(1) Description of Plan

The following description of the I2C Synergy, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering employees of I2C Synergy, Inc. (I2C) and the following related employers: Diversified New Jersey (DIV NJ), Ron Fogel & Associates, L.L.C. (Fogel) and Liberty Lighting Group, Inc. (LLG), (collectively, the Company). All employees are eligible except for part-time, temporary or seasonal employees whose regularly scheduled service is less than 1,000 hours of service.

Employees are eligible to make elective deferrals immediately upon their date of hire and are eligible to receive employer matching and profit-sharing contributions after attaining age 21 and completing 1 year of service. Prior service with DIV NJ, Martin Berman Associates, Inc., Feng Shui Lighting, Inc., Fogel and LLG is recognized for eligibility and vesting purposes. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Board of Directors are responsible for oversight of the Plan, determine the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitor investment performance.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 92% of pretax annual compensation, as defined by the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers). The Plan also permits Roth contributions. Participants direct the investments of their contribution into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participant contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees hired after August 1, 2023 are automatically enrolled at 5% in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan or elect a different contribution rate.

The Company contributes employer match contributions each pay period to eligible employees based on a formula of 50% of employee contributions up to maximum of 2.5% of eligible compensation. The Company is also permitted to make discretionary profit-sharing contributions. Participants must be age 21 or older and have a minimum of 1 year of service to be eligible for discretionary profit-sharing contributions. During 2024, the Company elected not to make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution.

Contributions, Continued

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of certain administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the employer matching and profit-sharing contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of credited service according to the following schedule:

1	20%
2	40%

4	80%
5	100%

Participants will become fully vested upon attainment of normal retirement age, death, or total and permanent disability regardless of the vesting schedule.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their account balances a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participants' accounts and bear interest at rates ranging from 5.25% to 9.75% as of December 31, 2024. Loan terms may not exceed the maximum term of five years unless the loan is for the purchase of a principal residence in which case the loan may be fifteen years. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant or their beneficiary may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account in either a lump-sum amount or partial withdrawals/installment payments, as defined by the Plan. The Plan allows for in-service distributions if a participant reaches age 59½, hardship distributions, and military distributions, subject to plan provisions. The Plan will make an involuntary cash-out of a participant's vested account balance following severance from employment for participants with balances up to a maximum of \$5,000.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$8,127 and \$6,301 respectively. These accounts will be used to pay administrative expenses incurred by the Plan or to reduce future employer contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no amounts used to reduce employer contributions from forfeited nonvested accounts.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an ordinary transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Company's Board of Directors determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the qualified institutions. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Contributions from plan participants and the matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent participant loans are treated as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participants' account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

On February 29, 2024, I2C acquired 100 percent of the equity interest of O'Blaney Rinker Associates (ORA) and Lumen 8 II LLC (L8). As a result of this transaction, the Plan was amended to merge the O'Blaney Rinker Associates Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan & Trust (O'Blaney Plan) into the Plan effective January 1, 2025 and allow eligible employees of ORA and L8 to participate in the Plan. On March 31, 2025, participant assets from the O'Blaney Plan were transferred into the Plan totaling \$1,093,143.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 3, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

(3) Financial Information Certified by Qualified Institutions

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental Schedule H, Line 4i- Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year), including investments at fair value and investments at contract value held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments and dividends and interest for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from the information certified as complete and accurate by Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company, (Principal) and Principal Life Insurance Company (Principal Life), the qualified institutions.

(4) Fair Value Measurements

The Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include
- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
 - inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.
 - If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Registered investment companies: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Shares of registered investment companies (RICs) held by the Plan are open ended registered investment companies that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The RICs held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common collective trust fund: Valued at the net asset value of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the qualified institution, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Pooled separate account: Valued at the NAV of units held by the Plan at year end based on the market value of its underlying investments. Although the pooled separate accounts are not available in an active market, the NAV of the units are approximated based on the quoted prices of the underlying investments that are traded in an active market. The NAV is the basis for current transactions and can be redeemed at NAV as of the measurement date.

(5) Guaranteed Investment Contract with Insurance Company

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Principal Life totaling \$125,096 and \$113,273, at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Principal Life maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than zero percent. The interest rate is reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan) or (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions. The plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring.

The guaranteed investment contract does not have a defined maturity specified in the contract. The contract shall terminate on the date when no current deposit arrangements have been made between the Plan and Principal Trust and there are no guaranteed interest funds with a value greater than zero under this contract. Provisions relating to annuities in the course of payment will continue to govern payment of such annuities until the final payment under each such annuity is made.

(6) Related Party Transactions and Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain plan investments are shares of registered investment companies and a common collective trust managed by Principal. The guaranteed interest account and pooled separate account are managed by Principal. Principal is also a qualifying institution and recordkeeper for the Plan and, therefore, transactions related to these investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

(7) Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

(8) Tax Status

The Plan used a volume submitter 401(k) profit sharing plan document sponsored by CCH Incorporated. CCH Incorporated has received a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the plan document was designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRS. The opinion letter has been relied upon by this Plan. The plan administrator believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for the tax periods in progress.

(9) Nonexempt Transactions

The plan sponsor is required to segregate employee contributions to the Plan from its general assets as soon as practicable as required by ERISA Section 2510.3-102. During 2023 and 2022, certain employee deferrals and loan repayments to the Plan aggregating \$1,599 were not remitted to the Plan's trust within the timeframe required by the DOL under plan asset rules. These transactions are considered prohibited transactions as defined by ERISA. The Company compensated the Plan for lost investment earnings during 2024 related to the 2023 late remittances. As of December 31, 2024, the Company had \$474 of uncorrected contributions which it intends on correcting during 2025.

(10) Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
