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## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the Financial Statements**

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of the University of St. Augustine for Health Sciences 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103 (a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

**NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN**

The following description of the University of St. Augustine for Health Sciences 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan documents for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of the University of St. Augustine for Health Sciences, LLC (the Company) who have completed one month of service. Employees are automatically enrolled to defer compensation on the first day of the month following completion of the eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan was established on February 1, 2019 and is administered by the University of St. Augustine for Health Sciences, LLC for the benefit of its eligible employees. Lincoln Financial Group Trust Company, Inc. (LFGTC) serves as the Plan's trustee and custodian. Lincoln Retirement Services Company, LLC (LRSC) serves as the Plan's record-keeper and third-party administrator.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a percentage of pretax or after-tax annual compensation, not to exceed statutory limitations as set by law, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers mutual funds and common collective trusts as investment options for participants. The Company may also make matching contributions up to 50% of a participant's deferral up to 6% of the participant's compensation. To be eligible for matching contributions, participants must be employed on the last day of the Plan year. There were employer matching contributions in the amount of \$1,417,602 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's contributions, an allocation of the Plan's investment earnings, and is charged with an allocation of the Plan's investment and administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching contributions are based on years of service in accordance with the following schedule:

<u>Years of Service</u>	<u>Vested Percentage</u>
1	33%
2	66%
3	100%

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participants' vested interest in his or her account, in either lump-sum amount, or in installments over a designated period of time. Participant accounts with a vested balance of \$5,000 or less will be distributed to the participant as soon as it is administratively feasible following the event that entitles the participant to a distribution.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their participant account a minimum of \$1,000 and up to a maximum of the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested interest in the Plan. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear reasonable interest rates, ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Loan terms currently range up to five years unless the loan is used to purchase a primary residence, in which case extended repayment periods may be permitted. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. A loan becomes due and payable upon a participant's termination of employment.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$30,030 and \$28,200, respectively. Forfeitures will be used to pay administrative expenses and any remaining forfeitures will then be used to reduce any employer contribution.

**NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value and net asset value (NAV) which approximates fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements and NAV measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Payments of benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses are paid by the Plan and reduce net assets available for benefits.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated for potential recognition and/or disclosure through August 27, 2025. This represents the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**NOTE 3. CERTIFICATION OF ASSETS AND INCOME**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the United States DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified by LFGTC, the custodian of the Plan, as complete and accurate to the best of their knowledge, except for comparing such information certified by the trustee to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplementary schedule.

**NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual funds:* Includes all mutual funds held by the Plan and are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities & Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Common collective trust:* Includes a stable value fund which is composed primarily of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts that is valued at the net asset value (NAV) of unit of the collective trust. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months notification in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. Additional restrictions may apply.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Investment Strategy of Stable Value, Collective Trust Fund

The primary investment objectives of the collective trust is to seek to preserve principal and maintain a stable credit rating that is respective to changes in interest rates

Changes in Fair Value Levels

The availability of observable market data is monitored to assess the appropriate classification of financial instruments within the fair value hierarchy. Changes in economic conditions or model based valuation techniques may require the transfer of financial instruments from one fair value level to another. In such instances, the transfer is reported at the beginning of the reporting period.

**NOTE 5. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Direct compensation paid to LFGTC during the year ended December 31, 2024 was \$94,851. There was also indirect compensation paid to LFGTC or its affiliates per the service arrangements between the Plan and LFGTC and its affiliates.

Notes receivable from participants qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Balances are \$524,732 and \$369,762 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

**NOTE 6. PLAN TERMINATION**

The Company anticipates and believes that the Plan will continue without interruption but has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become fully vested in their account balances and the Plan assets would be distrusted to participants on the basis of their prorated values at the termination date.

**NOTE 7. TAX STATUS**

The Plan has adopted a non-standardized, pre-approved profit sharing plan with a cash deferred arrangement, which received a favorable determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service on June 30, 2020, which stated that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code

(IRC). The Plan has since been amended, however, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

FASB ASC requires the Plan Administrator to annually evaluate the Plan's tax positions, including accounting and measurement of uncertain tax positions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan Administrator concluded that no uncertain tax positions had been taken that would require adjustment to or disclosure in the financial statements. With few exceptions, the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations by the federal, state, or local tax authorities for years before 2021.

**NOTE 8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
