Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of PriorityOne Capital Corporation 401(k) Profit Sharing Trust (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). Note 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of PriorityOne Capital Corporation 401(k) Profit Sharing Trust (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of PriorityOne Capital Corporation (the "Corporation" or "Plan Sponsor") who, as of January 1, 2024, have at least one month of service and are age twenty-one or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). Capital Bank and Trust Company (the "Custodian" or "Capital") is the custodian of the Plan. American Funds Service Company ("American Funds") is a subservice organization used by Capital to provide certain services to the Plan. The Plan is administered by the 401(k) Administrative Committee which is appointed by the Board of Directors of the Corporation.

Contributions

Participants may contribute any amount up to seventy-five percent of their compensation subject to regulatory limitations, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age fifty before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contributions plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at two percent of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated fund until changed by the participant. Participants are subject to an automatic deferral rate increase by one percent annually until the maximum auto-enrollment deferral percentage reaches eight percent.

The Corporation contributes a discretionary match equal to a uniform percentage of the first eight percent of base compensation that each participant contributes to the Plan. The matching contribution percentage for 2024 and 2023 was fifty percent. Additional profit-sharing amounts may be contributed at the option of the Corporation's Board of Directors. The Corporation may also make qualified non-elective contributions ("QNEC") to the Plan (discretionary contributions made for all non-highly compensated participants in order to satisfy the non-discrimination requirements of the Internal Revenue Code). There were no profit sharing or QNEC contributions made by the Corporation during 2024 and 2023.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Corporation's matching contributions, and allocations of (a) Plan earnings or losses, (b) the Corporation's profit-sharing contributions, which are allocated to a participant's account in proportion to total eligible compensation and (c) the Corporation's QNEC, which are allocated to non-highly compensated participants in proportion to total eligible compensation of such participants. Participants are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on

participant compensation or account balances as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings or losses thereon and are immediately vested in QNEC. Vesting in the Corporation's matching and profit-sharing contribution portion of their accounts and earnings or losses thereon are based on a five-year period based on years of continuous service, as follows:

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum payment or installment payments over a period not more than the participant's assumed life expectancy (or assumed life expectancies for the participant and beneficiary). For termination of service due to other reasons, participants with account balances of \$5,000 or less or not 100% vested may only receive distribution in the form of a lump-sum. If a participant's account balance exceeds \$5,000 the participant can elect to receive distribution in the form of a lump-sum or in installments, as defined in the Plan. Hardship distributions and in-service withdrawals for participants aged 59 ½ are also available from a vested portion of a participant's account subject to regulatory requirements.

Corrective Distributions

The Plan failed the Actual Deferral Percentage ("ADP") Test in 2022. The failure was attributed to the average ADP of Highly Compensated Employees ("HCEs") exceeding the allowable limit of 6.05% under the Alternative Test, calculated at 6.86%. Corrective distributions were issued in February 2023 to the HCEs to bring the Plan within compliance thresholds. The total corrective distributions issued were \$18,747, which are presented as deductions from net assets on the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits. The Plan passed compliance tests in 2023 and 2024, therefore no corrective distributions were made during 2024.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited non-vested accounts had an outstanding balance of \$3,067 and \$45 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Forfeitures, which result from employees withdrawing from the Plan prior to fully vesting, may be reallocated to participants as additional non-elective contributions in the same manner non-elective contributions are allocated to participants, or may be used to reduce future employer contributions. Forfeitures in the amount of \$13,638 and \$26,578 were used to reduce employer contributions in 2024 and 2023, respectively. No forfeitures were reallocated to participants in 2024 or 2023.

Note 2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid either by the participants or the Corporation, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the Corporation are excluded from these financial statements. Administrative expenses of the Plan, to the extent that the Corporation does not pay such expenses, are paid by the participants.

Note 3. Information Certified and Provided by Capital Bank and Trust Company

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation of investments and interest and dividends and other income for the years then ended was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Administrator and certified as complete and accurate by the Custodian.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.
- If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Interest-bearing accounts: Valued based on quoted prices in active markets for identical assets. The Plan's interest-bearing cash accounts include money market funds. The interest-bearing accounts held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded (Level 1).

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV"). The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded (Level 1).

Collective trust fund: Valued based on NAV of units of the collective trust fund. The NAV, as provided by the Custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimating fair value. The NAV is based upon the fair value of the underlying investments comprising the trust less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. ASC Topic 820 allows NAV per share to serve as a practical expedient to estimate the fair value as long as certain requirements are met. The Plan Administrator has determined the collective trust fund held by the Plan meets the requirements for the NAV practical expedient.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5. Related Party Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by Capital. Capital is the custodian of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Additionally, American Funds provides certain services to the Plan on behalf of Capital. Therefore, the Plan funds invested with American Funds qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Certain administrative expenses of the Plan have been paid by the Plan Sponsor.

Note 6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Corporation has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

Note 7. Income Tax Status

The Plan operates under a non-standardized 401(k) plan adoption agreement in connection with a defined contribution prototype plan and trust. The Plan sponsor obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code ("Code"). The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9. Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through July 28, 2025, the date these financial statements were available to be issued. The Plan has determined that no significant events occurred after December 31, 2024, but prior to the issuance of these financial statements, that would have a material impact on its financial statements.
