rollover distributions from other qualified plans. The Plan requires the Companies to match 25% of each participant's contribution up to 4% of each participant's annual compensation. The Plan also requires a 4% automatic deferral for all employees who become eligible to participate in the Plan. Those employees are subject to the automatic deferral unless they file an election to either not participate or elect a different deferral percentage.

Participant accounts – All contributions are allocated at the discretion of the participant among selected investments. Each participant's interest in each of the investment accounts is accounted for in four separate accounts: one each relating to the participant's pre-tax contributions, Roth contributions, and rollover contributions, and the Companies' contributions. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of the Companies' contributions and plan earnings, and charged with allocations of investment-related fees and administration expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting – Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and related earnings. Vesting in the Companies' matching portions of their accounts and the related earnings is based on years of service. A participant is fully vested with regard to the Companies' contributions and related earnings after six years of credited service, as defined in the Plan Agreement. Participant rollover contributions from previous plans are fully vested. A participant becomes fully vested in the event of death, disability, or attainment of early retirement age, as defined in the Plan Agreement.

Payment of benefits – In the event of death, disability, retirement, or termination, a participant's benefit will be distributed in accordance with specific provisions of the Plan Agreement. In-service distributions and hardship withdrawals are also permitted upon meeting certain requirements, as defined in the Plan Agreement.

Forfeitures – Nonvested portions of the Companies' matching contribution accounts are applied to reduce the Companies' administration expenses and the Companies' future matching contributions. Forfeitures totaling \$7,106 and \$7,204 were applied to reduce the Companies' administration expenses for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, and forfeitures totaling \$2,655, and \$1,505 were applied to reduce the Companies' matching contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Forfeited nonvested amounts total \$2,920 and \$7,742 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Administration – Certain administrative functions are performed by the Companies' officers and employees. No such officers or employees receive compensation from the Plan. Certain accounting, legal, and other expenses to maintain the Plan's records are paid by the Companies and are therefore not reported as expenses on the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. Administration expenses reported on the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits represent recordkeeping fees charged by the Plan's third-party administrator.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies

Basis of accounting – The Plan's financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Contributions and credit losses – Participant contributions are recorded when the Companies compute payroll deductions. The Companies' contributions are recorded based on amounts actually received or committed to be paid for the year. Contributions to the Plan are recorded net of any credit losses provided for on the basis of anticipated collection losses. Estimated losses are determined from historical collection experience, review of current period outstanding receivables, and projection of future activity in the allowance for credit losses. The Plan's management has determined that the Plan is not exposed to significant credit loss risk as the Plan's contributions represent only amounts from the Plan's participants and the Companies' contributions. Accordingly, there is no provision for credit losses, no write-offs, or recoveries collected during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Investment valuation and income recognition – The Plan’s investments are held under contract with Principal Life Insurance Company (PLIC) and its affiliates, Principal Global Investors Trust Company (PGITC), and Delaware Charter Guarantee Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company (PTC), the Plan’s investment custodians.

The Plan’s investments in mutual funds are valued at fair value based on quoted market prices on the measurement date as more fully described in Note 4.

The Plan’s investments in pooled separate accounts and collective investment trusts represent units of underlying investments which are valued at fair value based on quoted market prices or by a third-party valuation agent on the measurement date as more fully described in Note 4.

The Plan’s Fixed Income Guaranteed Option (FIGO) is a single group annuity contract with a fixed rate of interest and is considered a fully benefit-responsive investment contract under GAAP. Accordingly, the Plan’s investment in the FIGO is reported at contract value as more fully described in Note 4. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would normally receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the contract terms.

Realized gains and losses on the Plan’s investments are recognized upon the sale of the related investments, and unrealized appreciation or depreciation is recognized at period end when the carrying values of the related investments are adjusted to their estimated fair values. Net realized and unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the fair values of the Plan’s investments includes gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Certain investment-related fees charged to the Plan are deducted from income earned on investments and are not separately reflected on the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. Consequently, investment return is reflected net of those investment-related fees on the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Benefit and withdrawal payments – Benefit and withdrawal payments are recorded when paid.

Fair value measurements – The Plan applies the *Fair Value Measurement* topic of the Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) which requires determination of fair value based on the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants as of the measurement date. The *Fair Value Measurement* topic emphasizes that fair value is a market-based measurement, not an entity-specific measurement, and it applies in conjunction with other ASC topics that require or permit fair value measurements and disclosures. Impacted assets and liabilities are measured and disclosed in one of three categories based on the significance and source of

the inputs to their valuation. The hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1, Level 2, and Level 3. Level 1 inputs have the highest priority and consist of observable unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access. Level 2 inputs include: a) quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; b) quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; c) inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and d) inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. Level 3 inputs have the lowest priority, are unobservable, and include judgments about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability.

An asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to its fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The Plan's management uses specific valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair values of the Plan's impacted assets and liabilities. When available, the Plan's management measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value.

These methods may produce fair value calculations that may not be indicative of net realizable values, or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan's management believes the valuation methods utilized are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair values of certain assets and liabilities could result in different fair value measurements as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Subsequent events – The Plan's management has evaluated subsequent events through September 2, 2025, the date the financial statements were available for issue.

3. Information certified by plan investment custodians

The Plan's administrator has elected the method of annual reporting as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net realized and unrealized appreciation in fair value of investments, and interest and dividend income for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by PLIC, PGITC, and PTC, the Plan's investment custodians. This information has not been audited by the Plan's independent auditors.

