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### Note 1 - Description of plan:

The following description of the Encompass Digital Media 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Encompass Digital Media, Inc. (the Company, Plan Sponsor, or Plan Administrator).

The Plan's eligibility requirements are as follows: eligible employees must complete one month of service to enter the Plan. There is no age requirement related to eligibility. All employees are eligible to participate in the Plan with the exception of collectively bargained employees, leased employees, non-resident aliens with no U.S. source income, interns, and employees classified as freelance employees. Eligible employees may enter the Plan on the first day of the month after eligibility requirements are met. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

#### Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute up to 90% of compensation, up to current Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations, through payroll deductions. This includes both pre-tax and Roth contributions. The Plan also allows for participant after-tax contributions up to 50% of compensation. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are permitted to make catch-up contributions.

The Plan has a provision whereby participants are automatically enrolled in the Plan at a deferral rate of 3% of their compensation unless they elect otherwise. Automatically enrolled participants have their contributions increased on August 1st of each year by 1%, up to a maximum contribution rate of 8%, unless the participant makes a different election.

#### Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, discretionary employer contributions, if any, employer profit-sharing contributions, if any, Plan expenses, and Plan earnings. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the vested portion of the participant's account.

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#### Note 1 - Description of plan - continued:

##### Forfeited accounts

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$113,684 and \$94,645, respectively. Forfeitures are included in the Fidelity Government Money Market Fund and the Fidelity Freedom Index Income Fund at December 31, 2024 and 2023. Forfeitures may be used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan or to reduce employer discretionary matching, profit-sharing, and employer match true-up contributions. During 2024, forfeitures totaling \$5,106 were used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan and \$6,260 of forfeitures were used to offset employer discretionary matching contributions. Additionally, \$21,498 of forfeitures were used to offset employer match true-up contributions related to the 2023 plan year.

##### Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary deferral, Roth, and after-tax contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Participants are also immediately vested in employer safe-harbor matching contributions. Employer discretionary matching contributions made after January 1, 2021 vest using a 2-year cliff vesting schedule which provides that participants are 100% vested after two years of service. Participants vest in the employer's discretionary matching contributions made prior to January 1, 2021 in accordance with the following schedule:

Participants are immediately vested upon termination of the Plan, upon reaching the normal retirement age of 65, upon reaching the early retirement age of 55 with five years of service, or upon death or disability while an employee of the Company. Years of service are calculated using the elapsed time method.

### Payment of benefits

A participant is entitled to a distribution of the vested value of his or her account upon termination of service, disability, or death. Participants must take distributions as lump sum amounts. Additionally, in-service withdrawals of a participant's deferrals and vested matching contributions are permitted in cases of proven financial hardship or upon attainment of age 59 1/2. If a participant's account balance is less than \$7,000 but more than \$1,000 upon termination of service, a distribution of the participant's account may be made to an individual retirement account setup in the participant's name. A participant terminating with a balance of \$7,000 or more may maintain their account balance in the Plan. A participant terminating with a balance of \$1,000 or less will have their vested account balance distributed directly to them in a lump sum payment.

#### Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Note terms are for a maximum of five years, except for notes for the purchase of a primary residence, which may have note terms up to 10 years. Participants may have only one note outstanding. Notes are secured by the participant's account and bear interest at the Prime rate plus 1%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Participants may prepay their note at any time.

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Interest income is recorded when received. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the Plan document. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

#### Administrative expenses

Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by either the Company or the Plan, as determined by the Plan Sponsor. The Company absorbs a portion of the administrative expenses of the Plan. Fees charged for processing notes receivable from participants and participant distributions are charged directly to the account of the affected participant. Other fees such as registered investment advisor fees, recordkeeping fees, and other account transaction fees, are allocated to the accounts of participants.

### Note 2 - Summary of significant accounting policies:

#### Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

### Investment valuation and income recognition

The Plan's registered investment company, money market fund, and life insurance investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

The Plan's investments are valued at fair value based on a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1      Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2      Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;  
Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;  
Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;  
Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3      Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Investment valuation and income recognition - continued

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Shares of registered investment company funds (mutual funds) are valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end by obtaining quoted prices on nationally recognized securities exchanges. These investments are deemed to be actively traded.

Shares of money market funds are valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end by obtaining quoted prices on nationally recognized securities exchanges. This investment is deemed to be actively traded.

Life insurance is valued at the net cash surrender value of the policy as provided by the insurance company. The net cash surrender value approximates fair value.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

#### Note 4 - Party-in-interest transactions:

The trustee and its affiliates perform services for the Plan, sell products to the Plan, and manage and maintain certain investments of the Plan for which fees are charged to the Plan. The Plan Sponsor pays a portion of administrative expenses. Administrative expenses paid by the Plan relate primarily to recordkeeping and investment advisory services. Such transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA, are specifically exempt from the prohibited transaction rules. Plan expenses paid to parties-in-interest totaled \$222,788 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

The Plan Sponsor has a services agreement with Fidelity whereby the Plan receives revenue from contract asset charge fees related to certain investments of the Plan. These revenue credits are allocated to the participants holding those investments each quarter. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan received \$50,200 of revenue credits which are included in other income on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. These revenue credits were allocated to participants during the year ended December 31, 2024.

#### Note 5 - Plan termination:

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, all participants' accounts will become fully-vested.

#### Note 6 - Tax status:

The underlying prototype plan has received an opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020 stating that the form of the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), and therefore, the related trust is tax-exempt. The Plan Administrator has determined that it is eligible to and has chosen to rely on the current IRS prototype plan opinion letter. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability or asset if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or asset or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for Plan years prior to 2021.

### Note 1 - Description of plan:

The following description of the Encompass Digital Media 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Encompass Digital Media, Inc. (the Company, Plan Sponsor, or Plan Administrator).

