To the Trustees

### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of **Healogics, Inc. 401(k) Plan**, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

### NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Healogics, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General:** The Plan is a defined-contribution plan established on January 1, 2007, to provide retirement and other related benefits to all non-excludable employees of Healogics, Inc. and members of its controlled group (collectively, the "Company"). An employee, age eighteen or older, becomes eligible to participate for purposes of salary reduction contributions upon hiring. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

**Participant Contributions:** Each year, participants may contribute an amount up to a certain percentage of their annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, subject to limits imposed by the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). The Plan allows for both pre-tax and after-tax Roth contributions. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions as prescribed by Treasury regulations. Participants may also contribute amounts representing rollover distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans.

Eligible employees are automatically enrolled to defer 3% of their eligible compensation unless they elect otherwise.

**Employer Contributions:** The Company may make a discretionary matching contribution to the Plan. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made matching contributions equal to 50% of participant deferrals up to 6% of the participant's eligible compensation.

The Plan also allows the Company to make qualified non-elective contributions. During 2024, the Company did not make any qualified non-elective contributions to the Plan.

**Participant Accounts:** Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Plan earnings or losses and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses, if any. Allocations of participant earnings (losses) are based on account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

**Investment Options:** Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds and a common/collective trust as investment options for participants.

**Vesting:** Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and any earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contributions and related earnings is based on years of continuous service. Participants must work at least 1,000 hours during the year to be credited with a year of service. Once the participant completes one year of service, he or she becomes 33% vested, after two years of credited service becomes 66% vested, and after three years of credited service is fully vested.

**Excess Contributions Refundable:** Amounts of employer matching contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are and recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to employer contributions.

### NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)

**Notes Receivable from Participants:** Participants may borrow from their account balance a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balances. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer to (from) the investment fund from (to) the participant notes receivable fund. Notes receivable terms cannot exceed five years unless for the purchase of a primary residence, which cannot exceed thirty years. Loans are secured by the balances in the participants' accounts and are supported by a promissory note. Loans bear interest at rates based on the prevailing interest rates charged by persons in the business of lending money for loans that would be made under similar circumstances (3.25% to 9.50% at December 31, 2024). Principal and interest are paid ratably typically through biweekly payroll deductions.

**Payment of Benefits:** On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant (or beneficiary) may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account.

A participant may also request a withdrawal upon attainment of age 59½, or upon demonstration by the participant to the Plan Administrator that the participant is suffering from a hardship, as defined in the Plan document.

**Forfeited Accounts:** At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested account balances totaled \$206,675 and \$157,882, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions. During 2024, \$521,520 of forfeitures were used to reduce employer contributions. At December 31, 2024, the Company owed \$100,200 as a true up contribution, which was paid using forfeitures subsequent to year end.

### NOTE 2: SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

**Basis of Accounting:** The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP"). The financial statements and supplementary schedule have been prepared to satisfy the reporting and disclosure requirements of ERISA.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition:** Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, trustees and other parties involved with the Plan. See Note 6 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

### NOTE 2: SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

**Administrative Expenses:** Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

**Use of Estimates:** The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of Plan assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Risks and Uncertainties:** The Plan utilizes various investment instruments. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such change could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**Payment of Benefits:** Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

**Notes Receivable from Participants:** Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Delinquent loans are treated as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

**Uncertain Tax Positions:** GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

### NOTE 3: PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate it at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their Company contributions.

### NOTE 4: TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) has determined in its opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, that this prototype plan adopted by the Plan, as then designed, is in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan had been amended since adoption, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

### NOTE 5: CERTIFICATION OF QUALIFIED INSTITUTION

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s (“DOL”) Rules and Regulation for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Trust Company, LLC, the Trustee, certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) are complete and accurate.

### NOTE 6: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan can access at the measurement date.

Level 2 - inputs other than quoted market prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - inputs that are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement for the asset or liability.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There has been no change in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded on observable markets and are included as Level-1 investments within the fair value hierarchy.

*Common/collective trusts:* Valued at the NAV of units of a collective trust. The NAV as provided by the fund manager, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV.

**NOTE 6: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)**

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.
