### NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

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#### **NOTE 1 - Description of Plan**

The following summary description of MM JS Auto Holdings, LLC 401(k) Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information of the Plan's provisions.

**General** - The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering eligible employees of MM JS Auto Holdings, LLC (Company) who have attained the age of 21 and have completed six months of eligible service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Plan management determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

**Contributions** - Each year, participants may elect to contribute up to 50% of pre-tax annual eligible compensation as defined by the Plan not to exceed Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollover). The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferred rate set at 2%, auto increasing by 1% each year up to a maximum of 15%, of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options daily. During 2024, the Company elected to match 50% up to 6% of employees' eligible contributions, which amounted to \$871,764

**Participant accounts** - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company's matching contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions as defined in the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting** - Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after four years of credited service.

**Notes receivable from participants** - The Plan includes a loan provision which allows participants to borrow money using their account as collateral. Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance, whichever is less. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Repayments are made through payroll deductions and all payments of principal and interest are credited back to the participant's account. Interest rate is set by the Plan administrator in accordance with local prevailing rates for similar types of loans.

**Payment of benefits** - Upon termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or separation of employment, a participant, or beneficiary thereof, shall be eligible to receive a distribution of the balance of the participant's vested interest in his or her account.

**Forfeited accounts** - At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$32,664 and \$73,249, respectively. These accounts will be used to pay Plan expenses and then used to reduce future employer contributions. During 2024, \$21,869 of forfeited non-vested accounts were used to pay Plan expenses and \$69,778 were used to reduce employer contributions.

**NOTE 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

**Basis of accounting** - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

**Use of estimates** - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment valuation and income recognition** - Investments are reported at fair value. The fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and custodians. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

The common collective trust fund is valued at the net asset value per share, or its equivalent, of the fund, which is based on the fair value of the fund's underlying assets. There are no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on any investments.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

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**NOTE 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies - (Continued)**

**Contributions** - Contributions for Plan participants and the matching contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were employer contribution receivables of \$3,596 and \$8,189, respectively, and participant contribution receivables of \$9,242 and \$20,167, respectively. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded at December 31, 2024 or 2023.

**Notes receivable from participants** - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

**Payment of benefits** - Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Expenses** - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Recordkeeping, adviser and service provider fees and fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. The Plan pays third party administrative fees and are included in administrative expenses.

**Subsequent events** - The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through August 27, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. There were no subsequent events that required disclosure.

**NOTE 3 - Certification of Investment Information**

Certain information in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule related to investments and notes receivable from participants held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Charles Schwab Trust Bank, a qualified institution.

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**NOTE 4 - Fair Value Measurements**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

**Interest bearing cash** - Valued at the cash equivalent value at year end.

**Mutual funds** - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

**Common collective trust funds** - Valued at the NAV of units of a collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

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**NOTE 5 - Related Party Transactions and Party In Interest Transactions**

Certain transactions with parties-in-interest are allowed under the Plan's provisions and are exempt from prohibition under the ERISA. Certain Plan investments are units of mutual funds and common collective trusts managed by Captrust Financial Advisors. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are paid through a direct payment. The Plan received credits and refunds on fees during the year.

For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan makes payments to Captrust Investment Advisors for investment advising fees.

For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan makes payments to Milliman, Inc. for third-party administrator fees.

**NOTE 6 - Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan sponsor has the right under the Plan to amend, modify, terminate, or partially terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

**NOTE 7 - Tax Status**

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter dated March 31, 2014, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax council believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS and state authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

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**NOTE 8 - Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 9 - Delinquent Contributions**

Defined contribution plans are required to remit employee contributions to the Plan as soon as they can be reasonably segregated from the employer's general assets. Contributions of \$44,357 were not remitted within the required time period. During 2024, \$26,273 of late remittances were corrected and lost earnings were calculated and remitted to the Plan. The remaining \$18,084 of late remittances have not been corrected and lost earnings have not been calculated and remitted to the Plan during 2024.