The Plan's eligibility requirements are as follows: eligible employees must complete one month of service to enter the Plan. There is no age requirement related to eligibility. All employees are eligible to participate in the Plan with the exception of collectively bargained employees, leased employees, non-resident aliens with no U.S. source income, interns, and employees classified as freelance employees. Eligible employees may enter the Plan on the first day of the month after eligibility requirements are met. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

#### Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute up to 90% of compensation, up to current Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations, through payroll deductions. This includes both pre-tax and Roth contributions. The Plan also allows for participant after-tax contributions up to 50% of compensation. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are permitted to make catch-up contributions.

The Plan has a provision whereby participants are automatically enrolled in the Plan at a deferral rate of 3% of their compensation unless they elect otherwise. Automatically enrolled participants have their contributions increased on August 1st of each year by 1%, up to a maximum contribution rate of 8%, unless the participant makes a different election.

#### Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, discretionary employer contributions, if any, employer profit-sharing contributions, if any, Plan expenses, and Plan earnings. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the vested portion of the participant's account.

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#### Note 1 - Description of plan - continued:

##### Forfeited accounts

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$113,684 and \$94,645, respectively. Forfeitures are included in the Fidelity Government Money Market Fund and the Fidelity Freedom Index Income Fund at December 31, 2024 and 2023. Forfeitures may be used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan or to reduce employer discretionary matching, profit-sharing, and employer match true-up contributions. During 2024, forfeitures totaling \$5,106 were used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan and \$6,260 of forfeitures were used to offset employer discretionary matching contributions. Additionally, \$21,498 of forfeitures were used to offset employer match true-up contributions related to the 2023 plan year.

##### Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary deferral, Roth, and after-tax contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Participants are also immediately vested in employer safe-harbor matching contributions. Employer discretionary matching contributions made after January 1, 2021 vest using a 2-year cliff vesting schedule which provides that participants are 100% vested after two years of service. Participants vest in the employer's discretionary matching contributions made prior to January 1, 2021 in accordance with the following schedule:

Participants are immediately vested upon termination of the Plan, upon reaching the normal retirement age of 65, upon reaching the early retirement age of 55 with five years of service, or upon death or disability while an employee of the Company. Years of service are calculated using the elapsed time method.

### Payment of benefits

A participant is entitled to a distribution of the vested value of his or her account upon termination of service, disability, or death. Participants must take distributions as lump sum amounts. Additionally, in-service withdrawals of a participant's deferrals and vested matching contributions are permitted in cases of proven financial hardship or upon attainment of age 59 1/2. If a participant's account balance is less than \$7,000 but more than \$1,000 upon termination of service, a distribution of the participant's account may be made to an individual retirement account setup in the participant's name. A participant terminating with a balance of \$7,000 or more may maintain their account balance in the Plan. A participant terminating with a balance of \$1,000 or less will have their vested account balance distributed directly to them in a lump sum payment.

### Note 1 - Description of plan - continued:

#### Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Note terms are for a maximum of five years, except for notes for the purchase of a primary residence, which may have note terms up to 10 years. Participants may have only one note outstanding. Notes are secured by the participant's account and bear interest at the Prime rate plus 1%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Participants may prepay their note at any time.

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Interest income is recorded when received. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the Plan document. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

#### Administrative expenses

Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by either the Company or the Plan, as determined by the Plan Sponsor. The Company absorbs a portion of the administrative expenses of the Plan. Fees charged for processing notes receivable from participants and participant distributions are charged directly to the account of the affected participant. Other fees such as registered investment advisor fees, recordkeeping fees, and other account transaction fees, are allocated to the accounts of participants.

### Note 2 - Summary of significant accounting policies:

#### Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

### Investment valuation and income recognition

The Plan's registered investment company, money market fund, and life insurance investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

The Plan's investments are valued at fair value based on a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1      Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2      Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;  
Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;  
Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;  
Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3      Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Investment valuation and income recognition - continued

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Shares of registered investment company funds (mutual funds) are valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end by obtaining quoted prices on nationally recognized securities exchanges. These investments are deemed to be actively traded.

Shares of money market funds are valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end by obtaining quoted prices on nationally recognized securities exchanges. This investment is deemed to be actively traded.

Life insurance is valued at the net cash surrender value of the policy as provided by the insurance company. The net cash surrender value approximates fair value.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Actual results could differ from those estimates.

### Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits.

### Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Certain information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, other income, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by the trustee, Fidelity Management Trust Company.

#### Note 4 - Party-in-interest transactions:

The trustee and its affiliates perform services for the Plan, sell products to the Plan, and manage and maintain certain investments of the Plan for which fees are charged to the Plan. The Plan Sponsor pays a portion of administrative expenses. Administrative expenses paid by the Plan relate primarily to recordkeeping and investment advisory services. Such transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA, are specifically exempt from the prohibited transaction rules. Plan expenses paid to parties-in-interest totaled \$222,788 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

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#### Note 4 - Related party transactions - continued:

The Plan Sponsor has a services agreement with Fidelity whereby the Plan receives revenue from contract asset charge fees related to certain investments of the Plan. These revenue credits are allocated to the participants holding those investments each quarter. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan received \$50,200 of revenue credits which are included in other income on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. These revenue credits were allocated to participants during the year ended December 31, 2024.

#### Note 5 - Plan termination:

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, all participants' accounts will become fully-vested.

#### Note 6 - Tax status:

The underlying prototype plan has received an opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020 stating that the form of the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), and therefore, the related trust is tax-exempt. The Plan Administrator has determined that it is eligible to and has chosen to rely on the current IRS prototype plan opinion letter. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability or asset if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or asset or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for Plan years prior to 2021.
