Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Note 1 - Description of the Plan

The following description of the Cascade Utilities, Inc. and Affiliated Companies Salary Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a 401(k) salary deferral and profit sharing plan covering all full-time employees of Cascade Utilities, Inc., Day Management Corporation, Cascade Access, LLC, Trans-Cascades Telephone Company, Inc., Rio Virgin Telephone Company, Inc., Mastertech Security Services, Inc., and Idaho Communications LLC (collectively, the Companies).

Eligibility

Effective January 1, 2024, employees of the Companies are eligible to participate in the Plan upon hire with no minimum service requirement. Employees who are non-resident aliens and leased employees are not eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of pre-tax annual compensation to the Plan, but not to exceed the maximum allowed under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Contributions include employee pre-tax salary deferral contributions, after-tax Roth deferral contributions, or a combination of both. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The amount deferred pre-tax will not be subject to income tax until it is actually distributed to the participant. The amount deferred is, however, subject to Social Security tax at the time of deferral. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans (rollovers).

The Companies contribute a discretionary matching contribution equal to 50% of the participant's contribution up to 6% of gross pay. The Companies may also provide a discretionary profit sharing contribution, as determined by the Companies, and is allocated to participants who were considered eligible to participate in the Plan. There were no profit sharing contributions made in 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, allocations of matching and profit sharing contributions, and Plan investment earnings. Each participant's account is also charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on the participant's earnings and account balances, as defined in the Plan agreement. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investment Options

Participants may choose a combination of investments in investment funds or target date funds selected by the Plan Administrator and offered by the custodian. The accounts for the participants who do not choose these options will be invested in the Vanguard Target Retirement Fund appropriate for the participant's birth year. Participants have the opportunity to change their investment combinations daily.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions made by the Companies is based on years of service. Participant's employer matching contributions and profit sharing contributions vest only when they complete three years of credited service. Participants shall also become 100% vested in their account balances upon attainment of normal retirement age, death, or permanent disability.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Principal and interest is paid ratably through semi-monthly payroll deductions. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined on the date the loan is entered into by the Plan Administrator. Interest rates on outstanding loans at December 31, 2024, range from 4.25% to 9.50% (4.25% to 9.50% at December 31, 2023).

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant or eligible beneficiary will receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's account balance. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution. The Plan will make mandatory distributions for terminated participants with account balances of less than \$5,000, including any rollover contribution account. Account balances for terminated participants of less than \$200 are automatically distributed in a lump sum; otherwise mandatory distributions will be subject to automatic rollover.

Forfeited Accounts

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$16,567 and \$20,092, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce employer contributions and pay Plan expenses. In 2024, \$37,014 from forfeited non-vested accounts was used to reduce employer contributions.

Note 2 - Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Plan investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (see Note 4). The Plan's retirement committee determines the Plan's valuation policies using information provided by the Plan's custodian and third-party administrator. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income and revenue sharing are recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed as they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Companies and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to participants' accounts and are included in administrative expenses. Fees paid to the third-party administrator are paid directly by the Plan out of the revenue sharing amounts or are allocated to participant accounts. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through August 6, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Information Certified by Custodian

The Plan's investments are held by Charles Schwab Trust Bank, the Custodian of the Plan. The investments are credited for earnings thereon and charged for withdrawals and expenses charged by the Custodian.

The Plan Administrator has obtained a certification from the Custodian as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, that the following information provided to the Plan Administrator by the Custodian is complete and accurate:

- Non-Interest bearing cash
- Investments, at fair value
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments
- Interest and dividends

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

Fair value is the price that would be received from selling an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. When determining the fair value measurements for assets and liabilities required to be recorded at fair value, the Plan considers the principal or most advantageous market in which it would transact and considers assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, such as inherent risk, transfer restrictions, and risk of nonperformance.

The Plan follows a fair value hierarchy to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. A financial instrument's categorization within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Three levels of inputs may be used to measure fair value:

Level 1 - quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2 - inputs other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices in active markets for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.

Level 3 - unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Registered Investment Companies (Mutual Funds): Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. Mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The methods previously described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 6 - Plan Termination

Although they have not expressed any intent to do so, the Companies have the right under the Plan to discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

Note 7 - Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Plan's volume submitter sponsor by an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan with CODA sponsored by CCH Incorporated, which has been adopted by the Plan, is acceptable pursuant to section 401 of the IRC and in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan has not requested its own determination letter from the IRS. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements at December 31, 2024. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
