- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter – Supplemental Schedule Required By ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets held at year end as of December 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2024 And 2023

1. General Information

Description Of The Plan

The following description of Prairie Band Potawatomi Entertainment Corporation 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was established effective January 1, 2007, for the purpose of providing employees an opportunity to defer a portion of their annual base salary compensation to the Plan for federal income tax purposes in accordance with section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

Prairie Band Potawatomi Entertainment Corporation (the Company) serves as sponsor of the Plan and, as such, has the authority to amend or terminate the Plan subject to certain restrictions and the provisions of ERISA. The Company is also responsible for oversight of the Plan.

The Plan was restated effective April 1, 2022.

Eligibility

An employee is eligible to participate in employee deferrals and Company contributions in the Plan after completing 90 days of service. Employees who have satisfied the eligibility requirements may enter the Plan immediately after doing so.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a maximum of 50% and a minimum of 1% of their pre-tax and Roth after-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. On the first pay period following the employee becoming eligible to make salary deferrals, the Plan will automatically enroll the employee in the Plan at a 3% deferral rate unless the participant made an affirmative election otherwise. Effective July 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to include an automatic escalation feature that increases contributions in 1% increments annually up to 8%. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

The Company makes nonelective matching contributions equal to 50% of the first 6% of the participant's compensation.

The Company may also make discretionary contributions to the Plan. The discretionary contribution is allocated as a percentage of each eligible participant's compensation. No discretionary contributions were made during the years ended December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's deferral contributions, Company matching contributions, an allocation of Plan earnings (losses), and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Participant Investments

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant is permitted to direct contributions in a variety of investment options.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their salary deferral contributions and the Company discretionary contributions plus related investment earnings. Vesting in the nonelective employer matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon is based on continuous years of service, according to the following:

Immediately on plan participation	50%
1 but less than 2	75%
2 or more	100%

Forfeitures

Participants who terminate their employment and are less than 100% vested in their account will forfeit their nonvested portion. Forfeitures are used to reduce Company contributions or pay administrative expenses. The Company applied \$5,260 and \$10,794 of forfeitures to reduce Company nonelective matching contributions and pay administrative expenses during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$121,634 and \$63,265, respectively.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants may borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The term of the loans cannot exceed five years, except for a loan that is used to acquire a principal residence. The loans must be adequately secured by the participant's vested account balance and bears interest at rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. A participant may not have more than two outstanding loans at any time.

Payment Of Benefits

If a participant's employment with the Company is terminated due to retirement, death or disability, the total vested amount of a participant's account is distributed in cash to the participant or the participant's beneficiary according to one of the options described in the Plan Agreement and as elected by the participant. If a participant's employment with the Company is terminated for any other reason other than retirement or death, the total vested amount of the participant's account is payable to the participant as soon as administratively practicable after the participant ceases to be an employee.

In-service distributions may be made to a participant who has not separated from service provided the participant has attained the age of 59 ½.

Participant Hardship Withdrawals

A participant is permitted to withdraw from the Plan a portion of their account in the event of undue financial hardship.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements; other expenses such as administrative fees are paid by the Plan. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in the net change in fair value of investments in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

2. Summary Of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis Of Presentation

The financial statements of the Plan are presented on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use Of Estimates

Management uses estimates and assumptions in preparing financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States. Those estimates and assumptions affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of additions to and deductions from net assets during the reporting period. Actual results could vary from those estimates.

Investment Valuation And Income Recognition

Investments, other than the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, are reported at fair value, which is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Investment contracts held by a defined contribution plan that are fully benefit-responsive are reported at contract value, rather than fair value, because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The Plan's investment in the Mass Mutual Life Insurance Company (Mass Mutual) SAGIC Diversified Bond I account is a fully benefit-responsive investment contract and is reported at contract value in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. The net change in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued, but unpaid, interest. Delinquent notes receivable are treated as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan Agreement. Notes receivable from participants are secured by participants' vested account balance.

Payment Of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

Management evaluates subsequent events through the date financial statements were available for issue, which is the date of the Independent Auditors' Report.

3. Certified Investment Information

The following is a summary of the Plan's asset information as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, included throughout the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule that was prepared by or derived from information certified by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Mass Mutual (collectively, the Custodians), and furnished to the Plan Administrator. The Plan Administrator has obtained certifications from the Custodians that the information provided to the Plan Administrator related to the following information is complete and accurate.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The Plan utilizes an established framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
 - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;

- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value:

Mutual Funds

Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the funds. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded (Level 1).

The method described above may produce fair value calculations that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 or 2023.

5. Guaranteed Investment Contract With Insurance Company

The Plan is invested in a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract (the Contract) with Mass Mutual. Mass Mutual maintains the contributions in a general account. The group annuity contract is a fixed-annuity general account product and meets the fully-benefit responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer all or a portion of their investment at contract value. Mass Mutual is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Mass Mutual. Such events include, but may not be limited to, a participant termination of employment due to (1) removal of a group of participants from Plan coverage as a result of temporary absence; (2) change in position or other occurrence qualifying as a temporary break in service under the Plan; (3) transfer or other change of position resulting in employment by an entity controlling, controlled by, or under other common control with the employer; or (4) cessation of an employment relationship resulting from a reorganization, merger, layoff, or the sale or discontinuance of all or any part of the Plan Sponsor's business. Such events also include (1) removal from the Plan of one or more groups or classifications of participants, (2) partial or complete Plan termination or (3) Plan disqualification. The Plan Administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants is probable.

The group annuity contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to 90 days' written notice.

6. Income Tax Status

Effective April 1, 2022, the Plan was restated with a defined contribution pre-approved plan document sponsored by Empower Retirement, LLC. Empower Retirement, LLC received an opinion letter from the IRS dated November 14, 2022 as to the pre-approved plan's qualified status. The Company has determined that it is eligible to, and has chosen to, rely on the current IRS pre-approved plan opinion letter. Although the Plan has been amended since the pre-approved plan received the letter, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is being operated, in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan. Management evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded that the Plan had maintained its tax-exempt status and had taken no uncertain tax positions that require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. Therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits in progress for any tax periods.

7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed an intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts, including employer nonelective matching contributions.

8. Party In Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are pooled separate accounts and a fully benefit-responsive investment contract managed by the Custodians or affiliates of the Custodians. These transactions are considered party in interest transactions allowable under ERISA.

Certain employees have outstanding loans with the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. These loans are considered party in interest transactions allowable under ERISA.

9. Risks And Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term, and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