4. Investments, contract with insurance company, and fair value measurements

The Plan's investments are credited with earnings on the underlying investments, and charged for plan withdrawals, investment-related fees, and administration expenses.

The Plan's shares in mutual funds are publicly traded and are valued at the measurement date of the security reported on the principal exchange on which traded (Level 1 input). The mutual funds may be redeemed on a daily basis. Unfunded commitments are not applicable to mutual funds.

The Plan's pooled separate accounts have the characteristics of a structure similar to a mutual fund and are valued at a readily determinable quoted market price that each account publishes at the end of each day. While the pooled separate accounts have publicly quoted Level 1 pricing inputs, the pooled separate accounts are not publicly traded, and therefore, are classified as Level 2 investments in the fair value hierarchy. Amounts allocated within a pooled separate account are credited to a participant's account in the form of accumulation units. The fair value of an accumulation unit of each pooled separate account that is determined and published at the close of each business is directly related to the fair values of the underlying investments adjusted for any contributions, dividends and/or distributions received, withdrawals made on that day, and the daily equivalent of any fee charged pursuant to the contract. The pooled separate accounts may be redeemed on a daily basis. Unfunded commitments are not applicable to pooled separate accounts.

The Plan's collective investment trusts have the characteristics of a structure similar to a mutual fund, are valued at a readily determinable quoted market price that each collective investment trust publishes at the end of each day, and generally invest in mutual funds, PLIC's pooled separate accounts, and other collective trust funds. The collective investment trusts are not publicly traded, and therefore, are classified as Level 2 investments in the fair value hierarchy. Amounts allocated within a collective investment trust are credited to a participant's account in the form of accumulation units. The fair value of an accumulation unit of each collective investment trust that is determined and published at the close of each business day is directly related to the fair values of the underlying investments adjusted for any contributions, dividends and/or distributions received, withdrawals made on that day, and the daily equivalent of any fee charged to the trust. The collective investment trusts may be redeemed on a daily basis. There are no unfunded commitments related to the collective investment trusts.

The FIGO is a single group annuity contract issued by PLIC. It is not a portfolio of contracts whose yields are based on changes in fair value of underlying assets as would be found in a stable value fund. As a result, the average yield earned by the Plan is the yield earned (i.e. interest credited) on the group annuity contract. The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate is defined in the contract. Under the terms of the contract, the composite crediting rate is reset on a semiannual basis and will never be less than zero. The interest rate is prior to any plan-level recordkeeping expenses being deducted. Any difference between the interest rate and the actual earned crediting rates for each plan participant

would be due to the contract's rate level service fee. The rate level service fee is a direct offset to the interest rate. Contract value is considered book value less an early withdrawal charge and is determined utilizing a composite crediting rate and represents the aggregation of contributions, plus interest, less withdrawals. The FIGO's contract value typically approximates fair value. By definition, the FIGO is an insurance contract. As a result, the plan may transact according to the terms defined in the contract at any time. The contract defines the circumstances and amounts for which the Plan may terminate its interest in the contract. Under terms of the contract, PLIC has the right to no longer receive deposits. Certain events may limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value. Such events not considered probable of occurring in the near term, include but are not limited to, plan termination, merger, and layoffs. The FIGO may be redeemed on a daily basis. There are no unfunded commitments related to the FIGO.

There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used to value the Plan's investments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

5. Plan termination

Although they have not expressed any intent to do so, the Companies have the right under the Plan Agreement to discontinue their contributions, and at any time to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become fully vested in their accounts.

6. Income tax status

The Plan operates under a non-standardized pre-approved profit-sharing plan sponsored by PLIC. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) ruled in an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 that the non-standardized pre-approved profit-sharing plan was qualified under applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since the date of the IRS opinion letter. However, the Plan's trustees, sponsors, and administrator are not aware of any occurrences that would adversely affect the Plan's qualified status, and believe the Plan is currently designed and operating in compliance with the applicable IRC requirements, is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires the Plan's management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken uncertain tax positions that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken, or expected to be taken, that would require recognition of a tax liability, or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by the IRS; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan's administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to the year ended December 31, 2021.

7. Party-in-interest assets and transactions

The Plan's investments are managed by PLIC, PGITC, and PTC, the Plan's investment custodians. Therefore, the Plan's investments qualify as party-in-interest assets. In addition, transactions conducted by PLIC, PGITC, and PTC, and the Companies' contributions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Also, certain fees paid to Kestra Investment Services, LLC, the Plan's investment advisor, through a revenue-sharing agreement with PLIC rather than a direct payment from the Plan, qualify as party-in-interest transactions and are deducted from income earned on investments. These transactions are permitted under the plan provisions and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

8. Delinquent participant contributions

The Companies failed to remit certain participant contributions to the Plan on a timely basis totaling \$3,904 and \$1,391 during the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, respectively. As a result, the Companies engaged in prohibited transactions as defined by DOL Reg. 2510.3-102 for those years. These transactions did not have a significant impact on the Plan's net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, or changes thereto for the years then ended.

9. Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate and credit risks, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that reductions in the values of the Plan's investment securities reported as of December 31, 2024 will occur in the near term and that such reductions would materially affect participant account balances and amounts reported on the accompanying December 31, 2024 statement of net assets available for benefits.

The Plan's exposure to concentrations risk is limited by diversification of investments across all investment elections. In addition, the investments within each investment election are further diversified into various financial investments.
